Abstracts From Early Goddard Family Wills. 1417 to 1605

Rainald William Knightley Goddard collected these early Goddard wills, dating from 1417 to 1605. They were first published in *Fragmenta Genealogica* Vol 7 pages 73-102, a private publication by F. A. Crisp, in 1902. The Society of Genealogists in London have a copy of the original publication as do other major libraries such as the British Library and the Bodlian Library in Oxford.

Following a very few sample checks on specific original wills it appears that the original précis by Rainald Goddard extracted all the names from each will and the intentions of the will writer. His original published document is without an index. However, a simple index has been produced for this electronic document which has been prepared from a photocopy of the original abstracts by scanning and using an OCR program. Although this version has been carefully checked it is inevitable that there will be some mistakes both in this and the original document, so in the final quest for accuracy, the reader must view the original will. Note that in this transcription, the spelling, use of superscript, and the abbreviations are those used in the original publication, wherever possible.

RICHARD GODDART of Ogbourne St. George, in the county of Wilts. To be buried in the church of St. George, Ogbourne, "in the ile called our ladye." Bequest to mother church of Sarum, to high altar in Ogbourne, to the maintenance of the body of said church 1 quarter of barley, " barley to make a stoke in the same church to the intent that the Churchwardens shall every year kepe my obyte for my Soule." Isabell my wife shall deliver to cousin Antony Goddart at age of 18 - sheep and all the barley and hay growing on my closes called " halame " and " morey." All goods to wife Elizabeth (sic) who is made sole extrix. Witnesses; Sir Roger Jones " my gostely father," Richard Eyrys, Thomas Dixin, with many others. Dated 4 July 1530. Proved 29 September 1530.

1535

JOHN GODDERD of Lowestoft, in the county of Suffolk. To be buried within the chancel door, where I sit, on the North side, in the church of St Margaret. To Ann my wife the tenement and lands which I bought of Robert Childems and John Yungambrey in Kessingland, within the half hundred of Aynlforde, the tenement I bought of Robert Childerns of Kessingland in the town of Kessingland, lands which I bought of John Yungambreye, a parcel called "Bezzetts " lying in the field of Kessingland, for her life, then to son John Godderd and heirs for ever, if son die before wife exors to sell these properties and distribute money in charity as they think fit. To wife fee simple of tenement in Carleton. To son John Godderd land in Corton. Robert Yelton my servant a house in Lowestoft lying between the houses of Richard Aughell and of William Harmans. My wife's three daughters Alice Landyvylde, Besse Woode and Margaret Woode proceeds of sale of house called "Heynys," which I bought of Richard Fulwood. Anne my wife, house called "Bernards" and my capital house in Norwich, parish of St. John, Maddermarket. My head house in Lowestoft where I dwell to wife until son is 24, when he is to occupy it, but his mother to dwell there for life, she to occupy " the parlour, the chamber next to it with the litel buttrye next to the East," use of the well and yard "to lye in Colys & woode." William Godderd my nephew £10 at 25. John Shank 20s. Elizabeth his sister £10. My brother Hedds the younger. My two "shippys," i.e., my dogger in Ireland and my crayer called the " Jehus." My brother Robert Godderd all money due and owing to me in "Estgate Strete in St Edmunds bury" of a tenement which William Godderd did lately purchase of me. Exors; Wife Anne and son John Godderd. Supervisor: Master Nicholas Hare of Norwich. Master Hardye of Elton to be my wife's councillor. Witnesses; John Shank, Thos Shottesfcm and Robert Gilbank. Dated 16 April 1535. Proved 20 November 1535.

To son John Goddard farm at Etton. To son Anthony Goddard farm at Barbary. To son William Goddard advowson of Ogboume. Son Thomas. Daughters Luce, Elizabeth, Alice (the younger of that name) and Louie, also daughters Joan, Dorothy and Maryon, "novices in religion." Dorothy, daughter of Thomas Goddard the younger. 1549

WILLIAM GODDARDE of the parish of St Leonard, Shoreditch, in the county of Middlesex, gent. To be buried in the tomb where my grandfather was buried in the parish church of St Leonard aforesaid. My tenements which I purchased of the King, called the "rotten rowe," and all lands in parish of Shoreditch, leasehold and freehold, to wife for life, at her death remainder to son George and heirs, remainder to son Charles Goddarde, remainder to son William Goddarde, failing heirs remainder to two daughters Luce and Elizabeth. My lease in "busshoppe felde" to wife for life, at death to be equally divided between three sons George, Charles and William ; Luce Goddarde my daughter and her husband to have £4 per annum out of same. Lease of "bushoppes hall" to be sold. Sons Charles and William and daughter Elizabeth all household goods which I have at " busshoppes hall." All my cattle there to be equally divided. Residue to wife, after her death to son George. Poor 20s. Wife sole extrix. Overseers: My friend Thomas Lumine (?) and my son John Heydon. Witnesses: Thomas Parsonnes, Wm Swan of Shoreditch, Humferye Hunderhill, Richd Davyd and Gynkes Hall. Dated 11 March, 2 Edward VI. (1541). Proved 16 April 1549 by relict.
