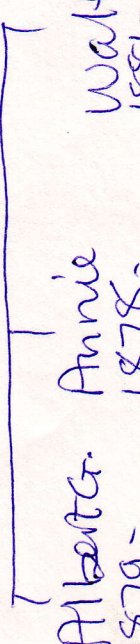

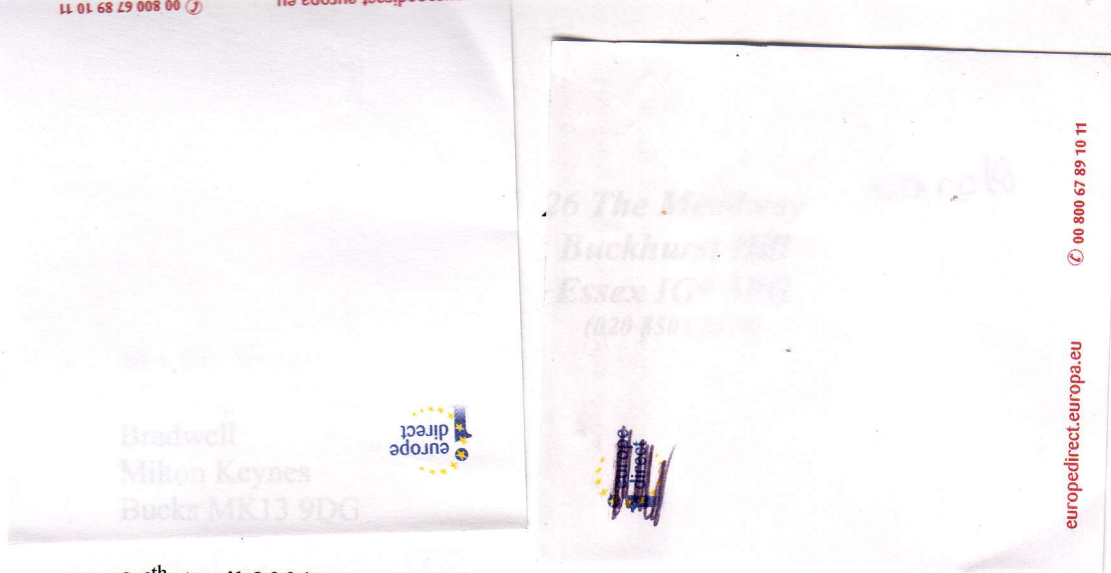
I have just received a copy of my 1st 1st Grandfather's wedding, William & Hannah Goddard, with your information I might father of Lewisham?

Dear Iris,

Very many thanks for your interesting letter regarding the family-tree which provides me with some new information that I am very pleased to have.

Firstly my own research has been restricted to the Silchester Parish Records and the earliest record I found there was to Stephen (from Oakley) marrying at St Mary the Virgin at Silchester in 1812. I can't quite fit this in with your dates unless Stephen aged 26 first got married in 1808 and then had William (in 1808) and Stephen (in 1810) and then perhaps lost his first wife – perhaps in child-birth with Stephen? He perhaps got married again four years later and had Ann (in 1813), Caroline (in 1822), a second Ann (?), perhaps having lost the first one, (in 1824), James Robert (in 1825) and Mary Ann (in 1827). By this time Stephen senior would have been in his 40s.

William was your GGgrandad, his brother Stephen was mine and their 15 years younger brother James Robert was that of Pat Bisset (nee Goddard) in New Zealand. Incidentally have you met Pat and Norm Bisset? They have been over a couple of times – the last occasion to my daughter Helen's wedding. Subsequently my other daughter Sarah spent Christmas with them in Waihi. It might also be of interest to you that Helen and Michael (the Revd Michael Chatfield) now have a daughter Hannah! They live in Nottingham. My son James has also provided us with a grand-child, William! They live in Winchester.

Among my Goddard memorabilia I have William Goddard's Book of Common Prayer. Inscribed in the front is "William Goddard His book, the gift of C. Smith in 1843". Above this is written "C.A. Goddard died Novr. 15 1843/Martha Goddard Died Decr 13." In repairing the cover I revealed a former front page which has written on it "Charles Smith/Deane Gate/Octavius Smith/Deane". (Deane lies between Oakley and Overton to the West of Basingstoke.)

Stephen subsequently became the first land-lord of Silchester's inn, the Crown (now named the Calleva Arms). I own the glass window with a crown and the name Stephen Goddard painted on it that was placed on the entrance door of the inn. A friend of mine who is a photographer at the British Library is at the moment making a copy of this that I intend to give to the present land-lord of the Calleva Arms, he has

interesting pictures of old Silchester around his saloon bar. My father (Stephen William) was nick-named "Malter" at Silchester School which he attended during the First World War and this says something about "village memory". In the 19<sup>th</sup> century a village inn-keeper also brewed his own beer – was a malter.

William's first son, Lewis Lane Goddard was your Ggrandad and his brother's first son James was mine. Your mentioning the fact that Lewis Lane came from Cookham is very interesting. James son, Arthur James, was my grandfather and my grandmother, Annie Lottie Grey, came from Cookham! Did they meet when Arthur was visiting his uncle, Lewis Lane? An interesting fact about Annie Lottie was that she was a cousin of Sir Stanley Spencer of "The resurrection in Cookham church yard" fame! One of the favourite tales my father (Stephen William) used to tell was how his grandfather (James) went for a ride on the back of his motorbike on his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday in the early 1930s.

My brother (James) has a company called Goddard Multimedia and he has produced and interesting CD called "The Goddards: a Hampshire family". I have asked him to forward you a copy, Iris, with my compliments. I think you will find it interesting.

Have you visited Silchester, Iris? When my friend Janet (at the British Library) has finished my photo I hope to go down and give it to the land-lord of the Calleva Arms. A chair placed by my father in the Goddard Corner of Silchester church yard also needs painting and I intend to do this at the dame time. I can not be too sure just when this will be (probably a week-end). Might you be interested to join the expedition?

This is written in haste – I hope you will find in interesting!

Dear Mrs Trunley,

I am returning your cheque. Would you be so kind as to send one for £5 to John Goddard at Accrington - the address is on the back of the blue leaflet. Explain that you have been in contact with me. There is no need for the extra £1; your membership donation covers this.

Stephen Goddard sent me a copy of the letter which he sent you. He is very proud of his Silchester ancestry, as was his father before him. You will see his tree and other papers in the collection I have copied for you.

As Stephen says, Norman and Pat Bissett are the descendants of James Robert Goddard, the carpenter of Silchester. Having said that, I now realise that I don't know whether it is Norman or Pat who is the ancestor; Pat I think. They move around a lot, but the latest address I have for them is 2 Union Street, Waihi, New Zealand. They appear to take on rundown businesses and get them solvent and flourishing, then sell them, have a long holiday in Europe and start again. If you get your letter to the Union Street address returned "gone away" tell me and our NZ representative can look for them - or our two computer wizards, Peter and Malcolm, who seem able to find anyone living now.

James Robert Goddard first went to London where he married Sarah Read. They had a son, William Robert in Marylebone in 1850. The couple then went to Doncaster - perhaps for James to do carpentry making railway carriages - and had two daughters; Evangelist[a] Sarah and Louisa Ann. Sarah died and James travelled south again and went to Deptford, where I think some other Silchester families had moved to set up nursery gardens to supply growing London with fruit and veg. Here he married Louisa Rouw; he would need someone to look after the children. They had five children with them when they left England for New Zealand. Another two were born there. I have advertised for information about William Robert, Evangelist and Louisa Ann, but have not been able to find any trace of them other than their births or baptisms.

I was interested to see that you think that you might be related to Thomas Goddard of Brimpton 1680. The Brimpton Goddards are very numerous and belong to two different families. One is a branch coming from Thatcham and Bucklebury; the other from Aldermaston.

Good luck with your hunting and keep in touch. I have lots more information.
