## JAMES GODDARD

We wrote to the Goddard Association of Europe in June 2000 requesting any information on a James Goddard, carpenter of Kintbury, Berks, who was married to Rose White nee Freeman. Julie & Brian have been very helpful and told us they believed he was the son of James & Caroline Goddard who both died in Kintbury in the 1880s.

We have visited Kintbury and the tombstone in Kintbury churchyard reads:

IN LOVING MEMORY OF  
JAMES GODDARD  
DIED 20 MAR 1885 AGED 82  
ALSO  
CAROLINE  
DIED 17 APR 1888  
AGED 73 YEARS

This would make James Goddard (Senior) born about 1803 according to the tombstone.

On the other hand in the 1881 British Census James is given as 76 (which would put his birth date round about 1805). In the 1851 Census for Kintbury he gives his age as 45 (giving a projected birth year of round about 1806)

At the time of the 1881 Census he was a Whiting Manufactuer who employed 2 men (cement). His birthplace was said to be Tottenham Park, Wiltshire which is understood to be ex-parochial.

The Goddard Association also gave us an extract from a document in the Public Record Office (Reference IR.19.181 Residuary Accounts 1888) which gave the following information:

*“James Goddard of Kintbury Berks., whiting manufacturer dec'd  
died 20 March 1885  
exhibited by Jonathan Cruse of Bruton, Somerset, timber merchant  
and James Goddard of Speen, Berks., carpenter  
trustees – probate Oxford 19 June 1885*

### *Mentions*

*Freehold beer house “The Barley Mow” and four cottages with six acres of land in Kintbury  
Two freehold cottages at Headley in Kingsclere, Hants”*

I attach a copy of the family group of the senior James Goddard. You will see that as well as Kintbury family apparently also lived in Kingsclere where several of the children were christened.

The family had moved to Kintbury by 1851 and at the time of that Census James was given as a Shoe Maker. On the Birth Certificate of James, the carpenter, he was given as a Publican (presumably of “The Barley Mow” – which is now a private house).

Regrettably my husband and his late father knew very little about their family and the reason for this seems to be a quick succession of deaths. James and his wife Caroline who were a reasonable age were quickly followed by James (1889) and John Knight Goddard (1891). His grandson Harry (my husband's grandfather) died at the battle of Arras in 1917 when his son, his only child, was very young.

As you will know the surname in Wiltshire is quite common and it is difficult to pinpoint whether any of the James Goddards that come up on the IGI could be "ours".

We have established there were Goddards in Kintbury going back to 1760 when a Katherine Goddard married a Michael Lambourn.

We have always thought it was significant that the first born son was called Charles, and we have wondered what brought James to Kintbury. He certainly seems to have become more affluent later in life and we wondered whether this was due to an inheritance.

I was interested in what you said about Great Bedwyn. We had looked at this parish and on the IGI there is a record of a marriage between a Charles Goddard and a Hannah Towshend on 26 March 1788. A member of the Goddard Association kindly supplied Goddard information taken from the Kintbury Parish Records and in writing this note to you we noticed the following entries:

- 1791** Hannah daughter of Charles & Hannah Goddard died aged 3 days
- 1795** George son of Charles & Hannah baptized
  
- 1830 - 40** Charles (Carpenter aged 30 from Westminster son of James Goddard (farmer) marries Emma Hedges (aged 31 daughter of James Hedges a Malster)  
The Writer gives apologies for mislaying the dates but thinks it around 1830 – 40)

As to the last entry a search, on the IGI, reveals a marriage date of 1864, so he could be the son of "our" James Goddard and an open mind as to a London connection must be kept.

A further search on the IGI reveals the christening of 3 children with parents given as Charles and Hannah Goddard between the dates of 1791 and 1797. No James though. I would add that there were at least 3 Goddard families living in the Kintbury area in 1851.

We also looked at the Burbage site. There is a marriage here on 30 July 1804 between a Charles Goddard and Elizabeth Few and they certainly had a son called James. He married a Lucy in 1837 which would seem to eliminate him as "our" James who married Caroline Knight in Newbury Berkshire in 1833 and appeared to have a long and successful marriage.

I see I have 2 possibilities (details on the enclosed sheet). There is also the James born c 1797 belonging to my family.

The 2 James born c 1805 and c 1807 I picked up first at W.R. - baptisms of their children - and James c 1807 who married Lucy appeared on 1841, 1851 (born Easton), 1861 (born Burbage) censuses at Wootton Rivers.

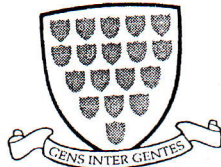

Dear Beryl,

I am sorry that you had trouble getting through to us.

Keith Goddard's ancestor **James Goddard** was born around 1805, that is in the 1881 census he says that he is 76 and was born at "Tottenham Park, Wiltshire". His wife was Caroline Goddard ne Knight and they married 4<sup>th</sup> March 1833 at Newbury.

**Their children were Charles** Goddard baptised 1834; **John Knight** Goddard in 1836; **Henrietta** in 1838; **Elizabeth Knight** Goddard in 1840; **Clara** in 1842; **Kate** in 1844 all at Kingsclere, Hampshire.

**Oliver** baptised at Kintbury, Berkshire in 1847 as were **Agnes** (1852), **James** (1857) and **Cuthbert** (1862)

James died at Kintbury in 1885, said to be 82 and Caroline died at Kintbury in 1888 said to be 73 years old.

James was a publican and whiting manufacturer at his death and owned several cottages at Kintbury and Kingsclere.

Therefore, as the dates for the James that you give overlap the dates for the above, they cannot be the same man.

I have not myself checked what story James told about his birth place in earlier censuses, but I am fairly sure that Keith or his wife Jean have.

About 20 years ago I took a phone call from someone who was trying to trace the origins of his ancestor "James Goddard born at Tottenham" and (not then knowing about Tottenham Park and House) I asked them to write to me with full details. Of course they never have done so. It was not Keith, so it must have been another descendant. I could kick myself! Never mind, we could have a stroke of luck one day and everything will be revealed.

Dear Mr Andrews-Reading

**James Goddard, born at Tottenham Park, Wiltshire c. 1805**

I hope you don't mind me writing to you as I know of you and your research through Julie Goddard and the current GAE newsletter.

I have been stuck these last 4 years trying to find the christening / baptism event of James Goddard who was born at Tottenham Park, Wiltshire about 1805. Unfortunately Tottenham Park is a large country estate which is ex-parochial and surrounded by a number of villages. Until I find this event of course I cannot travel further back in time and as you are aware if you have a Goddard ancestor born in Wiltshire you have a chance of going back as far as 1230 via already researched and printed family trees.

I was struck by the piece written in the GAE newsletter saying you had found links between Brimpton to Thatcham, Newbury, Welford, Boxford, Chieveley, Kingsclere and indirectly to the East Woodhay and Castle Eaton Goddards. Our James Goddard married Caroline Knight (who was born in Thatcham) at Newbury in 1833 and lived in Kingsclere for a number of years before moving to Kintbury, Berkshire. One of their sons James, a direct ancestor of my husband, lived in Speen.
