Dear Jean

I must apologise for not finding Henrietta Goddard or John, Elizabeth and Henry Knight on the 1841 Census. I searched Kintbury and surrounding areas (such as Avington, Inkpen, etc), but to no avail. I could likewise not find the Barley Mow named, and neither did I find a publican not assigned to a named pub!

I did find the following Goddards and Knights, which may be of use:

HO107/21/13 f9 p12

Templeton Farm- A farmer, Richard Goddard (30), and Janet Goddard (28), and Ruth Rye (18), Ann Wilmott (62) and James Cowley (21), the last 3 servants. They were Berkshire born except the last 2.

HO107/21/13 f11 p15

Kintbury Row- A pauper, Mary Knight (88), born outside Berkshire, and her companion Mary Watts (80), of independent means

HO107/21/14 f13 p20

Hamlet of Holt- Ann Goddard, aged 15, Berkshire born, in the household of Richard Thatchered.

HO107/21/15 f4 p2

Denford House- In a large household (21 persons, including 12 servants) Ann Knight, aged 20, a domestic servant, born in Berkshire.

HO107/21/13 f5 p3

In Denford- William knight (45), an agricultural labourer, Hannah (45), Hannah (16), William (11), John (9) and what looked like Chatlotte, but the age (7) was in the column for females. All Berkshire born

HO107/21/13 f5 p4


Booth Farm- James Goddard (20), an agricultural labourer, (Berkshire born) was one of many servants in this household.

However I can confirm that the baptism of Caroline in Thatcham on December 24th 1815 is your Caroline, so I photocopied that for you since it gives a bit more information on the family (her father was the innkeeper at the Swan Inn in Ham Mill).

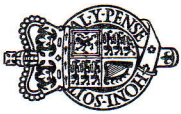

If only the 1841 census was indexed like the 1881 or 1901! Have you found Henry in the 1851 census, or was he definitely dead by then?

Dear Jean

Yesterday I went to the Principal Probate Registry at First Avenue House in London. Armed with your probate information from the Inland Revenue files I found James GODDARD senior's will very quickly in the Calendars which are sorted by year and then by surname. I had a couple other searches to make so I was able to stay the extra hour in order to collect your will in person, which saved the long wait. Unfortunately, as you can see from the enclosed copy, it is not as detailed as I had hoped. It mentions his wife and two sons, John Knight and James but no nephews or nieces etc. Do you know which daughter Jonathan CRUSE married?


I also made a search for James GODDARD junior's will or administration. Although it now seems that he did not die in 1889 as we supposed but was still alive for the 1891 Census, I began my search of the Calendars in 1889 just in case. I also kept an eye out for Caroline (James' wife) who died in 1888. By 1907 I thought it best to stop as he could have lived another thirty years. He may even have died during this period and left property but if his affairs were complicated or the will contested then there is always the possibility that his estate was stuck in the probate system. I would recommend a search of the Burial Registers for Kintbury and Speen after the last dates of my previous search and/or a search of the GRO Deaths Indexes.

Having not found James or Caroline I thought I would make a limited search for his brother John Knight GODDARD's probate. I checked ten years from the year of his burial in 1891. Intriguingly, I did not find an entry under John Knight GODDARD. There were several John GODDARD's but they were not very likely. I even had a quick look for him under KNIGHT for the three years immediately after his death but no luck.

There was a similar lack of family entries in the Kintbury Baptism Register for the years 1890 to 1900. Perhaps both outstanding queries, James GODDARD junior's death and the birth of further children, could be answered by finding the family on the newly released 1901 Census? The BRO has the Berkshire section on fiche so we wouldn't have to go via the temperamental web site.

I have now spent a further 40 minutes researching the GODDARD's on your behalf which comes to £10 plus £5 for the copy of the will making a total of £15. As you were in credit for this amount we are now square. I look forward to hearing from you.

Sorry to hear about Saul but I am afraid there are lots of sniffles, flu and gastroenteritis about at the moment. You would think we would be safer in the winter. Surely its harder for the germs to multiply! Saul really is having a time of it at the start of his life. I seemed to be taking Martin up to the hospital every other month from about his 2nd birthday (he even had an operation) and then suddenly it stopped after a number of years. Of course Steven then picked up the gauntlet but he only attended about 18 months. I hope this works out for Saul as well. I feel sure he will eventually "grow out" of at least some of his allergies.

Keith and I have fond memories of Barcelona. We only spent a day there during our one Spanish holiday but we were really taken with it. Especially La Familia and other buildings by Gaudi. The church is still being built and its taking decades but do the Spanish complain about the money being spent on it. No they are very proud of it. It only goes to show you get what you pay for. We slung up the Millennium Dome at a huge cost for some unknown purpose and too quickly. The new bridge built in France had a British Architect. The little bit of research I have done so far on Hurstbourne Tarrant indicates that its Vicar was also the one for Burbage which I think is quite relevant. I haven't heard from any of the people you suggested I write to. It could be Christmas of course but I do hope they were not upset or offended. I tried to be factual and just asked if they had any thoughts. The Goddards of that area are a bit like a maze aren't they? There are either 2 John Goddards in Hurstbourne Tarrant or 1 who was widowed and re-married at the relevant time. The re-marriage looks right as there is nearly a 2 year gap between the birth of the last child of John and Sarah (nee Wedge) and the marriage of a John Goddard to Lydia Batchelor in January 1760. Also John and Lydia did not use the name of John for any of their sons. Was this because John had already used it with Sarah - they had a child called John christened on the 12th July 1751? But I could not find a suitable death event for Sarah Goddard at the right time. So I think that Hurstbourne Tarrant may have been the home parish for Lydia Batchelor but John Goddard came from another parish. I will have to do some more research on this after Christmas.

Any way I wish you, Brian, Sarah, Cipriano and especially Saul a Happy Christmas and a Healthy New Year. Bye the way I didn't extend my congratulations for the baby expected next year. I do that now.
