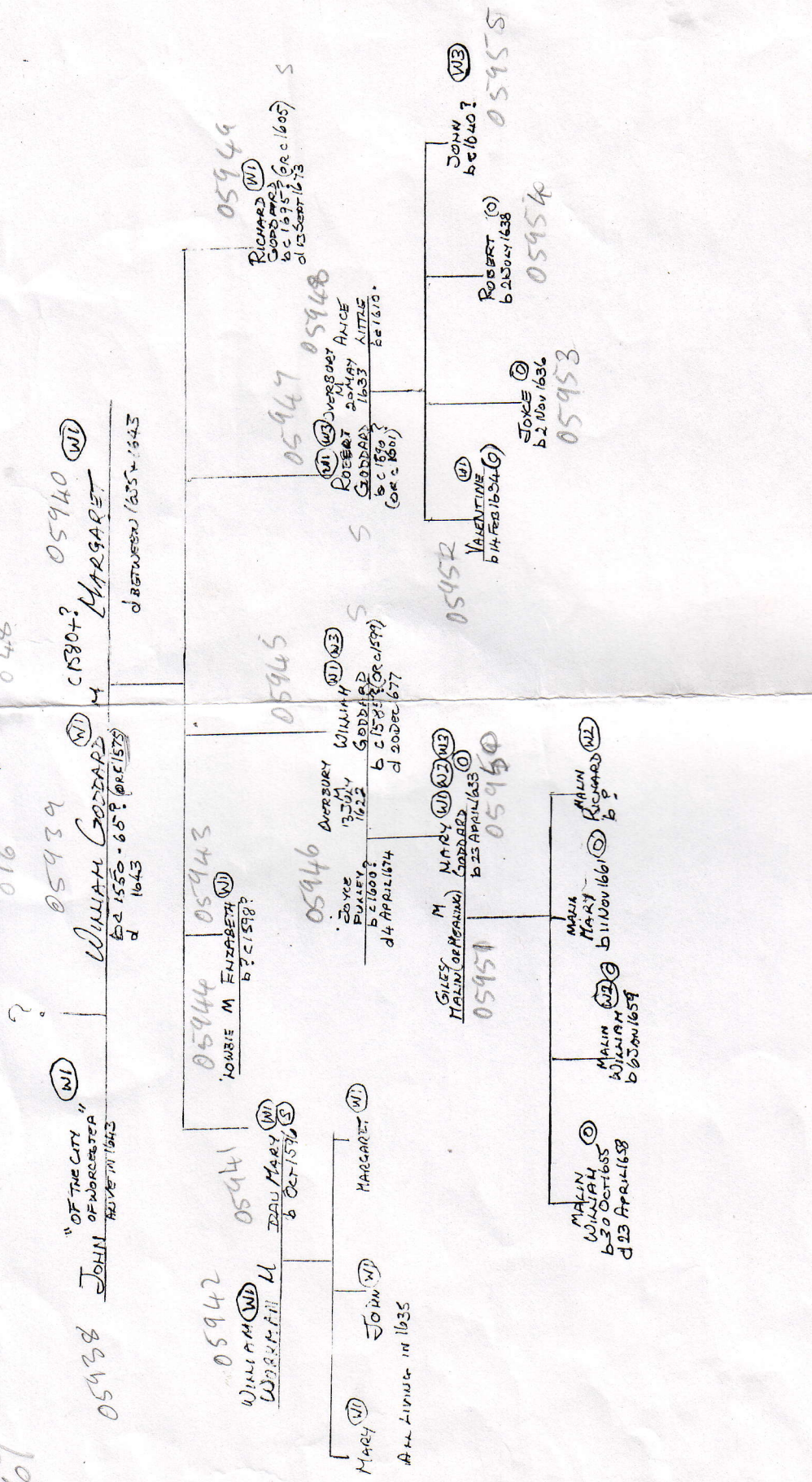

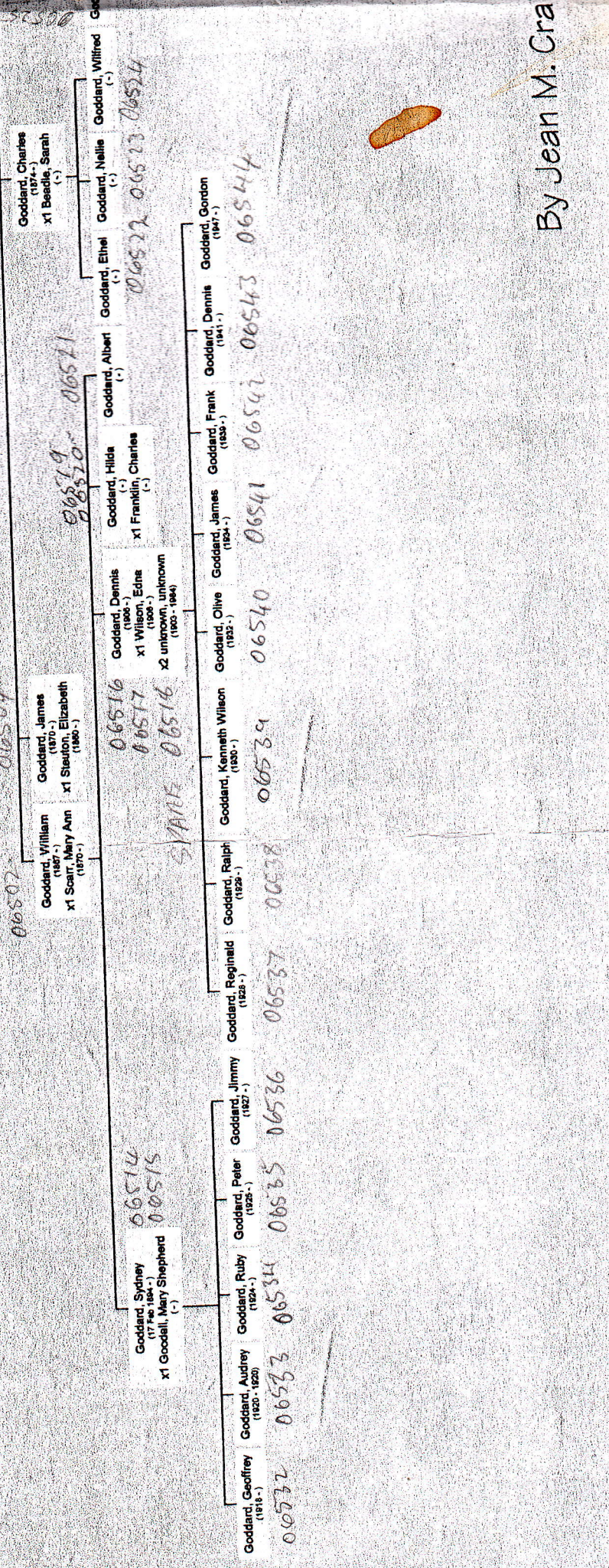

Dear Brian - Just back from a weekend in Cambridgeshire and was pleased to receive your message. I must admit that I haven't done the Stenton/Steuton in depth. I was given this information by my mother and the same applies to the Beedle/Beadle side of the family.

The information about my grandfather is as follows from the 1881 census.

This was at Thorpe Hesley, a small village near Rotherham, Yorkshire.

George Crossley - Age 26 Hd Coal Miner Born Thorpe Hesley - Yorks (Not strictly true - he was actually born at Skiers Hall, Hoyland, Barnsley.) We had a dickens of a job finding this man, but luckily one of his daughters (Grace) was still alive and I went to see her (she was 92) and I took my Mother (her niece - aged 80!). She refused to give her daughters any information but she told me everything I wanted to know, where he was born and on what date and the confusing thing was that the Registrar had registered him as CROSSLAND and not Crossley - no wonder we couldn't locate him! She died three months later, so I got the information just in time.

 Charles Goddard married Sarah Beedle (Sorry about the spelling) on 13th January 1911 - she was aged 32 years and her father was Thomas Beedle a potter - so you are right! The register was witnessed by John Beedle and Ellen Beedle. She lived at 40 Methley Road, Castleford and Charles lived at 36 Methley Road. Not so far to do their courting!

The Morrison side I can't help you with at the moment. I will email one of my cousins to see if he can help us. In the mean time - thank you once again - Kind Regards - Jean Crabtree

This is the last Will and Testament of me John Goddard of the Chequers in Monk Tryston in the county of York licensed victualler I appoint my son Charles and John Harrington Simpson of the city of Leeds Brush manufacturer (hereinafter called my Trustees) to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will I give devise and bequeath the whole of my real and personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever and whatever nature tenure or kind unto my Trustees upon trust that my Trustees shall sell call in and convert into money the same or such part thereof as shall not consist of money and shall out of the moneys produced by such sale calling in and conversion and out of my ready money pay my funeral and testamentary expenses and debts and shall invest the residue of the said moneys with power from time to time to vary the investments and shall stand possessed of the residue of the said moneys and the investments for the time being representing the same (hereinafter called the residuary trust funds) In trust for all my children who being sons shall attain the age of twenty one years or being daughters shall attain that age or marry under that age share and share alike Provided always that if any child of mine shall die in my lifetime leaving a child or children living at my death who being a son or sons attain the age of twenty one years or being a daughter or daughters attain that age or marry under that age then and in every such case the last mentioned child or children shall take (and if more than one equally between them) the share which his her or their parent would have taken in the residuary trust fund if such parent had survived me and attained the age of twenty one years and I direct that my said son Charles shall have the option of taking over at a valuation all such effects as are generally included as between an incoming and an outgoing tenant of the licensed premises known as the Chequers in Monk Tryston now occupied by me Provided always that my said Trustees shall have the option of postponing the sale of such part of my real Estate for such a period as they in their discretion may think fit In witness whereof I have signed my Will at my

Dear Brian

You may possibly remember that in a reply to a letter from Julie last November I said that I intended to pursue some enquiries at Longleat regarding the Goddards of Buckland in Glos. I have contacted the archives, which hold a great store of historic documents dealing with the properties belonging to the family of the Marquis of Bath, the Thynnes. I ascertained that some of their Thynne Papers from Gloucestershire are available for computer search and that these contained about thirteen Goddard references and that for a fee they would send me copies of the documents in question. I have now got these documents and although they have not provided me with any information which would enable me to connect the Buckland lot with my Stanway forebears they have clarified one or two details and opened the possibility of finding where at least one of their holdings was.

You may be interested to know that the Castle Eaton Goddards raise their heads again, as some of the references are to the parish of Kempsford (Glos) which was another manor in Thynne lordship and which I think is next door to Castle Eaton. A Robert Goddard and a Katherine Goddard, widow, (both of the latter parish) held property in Kempsford. I think that Robert is the Robert Norris Goddard who is no. 05350 in your *Goddards of N. Wiltshire* chapter 3 and Katherine is his mother, the widow of Henry Goddard 01305. I will include copies of the papers, which consist of eight numbered pages, for you to see. They also throw some light on the sort of tenure that was customary in these places, consisting as they do mainly of lists of leases and other papers relating to tenancies. Several of them are reprises of the same lease but often contain extra bits of useful information, e.g. that Robert Goddard was uncle to an Alexander Ready or possibly to Alexander's son, the former being husband to one of Robert's sisters in your monograph. There are some other references to our name included, one of which, on page 2, dealing with Robert's seemingly harsh treatment of "Old Kibble the mole catcher" would suggest that your assessment of his relations with his family (p45 of the monograph) might extend to others of his acquaintance. There are other names of families that were associated with the Goddards appearing in the lists

It may also be of interest to you and possibly to other members of the association to know that the Thynne Papers for Wiltshire and Somerset are also open for computer search. I do not know what manors belonged to the Thynnes in Wiltshire (other than Longleat) but it should be possible to find out if you think that it might be useful, as it could add to the database.

Give my regards to Julie and I hope you are both keeping well.

Extract of court roll of Buckland and Laverton manor, dated 23 August 1576, recording the surrender by Richard Godard of two messuages in Laverton with barn, stable and a cow house, land in 'Dalmeade', 'Synderham', and his readmission with William his son, to the same. Signed by Sir John Thynne, lord of the manor.

Conditions of an obligation entered into between Sir John Thynne senior and Richard Goddard and William Goddard his son for the lease of 1/22th part of Wormington Leasow and a meadow adjoining called 'Moremead'. Rent 18s.6d.
