

Dear Julie Goddard,
 Thank you for your letter way back in July. I didn't reply immediately because I knew that I had so much material coming in which needed tabulating that it was pointless to send you 'half a loaf.' I still am awaiting a few pivotal bits of information but I'm now sufficiently on top of things to warrant starting a letter.

Dec. 1994

Yes, Thomas and Sarah are the parents of the offspring listed in your letter and William (probably the oldest) was missed because I suspected his parents' marriage legitimized his birth. On our family tree a further three children are recorded viz " Hannah, bp 26.1.1812 at Stonehouse and married ? SAVORY, Harriet (on tree only) so no bp. but married ? DICKMAN and Henry (on tree only) who has no offspring so may have died young. (no children)

Re your other query - your neighbouring Peter BLOODWORTH is not a known relative but Bloodworths are such rare animals that anyone wishing to start a One-Name Society should be well away. I acquire every reference (several years of Civil Registration) and I doubt whether there are many more than 2,000 marriages since the start of Civil Registration.

I think I have worked out the advantages and limitations of 'our' pictorial family tree (400 names, 80 marriages (including 60 GODDARDS, about 35 GODDARD marriages) which records the most recent birth known to us just after the turn of this century. The compiler, William Wallace WARWICK is to be commended for the amount of material he put together but I suspect he made mistakes. I can't believe that a Thomas GODDARD called his son "Leonard Stanley" (name of parish) or that Mary GODDARD married a TEALILE when her mother was living with a son-in-law William TEAKLE in 1881.

On the tree, women who married were given a surname (verified independently on I.G.I in Goddard/Wiltshire (Wiltsher), Goddard/Watlington, Goddard/Hill (our g. grand^{ma} also) with marr. reg. cert) which leads me to believe that the other marriage references are nearly 100% certain.

The self-taped-together 'wall-hanging' includes all GODDARDS extrapolated from our family tree. I have been able to cross check many names and relationships on either the I.G.I,

1851 and 1881 Census for Gloucestershire as far as Goddards are concerned. Where I have not been able to add ages or baptismal dates, it indicates that the person named is on the tree only.

The other individual Goddard families I have culled from the 1851 and 1881 censuses. I have also listed all lone males but I have left out lone females unless they are specifically ^{noted} as unmarried Goddards. If you still want them please let me know. I suppose they do give an age & possible marriage parish.

Some of the families could well be related to our Goddards but, as I do not know whether the old patriarch (from Stroud on 1851 census) had any siblings, I have no means of verifying.

17th Dec. Received a "pivotal information" bit yesterday - Hereford Record Office

replied with "Thomas Goddard of the Parish of Stroud and Sarah Meredith of this (Upton) Parish married... the 4th day of October in the Year 1,793." Sarah was also baptised there in March 1771 shocked to find they were both illiterate.

Everything is pointing to Thomas being a Stroud Parish local which probably means that ^{that} Swarth in adjoining Stroud parishes share his forebears.

30th January, 1995 The sorting out went on a bit but it has helped me to add quite a bit about our own family to the sum total and to add possible ages to names. I was surprised to find that our Goddard marriages total \approx 40, about 30 of which should be within Civil Registration years. The indications are that the other Goddards' marriages are in the region of 60 with 1851/1881 Census wives usefully having their birth places (and likely marriage venues) recorded.

I have probably made 'over-connections' but I should think it is easier for you to query than to miss a possible relationship. I was amazed to note the amount of moving about that obviously went on.

I read your published letter with interest - when I've tracked down Mr. Warwick (artist's) address, then GODDARD-hunting will have to wait 'till it's raining'! However, I would have felt terribly guilty if I'd left all this inf-gathering dust after you had said you had very little on Gloucestershire. Kind regards.

Dear Mrs Bloodworth,

Thank you for your letter about your Goddard ancestry.

Goddard is quite a common name and in the nine years of the association's existence we have only begun to scratch the surface of the number of Goddards to be recorded and have very little on the Stroud, Gloucester branch - though we know that there was one. Lord Chief Justice Goddard's biography, by Fenton Bresler, states that his grandfather was Charles Goddard, born 1807, a doctor in Stroud. Charles married Maria Catherine Rayner and they had a son, also named Charles, in 1842 and seven other children. Charles junior is said to have been brought up by two maiden aunts at a house near Newbury (but in the ten years we have lived here no one has ever pointed it out to us). Charles junior married Janet Gertrude Jobson and they had three sons and two daughters, Rayner being born on 10 April 1877. Rayner Goddard had three daughters and the line ended with him.

On being made a lord, Rayner Goddard asked for the title of "Lord Goddard of Aldbourne" claiming that he was descended from the land owning Goddards of North Wiltshire through the "Chieveley branch", but this has not been proved to our satisfaction and doubt has been expressed on the point by present members of the Goddard Association who **can** prove their descent. We should be grateful for any information that you could give us about the Stroud Goddards which would enlarge our knowledge of the Lord Chief Justice's ancestors.

You say that you are having difficulty in reading the date of death of Thomas Goddard of Stroud. It could be perhaps be read if it was exposed to ultra violet light in a machine which is nowadays possessed by many Record Offices and Archive Repositories for reading and deciphering old documents. Have you found your Goddards in the 1851 census? You have an address for them and, as long as they had not moved between 1851 and 1855, you should easily find the relevant entry. I am not sure what indexes and records Gloucester Family History Society has, but most counties have indexed the 1851 census by now. It is hit or miss whether early death certificates give the marital status of a woman. We got one the other day which did not; but the woman had died away from home and perhaps the informant of the death did not know her status.

We have facsimile copies of "The Goddards of North Wiltshire" by Richard Jefferies for sale at £5 (originals are now costing £120 or so), but genealogy has advanced since his day and not all that he wrote is now believed to be true, it, none the less, gives a good overall picture of the descent of various members of the family.

We would be delighted if you could give us some information on the Goddards of Stroud as you have found it. Please give names, dates and places in any manner which is convenient to you. I had a look at the IGI (1988) for Gloucestershire and I see that Thomas and Sarah Goddard baptised Thomas (1795), James (1798), Samuel (1800), John (1803), Sarah (1806) and Charlotte (1809). Is this the same family? Did William's baptism escape being recorded?

The local Newbury photographer is a **Peter** Bloodworth. Is he any connection?

Thank you for the copy of the letter to Mrs Freeman; I shall see if there is anything I can do to shed light. The fact that Mrs Bloodworth's ancestor William married from Stonehouse (which adjoins Stroud) makes one suspect that the Thomas & Sarah are the couple who produced mine children in that parish between 1795 and 1816, according to the I.G.I. That there do not include a William may be just an omission by the I.G.I. I would be grateful if you could let me have anything you have on the Freeman/Bloodworth Goddard connection as I would like to help if possible, and yes I would like a copy of the 1881 census Index for Glos; thank you for the offer.

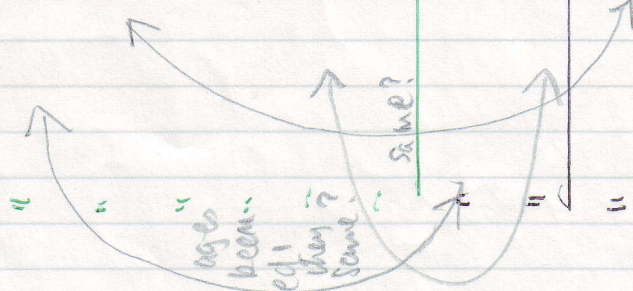
