MONUMENT IN BLOCKLEY CHURCH, GLOS

Goddard Carter of Alscot [Alvescot] in the County of Oxon Esq., by his Will 19th Nov 1723 gave ten pounds a year out of his lands in Upton Old to teach poor Children living in the Parish of Blockley to read write and something of Arithmetick.

Item ten pounds a year out of the same Estate for ever cloathing the poorest old People of the Parish of Blockley and his Will is that the Owner or Owners of the aforesaid Estate for ever shall appoint the person who shall teach the said Children and also what poor Persons shall be cloathed and with what cloathing and that [also an?] account in writing under their hands be delivered to the inhabitants yearly in the Easter week when they shall meet to chose Churchwardens how they have disposed of the said Charities

i'm wondering what the best application of the use of the Goddard Association would be for me.

i am happy to join the association as i have been long interested in my many times grandmother, dinah goddard.

I am descended from a family of beames/beams in australia, supposedly descended from roger de montgomery, however my robert beames was a convict, and again supposedly named after robert de belesme son of roger de montgomery.

We are all forced to take this with a grain of salt as do many who are supposedly descended from norman families. The only documented interest from

England comes from letters dated 1895 in which the supposed family link is shown.

In the late 1800's there is actual documentation that the beams/beames families were visited in victoria australia, to ascertain their kinship to morgan relatives who had money in chancery.

The connection was that dinah or dianah goddard had married a william morgan at Cirencester in december 1716, and that a relative of william morgan had been a tutor to royalty, and been left money.

The beames are direct descendants of dinah goddard and william morgan and that appears to form the basis of that visit.

Both robert and his brother were sent to australia as convicts, but within the historical records of australia, there are countless pages of submissions by robert beames for various reasons. His command of the written language indicates that he was educated to approximately the level of first year university.

It is interesting that there is a possibility of the goddards coming over with the norman invasion.

I have found that even within their newly adopted countries, many descendants of norman families intermarry frequently.

I would like to explore my links to Goddard families in wiltshire and Gloucestershire and wonder if joining the association would be a good idea?

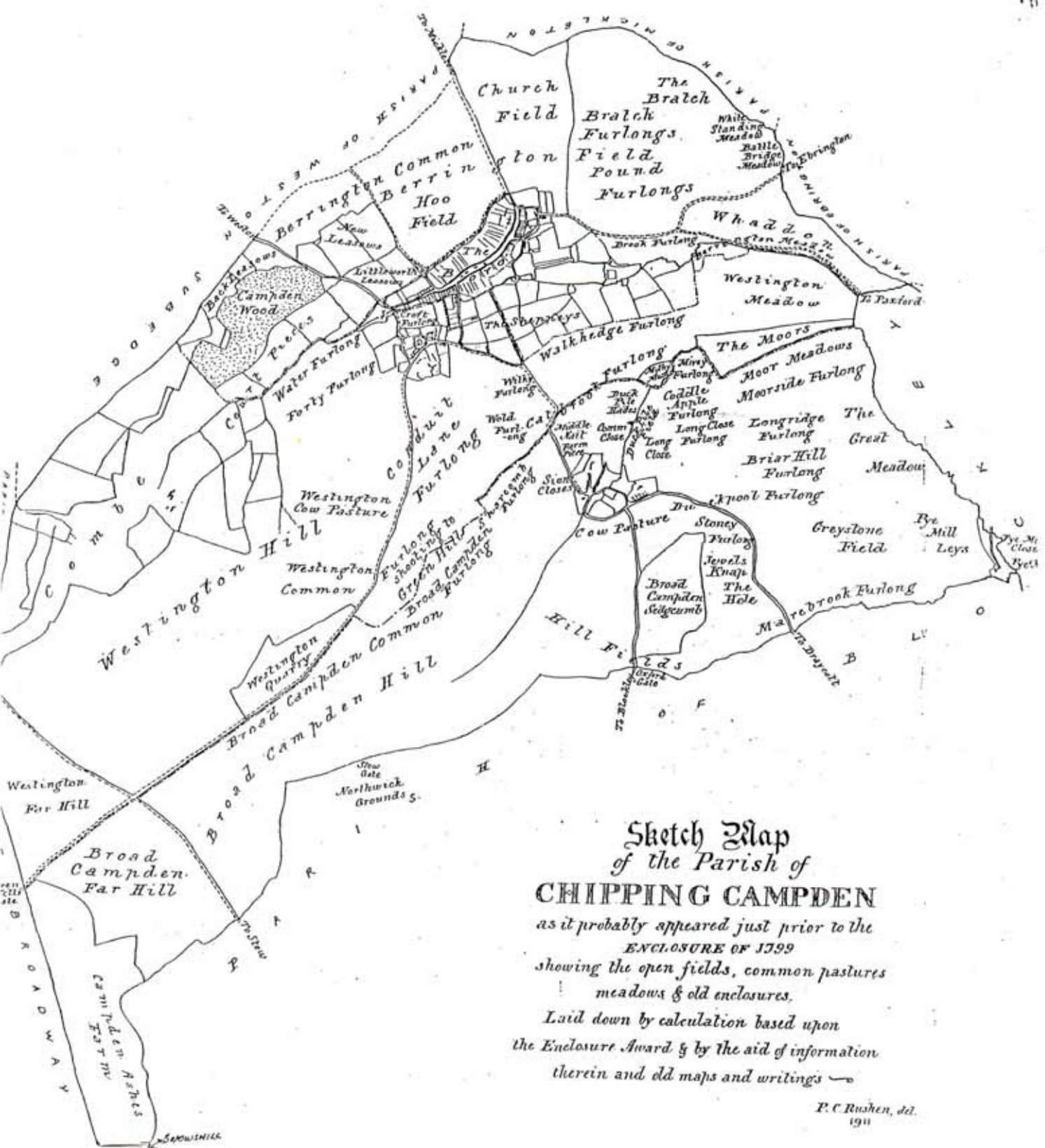
The only connection that has been established of Goddards and Cirencester is contained in "Chapter 3" of the monographs of The Goddards of N. Wiltshire. This connection, on the surface appears tenuous, just a marriage Curle (Charles) Goddard & Elizabeth (Betty) Knight on the 17<sup>th</sup> January 1724 at Cirencester, but this single marriage, by two strangers to the parish, does not justify the inclusion of their, the Wiltshire, coat of arms in the frieze of shields on the wall around the altar! [Depicted 4<sup>th</sup> from the right at the bottom of this page.] This family must have been much more involved in the parish of Cirencester than first appearances would have us believe.

However, although Diana was possibly of an age to be a sister of Curle, his siblings are well documented with baptisms, burials and mention in wills, but much less research time has been spent with regard to his cousins and much less documented evidence has been reported on these several families, so it is just possible that Diana was related to this family. Although, to date, no examples of the use of the name "Diana" has been associated with this family they were not adverse to using unusual names. The biggest problem with the association of Diana with any specific Goddard family in the area is that there are so many different and unrelated Goddard families from both N. & S. Gloucestershire, Worcestershire, Monmouthshire, Oxfordshire and Wiltshire. known to have been in the vicinity of Cirencester within 50 years adjacent to the marriage of Diana and William Morgan.

I can only suggest that you obtain a copy of the monograph the "Goddards of North Wiltshire Chapter 3", £2- 50p from Richard G. of Malvern and I hope that you spot something that I have missed. I would be delighted if you find some further information, particularly regarding the Goddard influences in Cirencester and possibly an extension to the Wiltshire Branch, as I hope to be reviewing most of the monographs in the foreseeable future into a form capable of being put onto the website and I will be incorporating any information that has appeared since the original publication.

Dear Mrs Goddard,

Shortly after I posted my last letter to you, I heard from John Goddard at Accrington and am now a member of the Association. I am enclosing a copy of some of my results so far, though I am not quite sure how much you actually want at this point. I had better explain what I am sending; as I think I have said earlier, I worked on my own until recently so that some of my stuff may not be produced in an entirely <sup>orthodox</sup> manner, but as it would take an age to re-work it all, so I shall send things as they are.

There is a straightforward and hopefully brief account of my family history accompanied by a pedigree or chart for each of the parts into which the story naturally divides and an overall one which summarises my descent from the early sixteenth century through a long line of labourers. The main story dates from about two years ago when I had been working for about a year; I got through the generations at what, in retrospect, seems ridiculously speed, once out of Birmingham, but though I have seen masses of data since, the main line has only required minor alteration. The main difficulty was the sequence of Anthonys in Chipping Camden and which married whom and <sup>where</sup> one family ended and the next began. I have now got it sorted, but you may still find references in the text to problems now resolved. The charts are up to date. There is one proviso: the story is solid back to the birth of Anthony in 1644, before that is still lacking confirmation, so the first two generations on the overall chart remain to some extent conjectural, which is a pity, as John Goddard takes us into Buckland, where the Parish Register is in perfect condition back to 1539 and contains a lot of Goddards including several in 1539. I have worked out a scheme for Buckland; if you are interested I will send you a copy. I also enclose a chart with all I can find for Chipping Camden and an explanation of it.

If there is more than you want here I apologise, on the other hand I have got all sorts of documents including wills and a good deal of detail about their lives should this be of use or interest.

I have looked on the 1881 census index and, with one exception, can find no Goddards of Mickleton origin, other than my great Grandfather, in Warwickshire, Gloucestershire, Oxfordshire, Wiltshire, Worcestershire, or the Royal Navy. It looks as if his four younger brothers must have emigrated; the exception is in Whitchurch in Warwicks. The Goddards there are not the descendants of the prolific Anthony (see my Quinton chart) <sup>but</sup> two of the orphaned sons of John and Maria of Mickleton, whom I found in Shipton-on-Stour workhouse in 1861. Strangely, one, another John, was found by John C. of Accrington at Rossendale in 1771.

I hope you find some of this useful

Dear Mr Goddard,

If you feel it to be too large a task, tell me and I will have a try at doing it myself.

Is there any chance that you will be able to attend the AGM at Swindon in May? You could put up a display of your pedigree.
