I am a keen family historian, but unfortunately don't have any Goddard heritage!! However in my research I have come across the Rev Richard Goddard M.A. 1787 - 1844 who was the employer of one of my ancestors George Hannis.

I thought the enclosed information may be of some interest to your Goddard Association members.

My motive in writing is to pass on this information but also I would appreciate any help you could give me to piece together the life of Richard Goddard before his death at Broadstone Hill - Oxfordshire.

I would like to know where + when he may have lived + if there are any family papers that may help me to find my ancestor George Hannis. As George Hannis received a bequest in the will of Richard Goddard I am assuming he ~~was~~ may have worked for the Goddard family for some time.

If you have anyone in your Association who can help me with this request I would be very pleased to correspond with them.

Will of Revd Richard Goddard of Broadstone Hill Enstone.

I give and bequeath unto my sister Miss Sarah Goddard all my estate and interest in the next presentation to the Parish church or Vicarage of Heythrop in the said county of Oxford.

I hereby state that all the legacies herein before bequeathed shall be paid free and clear of legacy duty which is to be paid out of the residue of my personal estate.

I give and devise unto my said nephew Ambrose Lethridge Goddard all my freehold messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments situated at or near Llandovery? in the county of Carmarthen in the principality of Wales and which were formerly the estate of Mr Hayward? Jones? and were devised by act? will to my said brother Ambrose Goddard who in or about the year 1820 granted the same to me in Fee? in compliance? with the will of our late father.

I give and bequeath unto my said nephew John_____? Goddard my Rectory, Parsonage or Prebend of Llandygwedd? in the county of Cardigan in the Principality of Wales with the Mansion? house of the same and all the Glebe and other lands, Tithes and other Hereditaments and premises with the Appurtenances to the said Rectory, Parsonage or Prebend.

I give and bequeath all my freehold lands and Hereditaments situate in the in the said parish of Enstone and also all the residue and remainder of my real and personal estate and effects subject to the payment out of my said personal estate for costs of funeral and Testamentary expenses and the legacies hereby bequeathed and the legacy duty payable thereon to the use of my said nephew Ambrose Lethbridge Goddard for his absolute use and benefit.

I hereby appoint the said Thomas Churchill and my nephew Ambrose Lethbridge Goddard joint executors of this my will written on four sheets of paper and subscribed by my hand this fourteenth day of August in the year of our lord 1844. R. Goddard

The will was signed by the testator in the presence of of us two present at the same time who do attest and subscribe the same in the presence of the testator. Charles Barter?/ Barber?. A L Rawlinson.

Proved at London 22 October 1844 before the judge by the oath of Ambrose Lethbridge Goddard the nephew one of the executors.

THE HISTORY OF ENSTONE + HEYTHROP - OXON.

REV RICHARD GODDARD. M.A. 1787-1844 (56)

The Rev Goddard had reputedly lived at Broadstone Hill for many years before his death in 1844 although he was the vicar for Kemble in Wiltshire between 1826 + 1844. Presumably he employed a curate to fulfill his duties at Kemble considering the distance between Enstone + Kemble.

Among his servants listed in the 1841 census for Broadstone Hill is George Hannis who was born in Enstone in 1792 the second son of Richard + Mary (H)ANNIS. George had been in service all of his life in the locality + can be found in Kingham - Oxon between 1820 + 1827 associated with the Penyston family of Cornwell manor + after the death of the Rev Goddard he worked until his death at Buckland in Berkshire in 1849 for one of the county families, most probably the Hayward Southby family of Carswell house - Buckland. There are family connections between the Goddard family + the Hayward Southby family in the 17th + 18th so this may be how George Hannis found his employment. George Hannis was brought back to Enstone to be buried in 1849 + his tomb can still be found in the churchyard in 1997.

TO BE LET, from the 29th instant, either for six months, or a longer period, — BROADSTONE HILL, lately and for many years past the residence of the Rev. Richard Goddard, deceased; together with the kitchen and flower gardens, excellent stabling for eight horses and double coach-house, and about three Acres of Arable Land, at a short distance. Also the exclusive right of Shooting over the Manor of Heythrop and other lands adjoining, comprising nearly 4000 acres of lands and woods, well stocked with game. The tenant would have the option of taking the Furniture of the late Rev. Rich. Goddard, at a valuation, or of renting it till Lady Day next. The above residence is most desirably situated for a sportsman, as it is within a few hundred yards of the kennel of the Heythrop Hounds. — Apply to Mr. Harris, Heythrop, near Enstone; or to Mr. A. L. Rawlinson, solicitor, Chipping-Norton.

The REV Richard Goddard M.A of ST JOHN'S COLLEGE OXFORD & of the Family of the Ambrose Goddards of Swindon resided here at BROADSTONE HILL - ENSTONE for many years & died & was buried here in the year 1844. He is buried in the south chancel aisle where there is a monumental record of him.

Will of Revd Richard Goddard of Broadstone Hill Enstone

I Richard Goddard formerly of Swindon in the county of Wiltshire but now of Broadstone Hill in the parish of Enstone in the county of Oxford Clerk declare this to be my last will and testament.

In the first place I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God my creator. In the next place I desire that in case I shall happen to die at my present residence I may be buried at Enstone aforesaid.

As to my worldly estate I dispose of the same in the manner following. I give and bequeath to my friend John Hesketh Lethbridge Esq the sum of £100.

I give and bequeath to my niece _____? Dorothea? Goddard daughter of my brother Ambrose Goddard the sum of £50.

I give and bequeath my gold repeating watch to my friend General Richard Goddard.

I direct and desire that my executors here in after named shall pay to the person who for the time being shall be Vicar of Enstone (provided I shall be residing in or shall hold or occupy my present residence at the time of my decease) the sum of £10 annually at Christmas in the next and succeeding years after my decease to divide and distribute the same amongst the poor and _____? inhabitants of the said parish of Enstone. I give and bequeath my grey mare by Bartfoot? unto Thomas Churchill Esq of Woodstock one of my executors here in after named and I also give and bequeath to the said Thomas Churchill the sum of £50 as an acknowledgment for taking upon himself the trouble of the executorship of this my will.

I give and bequeath to my Butler George Hanniss the sum of £100.

I give and bequeath to my housekeeper Martha Kench the sum of £60.

I give and bequeath to each of my servants Thomas Kench, John Calcutt and Mary Hopcroft? the sum of £20 and unto my servant Thomas Sharpe the sum of £5.

The said several legacies to my said Butler, Housekeeper and other servants to be payable to such? of them as shall be living in my service at the time of my decease but to be in addition to such sums as may be due to them for wages at the time of my decease.

I give and bequeath all my Alabama and New York or other American Stocks? or Funds? and also the sum of Twelve hundred and Fifty pounds now? $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ bond? annuities unto and equally between all of my nephews and nieces- sons and daughters of my brother Ambrose Goddard. (I hereby particularly request my said nephews and nieces not to sell or dispose of the said stocks? or funds? within the term of ten years next after my decease.

I give and bequeath all my fixtures and furniture which shall be in or about the Parsonage house at Kemble? in the said county of Wiltshire unto the Rev William Chapman Clerk for his own use and benefit.

I hereby declare that the sum of £300- $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ bank annuities part of the public? stocks or funds now standing in my name in the books of the Govance? and Company of the Bank of England is Trust property and is held by me for the benefit of the poor of Kemble aforesaid. I hereby ask that my executors transfer the said £300 at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ annuities into the names of Robert Gordon Esq and William Chapman to be held by them upon the trusts to which it is now subject.

Dear Captain John,

*We have had an enquiry from Miss Maureen Hannis of Victoria, Australia, about her ancestor **George Hannis** (17..-1849) who was butler to **Rev Richard Goddard** (1787-1844).*

She has done a considerable amount of work and knows more about the Rev Richard than we did. She has a copy of the will of 1844 in which he writes "I bequeath to my butler George Hanniss the sum of £100", surely a considerable amount of money in those days. And also entries from Burkes Landed Gentry 1862, the 1841 census of Enstone and extracts from The History of Enstone and Heythrop by Rev. John Jordan, 1857.

I have told Miss Hanniss of the Swindon Estate papers and the Miscellaneous Clyffe Pypard papers in Wiltshire Record Office and the other papers in the WANHS library in Devizes Museum and it is unfortunate that she is so far away from them. I wonder if you have any family records of this butler, though I realise that it is unlikely.

Dear Miss Hannis,

Your letter about the Rev. Richard Goddard and George Hannis has been passed on to me by John Goddard of Accrington.

Your researches have been very thorough and I think that know more about the Rev. Richard Goddard than we do. I can add that a history of the Swindon Goddard family by one of its members explains that on Ambrose Goddard's death the Swindon estate was to go to the eldest son and the estate at Llangain, Mrs Ambrose Goddard's estate, was to go to the second son. At Ambrose's death Thomas, the eldest son had already died, so the Swindon estate went to Ambrose junior and Richard, the third son, inherited the Welsh estate. On Richard's death in 1844, he being unmarried and without a son, the estate went to his eldest nephew Ambrose Lethbridge Goddard.

The voluminous Swindon Goddard estate papers are in Wiltshire Record Office in Trowbridge. I have had a look at the index to the catalogue but cannot find George Hannis mentioned, but he would not necessarily be as they are mostly papers about the exchange of lands and property. There are other miscellaneous Goddard papers in Wiltshire Record Office filed under Clyffe Pypard, where another branch of the family had an estate and the vicarage. And even more under Tockenham, but these might be too early for what you are looking for. Other Goddard papers are in the Goddard room at the Wiltshire Archaeological and Natural History Society rooms in the Museum at Long Street, Devizes. There is a librarian and a good catalogue.

I will pass a copy of your letter to the present head of the Swindon Goddards, Captain John Goddard of Rendcomb, near Cirencester and if he can add anything to what I have written you will hear from him.
