pathetically beautiful. On the last Sunday morning in the month of May, he had just taken his seat in Common Close Church, where he had worshipped for many years, when he was seen to fall forward, and, before he could be removed to the vestry, his spirit had gone home to God. The cause of his death was apoplexy. Another son of man has gone from us; sorrowfully do we say—"Good night, my brother, may we meet again in the morning!"

GLASS, Norman, of Manchester, was educated at Western College, Plymouth, where he took a prize for logic and rhetoric. After a brief ministry at Bacup, in Lancashire, he was ordained at the old chapel, Womanby Street, Cardiff; and in this rather trying and unpromising field of labour he toiled on steadily for several years, at the same time laying the foundation of that large acquaintance with natural science, and particularly with geology, for which his long excursions into the district round about gave him unusually favourable opportunities. In 1861 he commenced work at Carlisle Chapel, Kennington, whence he removed, in 1863, to Basingstoke, where he remained till 1869. In the following year he settled at Rothwell, Northamptonshire, and in 1872 he took the charge at Bilsdon, where he remained until, in 1879, he went to Manchester, finding appropriate occupation, when he finally resigned the pastorate, in the curatorship of the Geological Museum, thus turning to wise and good account his peculiar talents and attainments. He removed in 1892 to Blackpool, where he resided until his death, which took place on December 2nd, 1893. Undoubtedly it was as a scientist that he made the greatest mark. Professor Owen, Sir Roderrick Murchison, Professor Boyd Dawkins, Dr. Dallingier, and other eminent men united in testifying to his ability and acumen in these regards. But he was not without testimony to his character and service as a minister in the more usual sense of the term. In difficult circumstances and through many trials, he carried on his work with undaunted courage, and so as to gain the approval and esteem of his brethren in the service of the Master. His reward was not appointed to be in the form of great outward success, but he left behind him in many places those who remembered him with gratitude, who had enjoyed his friendship and profited by his instruction.

GODDARD, Henry, of Eastbourne, was born at Rotherhithe on February 20th, 1852. Through the prayer and sweet spiritual influence of his mother, he gave himself to Christ at the age of sixteen, and devoted all his spare time to visiting the almshouses and taking part in cottage prayer-meetings. For some time he was a lay student at Regent's Park College, and at the early age of twenty he was ordained to the pastorate at Heathfield, where he remained four years and a half. He then accepted an invitation to Framlingham. His next charge was at Henfield. Thence, owing to the failure of his health, and by the kind assistance of Donald Currie, Esq., he took a voyage to the Cape, and returned considerably restored. His restoration, however, was only for a time. On the recommendation of friends, he went to Cape de Verde, and preached there twelve months. On his return he was invited to Crawley, and remained about three years. Then he removed to Nova Scotia, where he did a good work, and was much beloved, but unfortunately his health broke down again. His people

pressed him to stay, but his physician insisted that another winter in so severe a climate was more than he ought to risk. So he returned again to England, and became the pastor of St. Ives. Whilst labouring there his health utterly gave way. So he resigned, and from that date (1891) he became terribly afflicted to the day of his death. He occasionally preached, but generally he was so prostrate with bodily pain that he could do nothing. His affliction was "Addison's disease." No human hand could help him to recover, but kind and loving friends came forward and bore as much of the heavy financial burden as they could. The Rev. Carruthers Wilson (Presbyterian), of Eastbourne, was especially kind, who, with other friends, made his last days as bright as was possible in such a fearful illness. He longed for rest, the weariness seemed more than he could bear, and he fell asleep in Jesus at Eastbourne, on February 20th, 1894, his birthday, aged forty-two. His last words were, "Come, Lord Jesus, come quickly."

GRIFFITHS, William Alonzo, of Sketty, Swansea, was educated at Carmarthen Presbyterian College, which he left in 1866, to take charge of the church at Abersychan, Monmouthshire. In 1870 he removed to Oaklands, Shepherd's Bush, London, and, in 1874, to Narberth, Pembrokeshire, where he laboured for twelve years, and experienced the chief sorrow of his life, the loss of an only child, a bright little girl of six years, suddenly taken away by diphtheria.

In 1886, leaving Narberth, he took charge of the English church at Sketty, where he ministered to the end. Mr. Griffiths had some conspicuous ministerial gifts—among others, a clear mind, a free utterance, and a rich and melodious voice. He was a preacher whom people wished to hear again, pleasant, interesting, and, now and then, incisive and pungent.

His standards were high of what a minister ought to be as "a servant of Christ and steward of the mysteries of God"; of pulpit efficiency, being himself "a workman that needed not to be ashamed"; of the world and walking in His commandments in peace and love. He never attained his ideals here, but he earnestly followed after them. As a preacher, he had in him something that reminded us of Elijah or John the Baptist in his fearless reproof of sin. If sometimes he erred by over-severity, it proceeded from an earnest desire to save men. He loved the church, and therefore could not bear in it them that are evil. In his preaching he aimed at the creation of holy character. He fed the understanding, and could with ease touch the feelings, but he strove chiefly to commend himself "to every man's conscience in the sight of God." He possessed literary taste. His conversation was rich in reminiscences of our great authors and quotations from their works. Besides many articles to magazines, he published a volume of sermons in English and a small work on Welsh hymnologists in Welsh, which were received with favour by the public. He had it in his heart to do much more for his Master both in the pulpit and by the press, but his sun went down while it was yet day, in the midst of his work and plans. He departed this life on December 7th, 1893, aged fifty-one years, and was buried with his beloved wife, who only survived him two days, in the graveyard of the Welsh chapel at Sketty. They "were lovely and pleasant in their lives, and in their death they were not divided."
