Subject: Ancestry



Dear Brian & Julie

We are currently attempting to trace our ancestry and having come to a standstill, wondered if The Association's records may help or if you could give us any other suggestions or guidance.

According to the civil registration index, my Grandfather, George Henry Goddard (b 1861- d 1942) married Frances Vera Marsh (although her surname is stated as formerly being Bidmeadize on my fathers birth certificate) in Crondall, Hampshire in 1884. He born in Crondall.

His father Henry Goddard (1828-1902) was also believed to have been born in Crondall as in confirmed in the 1871 1891 & 1901 census, although the 1881 census states Godstone, Surrey. The 1871, 81 & 91 census state his wife as Jane Maria. We have however been unable to trace his marriage or birth records.

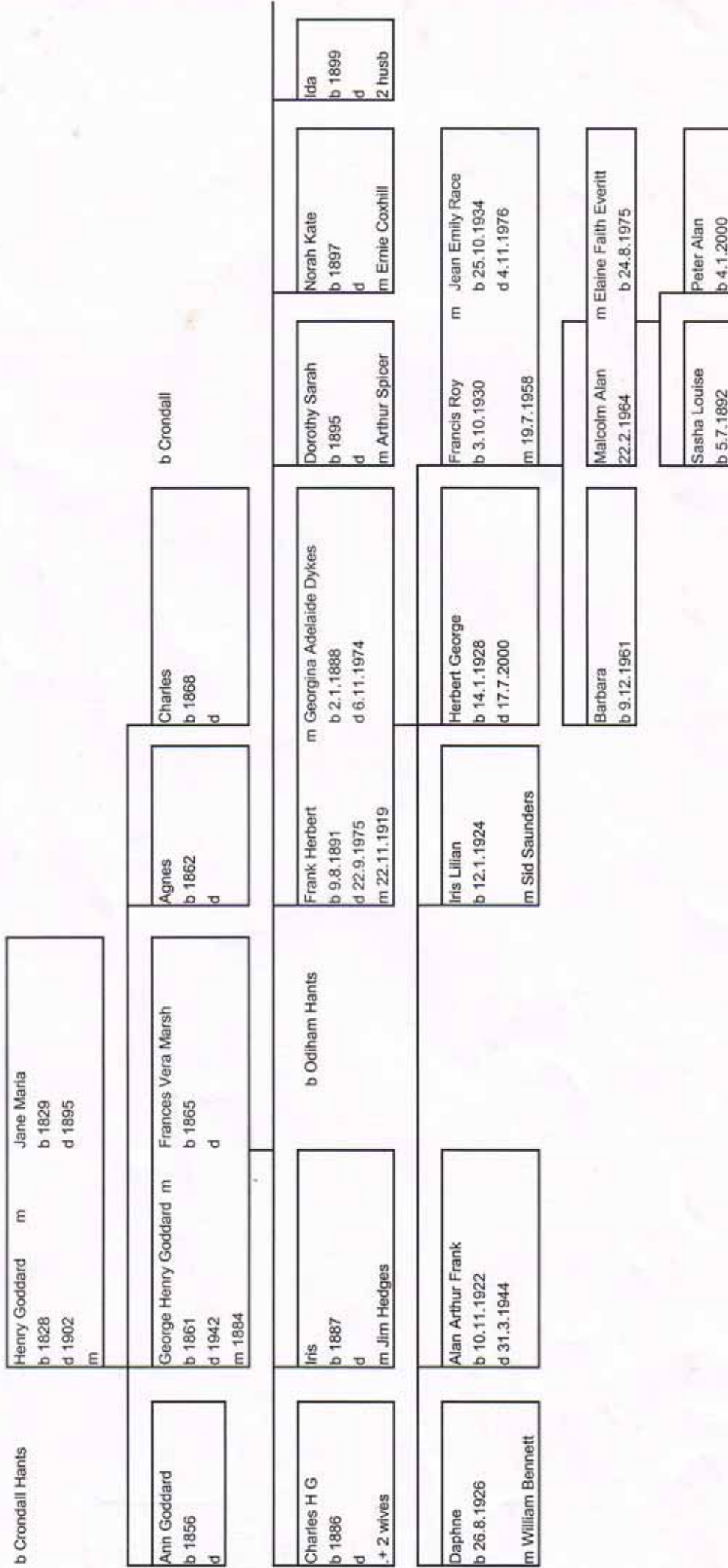
It is therefore at this point we have become stuck. Any help or assistance you could offer would be much appreciated.

Following your most excellent advise at the end of last year, my daughter Barbara and I have been able to progress a short step back and gain many more details in our quest for our Goddard ancestors. For your information, I attach a copy of our revised tree together with draft notes as to how this was arrived at. My Grandmother Vera Frances still remains a mystery as to her supposed maiden name of Bidmedze (as noted on my father's birth certificate) yet her marriage certificate shows it to be Marsh! Perhaps she was an illegal immigrant from the Russian Steppes where she claimed her folks came from!

Our search for my mother's side has been a bit more successful - back to 1680 - as fortunately the Dykes family remained in the small village of Cholderton for many years!

The 1881 census shows a **William Goddard** (b c 1800), then a widower aged 81, to be living at Church Street, Crondall. ?Maybe Henry's father?

Henry Goddard (born c1828; died 18.5.1902) was born at Crondall, Hampshire, where he married **Jane Maria Parfett** (born c1829; died 14.9.1895) at the parish church on 20 February 1852. The event was witnessed by Andrew Parfett, Ann Goddard and Jane Goddard - It is possible that these three were siblings of the 'happy couple'. The marriage certificate confirms Henry's father as **William Goddard**, a labourer and Jane's father as **George Parfett**, also a labourer. They produced sons Charles (b c1868) and **George Henry** & daughters Ann (b c1856) and Agnes (b c1862). Jane Maria died at Harinams(?) Farm, Crondall, aged 67 years of Dropsy, Heart Disease. Henry died aged 73 years at Deptford, Odiham of Influenza, Bronchial Pneumonia. The event was registered by his grand-daughter Iris Goddard.

George Henry (born 1 September 1859; died 1942) was also born in Crondall. The occasion was registered by his mother Jane Maria, on 8 October 1859, who signed the register using 'her mark'. He married **Frances Vera Marsh** (aka Bidmedize) (born c1865) in the Parish Church Crondall on 12 June 1884. They produced several children who were born in Odiham, Hampshire:-

Charles H G (b 1886) who married twice with six children from each marriage.

Iris May (b 1886; christened at Greywell 11.7.1886) who married James Hedges, a one-time Mayor of Eastleigh, and had children George, Herbert, Cissy, Iris, Bill, Alec(Tubby) and Ginger. At the time of the 1901 census, Iris was working as 'General Domestic Servant' living at Wivesfield, East Sussex.

Roy (b August 1889; d March 1927) who married Alice Tarrant produced children Nora, Roy Lancelot, Frank Purcell, Norman, Charles Gilbert and Arthur.

Frank Herbert (born 9 August 1891; died 22 September 1975)

Dorothy Sarah (b c1895) who married Arthur Spicer produced Peggy, Michael, Sybil and Iris.

Norah Kate (b c1897) who married Ernie Coxhill producing 1 daughter Barbara

Ida (b c1899) emigrated to New Zealand, where she married Archibald Dick and later Hector Robinson.

Hettie Naomi (b 1901) married Australian soldier Ben Bolliver emigrated to Australia. Their daughter Vera Patricia died aged 1 month in 1919.

Frank Herbert married **Georgina Adelaide Dykes** at West Cholderton Church 22 November 1919. They produced five children:-

Daphne Joan (b 26 August 1920) who was born in West Cholderton and christened there 26 September 1920. She married William Robert Denner Strutt Bennett at St Paul's, Bentley 27 December 1941. Had four daughters - Hilary Joan, twins Denise Helen & Valerie Elizabeth and Elaine Frances.

Alan Arthur Frank (b 10 November 1922; d 31 March 1944) was born at Greywell, Hampshire and baptised there 24 December 1922. He was killed in action in the Nuremburg Raid in 2nd World War aged 21.

Iris Lillian (b 12 October 1924) was born at 31 New Street, Weedon and baptised at Weedon Parish Church 7 December 1924. She married Sidney Allen George Saunders on 2 February 1952 at St Paul's, Bentley. They produced two daughters, Eileen Mary and Gillian.

Herbert George (b 14 January 1928; d 17 July 2000) was born at The Bays, Bentley and was baptised at St Paul's, Bentley 26 February 1928.

Francis Roy was born 3 October 1930 at The Bays, Bentley and baptised at St Paul's, Bentley 26 October 1930. It was here that he married **Jean Emily Race** on 19 July 1958.

Francis and Jean produce 2 children -

Barbara born 9 December 1961 at Brentwood Maternity Home, was baptised at St Paul's, Bentley 18 February 1962.

Malcolm born in the dining room at 24 Osborne Rd, Brentwood, was baptised 17 May 1964 at St Paul's, Bentley. He married **Elaine Faith Everitt** (born 24 August 1975) at Ivy Lodge, Margaretting 24 October 1998. Have two beautiful children; **Sasha Louise** born 5 July 1992 at Norfolk and Norwich Hospital and

Peter Alan born *St Johns Hospital, Chelmsford 4 January 2000. Both children were baptised at St Peter's Church, Hutton on 26 November 2000.*

Dear Pat,

Thank you for your letter.

I have passed on your story about the three Goddards at the graduation ceremony to Richard, for the Newsletter. It is just the type of information that should go into the Newsletter, but which people do not tell us.

With regard to your family tree and Goddard enquiries:

According to my notes you had decided that the father of William Goddard who married Pamela Gooby, were George Goddard and Elizabeth Wigg of North Waltham who were married 4 Nov 1745.

You would not be able to get a birth certificate for Stephen born 1792 because they were not begun being issued until 1837, and were not compulsory for another 50 or so years. The only record you would find would be his baptism record in Silchester parish church register - if he was Church of England.

Secondly, George Goddard of Hawley; there were, and are, a great many Goddards in Hampshire. In the 1851 census George was living at home with his parents

- James Goddard aged 44 born Hawley
- Martha Goddard aged 43 born Windsor, Berkshire
- Jane Goddard aged 16 born Hawley
- Ellen Goddard aged 14 born Hawley
- George Goddard aged 12 born Hawley
- William Goddard aged 8 born Hawley
- Martha Goddard aged 6 born Hawley
- Emma Goddard aged 4 born Hawley

James had married Martha Giles at Hawley on 2 Sept 1828.

There were 79 Goddards living in the 1851 Hawley census area so I think that the family is firmly fixed in this area.

George as a hotelkeeper could have moved from town to town, but unless you have any firm evidence that he came from Oakley or Silchester, then I would not think it likely.

Regarding Charles Goddard the brewer of Salisbury. There are two **Charles Goddard** in Salisbury St Martins parish in the 1851 census

- Charles Goddard** aged 44 born Salisbury
 - Mary Ann Goddard aged 36 born Romsey, Hampshire
 - John aged 10 born Eling, Hampshire
- and

Charles N. Goddard aged 54, his wife Ann and at least five children.

Dear Mr Goddard,

I wondered if the following may be of interest. My research has shown that my 4x gt grandfather, Thomas GODDARD was the occupier and collector of tolls at 'Lenton St Turnpike House', Lenton St, ALTON, Hants from 1800 - 1809. I've recently been to Alton and the Turnpike House is still there, now a very attractive cottage (Flood Meadow Cottage)

Also, during research on a different line I noted the following from film nos RG4 4286/7 - Mile End Cemetery, Globe Rd, Mile End, Middx. - BURIALS

29 Nov 1835	Thomas GODDARD	54 yrs	- of Bonner St. Bethnal Green
28 Jan 1838	Michael "	34 yrs	- William St, Green St " "
25 May 1840	Edward "	39 yrs	- Grays Inn: Holborn
19 Jan 1851	Robt Henry "	16 yrs	- King St, Cambridge Rd: B/Green
1 Feb 1855	Charles "	63 yrs	- Games St, Mile End Old Town.

(none of above has any connection with my ancestors)

Dear Mr West,

John Goddard of Shrewsbury has passed on to me the letter in which you give some burials in Mile End Cemetery.

Thank you for these. They will go in the London file. We do have a copy of the CD of the Burial Index, but we have found that it isn't yet as comprehensive as one would wish.

I see that you have got a little further with your Alton ancestors. People could attend annual auctions and bid for the local tolls on a certain route. The successful bidders then installed tollgate keepers to collect the tolls on a day to day basis. The post of tollkeeper was not very popular as someone had to be on duty day and night and they had to have the personality and authority to challenge those - most people - who tried to claim that they were not liable to pay, or claimed that a lesser toll than was justified in their case. On the other hand, a cottage and a garden in which to grow food for the family went with the job. A Goddard had the tollgate at Halfway, between Newbury and Hungerford, for many years.

The GAE organisation is split up as follows: Richard Goddard of Malvern is chairman and editor of the Newsletter; John Goddard of Accrington and his wife Eileen deal with membership and secretarial work; John Goddard of Shrewsbury deals with money; my husband Brian Goddard writes the monographs and I keep the research records. Peter Goddard in Toronto is a professional genealogist and deals with records of Goddards roughly after 1850; the Research Co-ordination Dept (me) deals with records up to 1900. Unfortunately Richard has had to go into hospital for an operation on his back so we are not sure when he will be able to compile the next Newsletter.
