expressed that is to say As to my real estate Upon trust to permit my said Wife to reside in  
and occupy all or such part thereof as she may think proper and to receive the rents and  
profits of the same or such part thereof as she may not occupy for and during her natural life  
she keeping the buildings in tenantable repair and sufficiently insured in the names or name  
of the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of this my Will against loss or damage by fire  
And as to my personal estate Upon trust to permit my said Wife Sarah to have the absolute  
use and enjoyment of all or so much of my household goods furniture and effects as she may  
think proper during her life without being answerable for the wear and tear thereof or any damage  
thereof And to convert collect and get in the residue of my personal estate and receive the moneys  
to arise therefrom and invest such moneys in the names or name of the Trustees or Trustee for  
the time being of this my Will in the public funds of this Kingdom or at interest on private real  
security with power to vary such investments from time to time at discretion for any investments  
of a like nature and pay to or permit my said Wife to receive and take the whole of the  
dividends interest proceeds and annual incomes arising from the said investments for and  
during her life and to whom I give and bequeath the same for her own absolute benefit And  
after the decease of my said Wife I direct the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of this my  
Will to sell and dispose of my real estate by public auction or private contract together or in  
parts And I empower such Trustee or Trustee to buy in all or any of my real estate which
