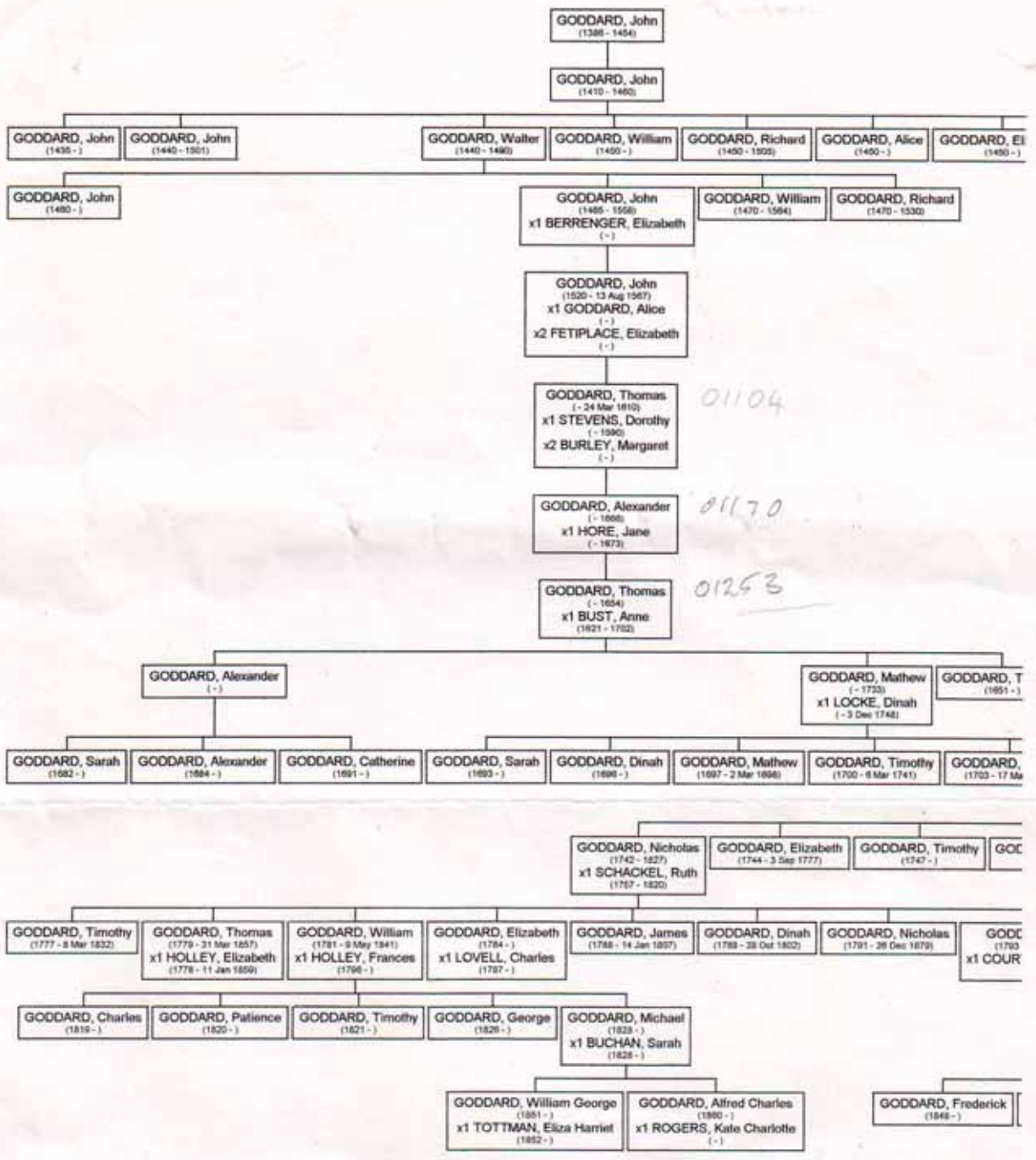

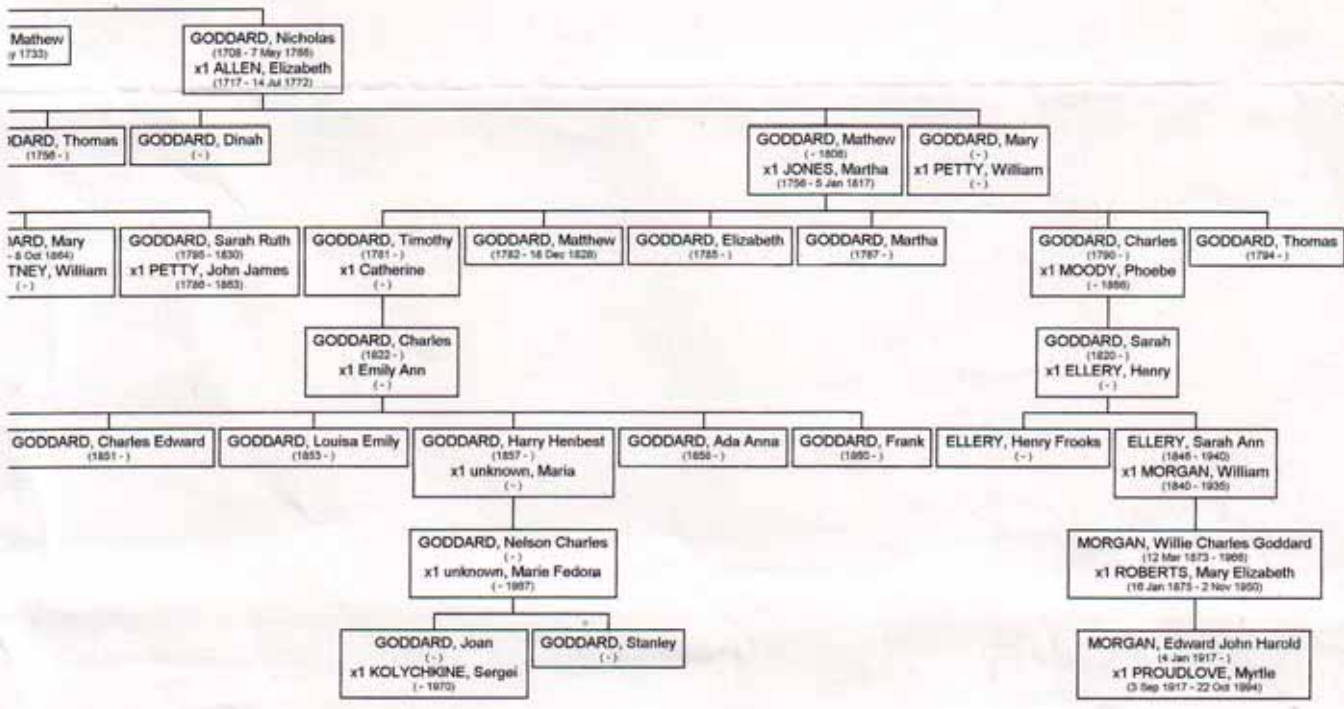

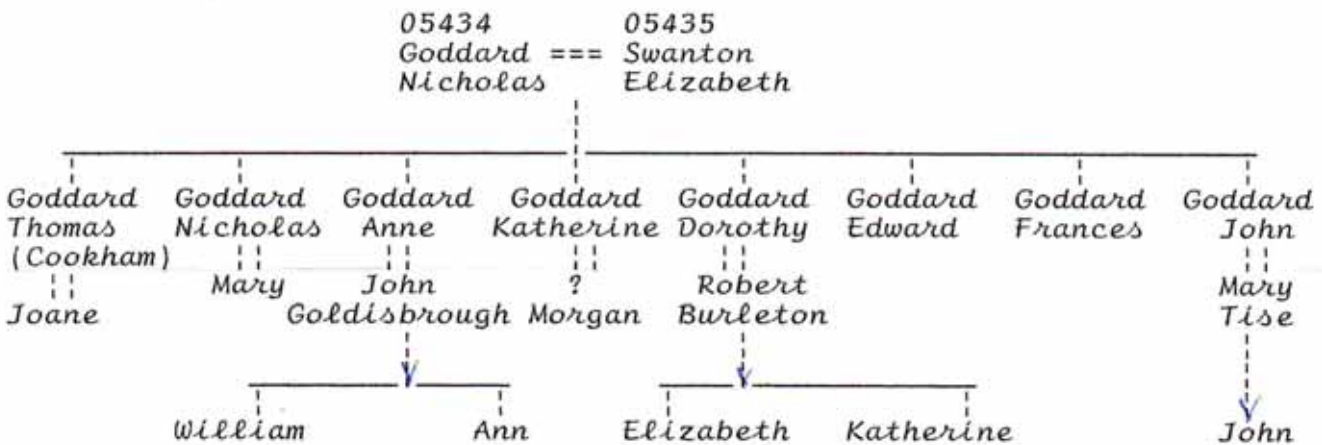

Dear Julie,

Many thanks for your letter of July 14, I am glad you found the cutting from S&D N&Q to be relevant. Following on from the extract from the will of Thomas Goddard of Cookham which you sent it seems to me that Nicholas Goddard (05434) and Elizabeth Swanton (05435) must have had two more children not listed on sheet F of the family tree, namely Thomas of Cookham and John who married Mary Tise.

As you may remember I became interested in the Goddards of Sedgemoor because they had a number of Nicholas's in the family and I thought that they might have some connection with my n*g.g. parents from Wellow in Hampshire and then when I found that Katherine Goddard had married a Morgan from Mere which was where my Morgan ancestors had lived for at least 250 years I became doubly interested.

I would suggest that the last two lines of sheet F might be altered to read-



The positions of Thomas and John in the tree are of course open to conjecture as I do not know their ages.

Good luck in your retirement! It is an excellent form of therapy and you will probably find yourself busier than ever. I took an early retirement in 1971 and I would recommend it to anybody who had some other interest to occupy their waking hours and I know you have.

Katherine Morgan's Will-proved Dec.1670

In the name of God Amen. I Katherine Morgan of Meere in the County of Wilts widdow being infirm of body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for it, do make and ordain my last will and Testament in manner and forme following. First I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave itt, hoping assuredly through the bluddy death & passion of Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sinns and my body comitt to the earth to bee buried in the parish Church of Meere aforesaid according to the discretion of my executrices hereafter named, only my body to bee interred as neere unto my Father and Mother, and the rest of my relations as conveniently may bee. And for my land and worldly goods wh. God hath been graciously pleased to bless me withall I do give and dispose of as ffolloweth. Item I do give unto the poore of Meere aforesd. ten shillings to be distributed at my funeral solemnity Item I do give to the Church of Meere likewise ten shillings. Item I do give unto the poore of the parish of St. Peters in the burrough of Shaston in the County of Dorsett ten shillings. Item I do give to the same parish Church ten shillings. Item I do give unto John Goddard the son of my brother Nicholas Goddard late deceased my best gold ring. Item I do give and bequeath unto John Morgan the son of my brother in law Thomas Morgan late deceased the sum of five pounds to be given unto him when he shall accomplish and come to the full age of twenty years. Item I do give unto my kindswoman Mes. Elizabeth Swanton daughter of John Swanton the sum of fifty pounds of good money of England to be paid unto her wth.in one year after my decease. Item I do likewise give unto my sd. kindswoman Meis. Elizabeth Swanton one featherbed, one feather boulstster and coverlet, one pair of blankets and one paire of sheets; Item I do give devise and bequeath unto my three sisters (that is to say) unto Dorothy Burleton wife of Robert Burleton of East Knoyle in the sayd County of Wilts gent, and to Ann Gouldisbrough wife of John Gouldisbrough of Meere aforesayd gent, and unto Meis. Frances Goddard spinster All my Lands Ten(ement)s and Hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever lying in the burrough of Shaston aforesd. or elsewhere in the County of Dorsett equally to be divided between them, To have and to hold all my Lands Ten(ement)s and Hereditaments as aforesayd with theirs and each of their appurtennaaces unto my sayd three sisters (equally to be divided between them) and to their respective Heirs for ever; And all other of my goods and chattles whatsoever and wheresoever not before bequeathed I do likewise give and bequeath unto my sayd three sisters equally to be divided betweene them, whom I do likewise ordain and appoynt to be joynt executrices of this my last will and testament. And I do desire my very loving kinsman William Swanton of the City of New Sarum in the County of Wilts Esq, John Frowd of Sedghill in the County of Wilts yeoman and Edward Tice of Hindon in the sayd County of Wilts Chandler to be my overseers to see this my last will and testament carefully performed; Lastly I do appoynt that if it should so happen that any discord or variance arise att any time hereafter between my executrices about the true intent and meaning of anything contayned in this my last will and testament my will is that my overseers beforenamed shall order, end,(?) and determine the same. In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal the nyneteenth day of February in the two and twentieth year of the Reign of our most gracious sovereign Lord Charles the second by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France, and Ireland King defender of the faith & Anno Dom 1669. / Katherine Morgan

Herewith list of Thomas Goddard's descendants as promised. All the dates that I have researched have come from the IGI or a transcription of the Wellow register by a lawyer son of a former parson at the end of the last century, I forget his name but his work seemed very thorough.

In addition of course some was done by Peter Morrall and some by Anne Offor who were both working on their own behalf and with the exception of the Henry I don't have any doubts.

There are a few names here which are not on the original list but it will be pretty obvious where they go. All are from Wellow.

There are two wills I would like to have a look at from R.W.K. Goddard's collection, one is Thomas Goddard's of Standen Hussey, 1610 which we were talking about last night which is on page 4; and the other is Francis Goddard's, haberdasher 1642 which is on page 14. Do you think you could let me have copies of them?

Alfred Charles Goddard died at Acton
in 1926 at the age of 63 but I have
been unable to trace his burial at
St Catharines House. However,
according to the I. & S. a boy was baptised
on 14.9.1863 at St Pancras to James
a many Goddard and I believe he
may prove to be my g. grandfather.
More research is needed to prove this
link and as I am not able to get to
London too often it may take some time
to establish this point. The father's name
also ties in with that on A. C. Goddard's
marriage certificate, and there do not
appear to be many Goddards at
St Catharines house named Alfred Charles.

My grandmother had two sisters and five brothers, most of whom I knew as a child but, as yet, I have no birth dates. Attached is a small plan of the family so far.

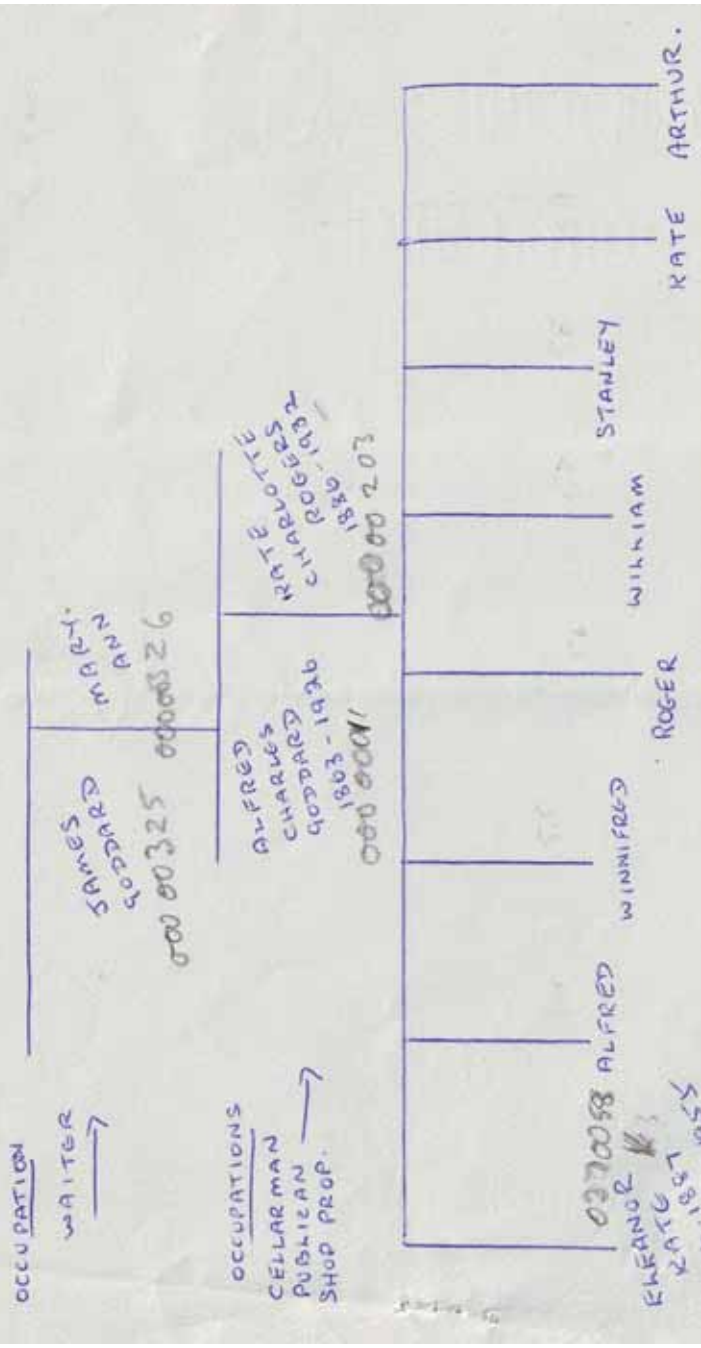
I shall definitely be joining the Goddard Association and will drop a note and cheque to John Goddard in Shrewsbury.
