Dear Mrs Bush,

Thank you for your further letter.

As research co-ordinators Brian, my husband, and I keep records of any Goddards born before 1900. We started off enthusiastically and in the beginning kept notes of everything, but now are being more realistic and keeping large family trees (which Brian is indexing for the computer) and keeping a record of the names of people who have further details. When we get a letter from someone who seems to be related to someone from whom we have heard earlier, we put them in touch.

Edward Morgan is regularly in touch with us and we hope that he will soon provide us with a large family tree. Could you do the same? Although you are familiar with all the names and places, it is far clearer for us to see.

I think that Peter Goddard in Canada would be more interested in the Catholic family records than my husband as it is his direct descent not Brians - though Peter is still not convinced that he and Brian are related.

You seem to have done so much work on your Goddard family that I hope that there is someone else in your family who is interested and who would take over if you were unable to do it. All the collected Goddard Association records would go into the Wiltshire Archaeological and Historical Society Library in Devizes Museum should the association founder at any point.

Thank you for the stamped addressed envelope,, but we reckon that having paid a subscription you should get your postage and a reasonable amount of research done for nothing.

Dear Julie,

Thank you for the print-out of the Matthews' Nicholases. I would like to know more about Nicholas 3rd, and the Champagne Nicholases (1336, 3183, 4880, 4891, 3196, 4879, 8203; in particular parents, wives and relatives. Reports back to Thomas of Canterbury Manor again; I felt it was very odd that a landowner should leave London and go to live in the Styx to speak withers possibly he had local connections and on re-examining Arthur Hill's letter of 1917 he is accepting a connection with Richard and Cecily Goddard.

I presume this refers to Richard of Fole who made a will in 1593 with an amendment in 1569 & proved by Thomas Goddard in 1572

In 1- his wife is named as Cecile
and their daughter Sara is about
to marry Thomas Goddard who has
received a nice dowry.

Richard also left money for
repairing churches including Tolland
church so presumably he had
connections with the Goddards of
Tolland; and Henry G. of Dighton
(will 1677) who seems to be the son
of Thomas of Canterbury. Names refers
to his cousin William Goddard of
Tolland in his will.

I think this is worth noting;
as is also the fact that John
Goddard of Fole (will ~~1582~~ 1582/3)
lives in will John the son of
John G of Sedgville (will 1555)
in their co-relations. I will
explain this in another letter if
you are still interested.

I have requested a print out
of Goddard will in the Karpis file
R.D. again and hopefully they
will come this time, the archival
I spoke to was surprised they
hadn't come.

Keep up the good work.

You are brilliant! If I had had time to read through the wills I ought to have spotted Richard and Cicely. Brian says -as he is at present working on verifying the Goddards of Castle Eaton's tree- that he also would like to find the connection between the Castle Eaton, Sedghill, Upton Noble and Poole Goddards. [The Upton Noble Goddards were a branch of the Ingleham (North Wilts) family]. I would dearly like to join with you in the chase for the connection between the various Goddard branches and possibly slotting in Brian's peasant stock ones, but I have to face it that I cannot do everything. At present I am dealing with Goddard letters from NZ, Derbyshire and Berkshire, writing two articles for commercial gain, working three days a week and keeping house for the family and doing a voluntary job which I has possibilities of developing into paid work. Despite all these moans I am really interested in what you are finding and please do consult us for anything in which we might be able to help from the collection of records which we have here, or even make an appointment to come and look at them.

There are no other members researching Hampshire Goddards, except David Goddard (address 33 Atwood Avenue, Kew, Surrey) who is interested in the descendants of Holland Goddard and concentrates of the Cove area.

Here is the latest information that I have about the Bramshaw descendants:-

Joan Goddard died Aug 22 2005; her husband was Sergei Kolychikine who died about 1970, his family fled from Russia to Belgium in 1917; he was a captain in the Free Russian Army in WWII. Joan had finished her education in Belgium.

Joan and Sergei had a son who died 1967 as a result of a road traffic accident in Brussels, and three daughters who all married. One lives in Belgium, one in Canada, and one in London.

Joan had a brother Stanley *1844 MARSON 1915* who was a pilot in the RAF and who was killed in action in Italy. *05/03/1943 MINTURN O*

16 IN 1901 GOAN DORRISWOT
Joan's father Nelson Charles G.(6676) was a civil servant; he was transferred to Belfast and died there during WWII.

His uncle Arthur C.G.(6662) was a banker's clerk in Andover in the 1881 census.

Another uncle Charles Edward G.(6660) was a solicitor's clerk in Southampton in 1881.

Harry Henbest G.(6663) was a clerk (ironmonger) in Aldershot in 1881. *BURNERS CLERK*

I hope this fills in a few more gaps. *1901*
