

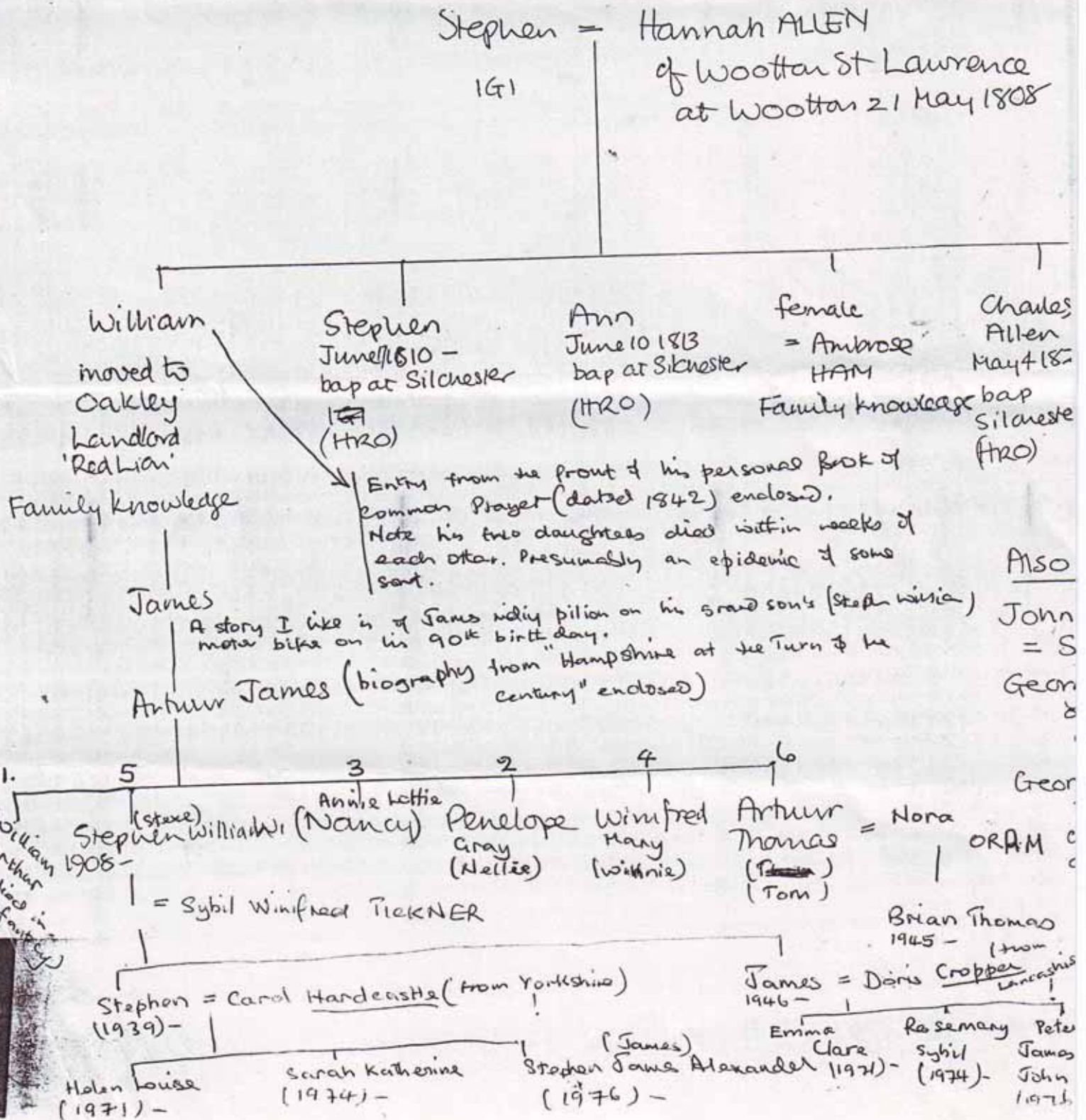

French.—FREDERICK EDWARD FRENCH, St. Cuthbert's, 69, Victoria Road North, Southsea; son of the late Stephen French, of Stanstead, Suffolk; born at Stanstead, March 16th, 1852; educated at Long Melford, Suffolk. In business as a leather merchant at Portsmouth since 1876; formerly member for six years of the Portsmouth Town Council; member of the late School Board for three years; Guardian of the Poor for thirteen years, and Chairman during the time the foundation stone of the New Infirmary was laid; Director of Messrs. Curtiss and Sons, Ltd.; member of the United Brothers Lodge of Freemasons, No. 1069; Chairman of the Southsea Conservative Club; Churchwarden at St. Luke's Church, Southsea, and Manager of St. Luke's National School. Married Eliza, daughter of the late John Mingay, of Bury St. Edmunds. Clubs: County, Portsmouth; Junior Conservative, London.



Mr. John William Gieve, J.P.

Gieve.—JOHN WILLIAM GIEVE, J.P., 7, Outram Road, Southsea; son of the late James Gieve, J.P., of Portsmouth; born at Portsmouth, June 19th, 1855; educated locally at Mr. Jeremiah Andrews' School. Director of Messrs. Gieve and Sons, Ltd., naval and military outfitters, Portsmouth, London and Devonport; Justice of the Peace for the borough; formerly Chairman of The Beneficial Society's School, Portsea; Past Master of the Lodge of Harmony, No. 309, and the Hampshire Lodge of Emulation, No. 1990; member of the Richard Eve Lodge, London, and the Ambleside Lodge, Westmoreland; Provincial Grand Treasurer for Hampshire and the Isle of Wight since 1888; Chairman of the Southern Division of the Portsmouth Conservative Association; Chairman for some years of the Portsmouth Working Men's Conservative Club, Arundel Street. Clubs: Junior Constitutional, London; Portsmouth County Club, Southsea.

Goddard.—ARTHUR JAMES GODDARD, Heathercote, Silchester; son of James Goddard; born at Silchester, in 1868; educated locally. Represents the *Hants and Berks Gazette*, the *Reading Mercury*, *Newbury Weekly News*, and *Hampshire Observer*; Churchwarden and School Manager, appointed by the Educational Committee of the County Council; takes an interest in all affairs relating to the parish; Secretary of the Silchester Cricket Club for over twenty years. Married, in 1898, Lottie Priest, daughter of William Turner Gray, of Cookham, Berks, and has issue three daughters.

GODDARD, Annie Elizabeth died 16 Sept 1897 at her home, Greenmeadows in her 35th year after a long and painful illness. Wife of Charles GODDARD, eldest daughter of late William STORKEY. Buried Napier Cemetery. - Daily Telegraph 16 Sept 1897.

GODDARD, Arthur born Napier died 4 Aug 1878 age 1 year son of Robert and Louisa GODDARD nee ROWE, buried Napier - Napier Courthouse Death Register. Also Newspaper age 1 year 5 months, son of James? White Road, Napier.

GODDARD, Clement V. married Elsie E. GRAY on 8 April 1925 at Knox Church, Dunedin by Rev. Tulloch Yuille. Parents Charles H. GODDARD & Hilda G. GODDARD, William GRAY and Elizabeth GRAY - Daily Telegraph 6 April 1985

GODDARD, Clifford died 5 June 1904 age 6 weeks of Napier - Register of Interments Old Napier Cemetery.

GODDARD, James Robert died at Napier 23 May 1877 age 58 years - Newspaper Courthouse Register - Robert GODDARD, Greengrocer age 40 years Coroners report.

GODDARD, James Robert son of James Robert GODDARD died 11 May 1878 age 18 years. - Newspaper. Courthouse Death Register - Robert Stephen GODDARD, born Deptford, Kent, England, Labourer age 18 years died 11 May 1878 son of James Robert and Louisa GODDARD nee ROWE, buried Napier. In NZ 4 years.

GODDARD, John died 23 March 1911 age 68 years, Charlotte GODDARD wife of above died 1 March 1933 aged 81 years. ALSO Mabel GODDARD died 18 May 1892 age 10 days. ALSO 2nd son of above Douglas killed in action, France 26 Nov 1916 at Armentiers age 27 years. (Verse) - Havelock North Cemetery Section D Row 1

There is a Will probated in the Napier High Court for John GODDARD which you can get from National Archives Wellington. This will give you the family perhaps. Probate was granted 3 May 1911 and there is a Will in the Napier Probate Register at Wellington.

* HAWKE'S BAY TRIBUNE 24 March 1911.

An old and highly respected resident of Hawke's Bay in the person of Mr John GODDARD passed away at his residence at Havelock (North) last evening at the age of 68 years. Deceased had been suffering for some time, and the end was not totally unexpected. Mr Goddard has remained in the district for a period of some forty years, and for a considerable time was

proprietor of the well known Havelock (North) Nurseries. He was a prominent member of the Oddfellows Lodge. Mr GODDARD leaves a widow and grown up family. The interment takes place at Havelock (North) tomorrow afternoon.

GODDARD, at Havelock (North) on 23 march 1911, John husband of Charlotte GODDARD, age 68 years. The funeral will leave his late residence for the Havelock (North) cemetery on Saturday at 2pm. S. T. Tong, Undertaker.

THE HAWKE'S BAY HERALD 2 March 1933

With the passing of Mrs C. GODDARD, one of Hawke's Bay early settlers has crossed over the great divide, Mrs Goddard arrived in Napier in 1875 with her parents. Her husband, the late Mr John GODDARD, was one of the first nurseryman in Hawke's Bay and commenced business at Havelock North. Mrs GODDARD is survived by two brothers and three sisters. There are three children - Mr Victor GODDARD & Mrs T. INGHAM of Auckland; and Mrs H. C. THOMPSON of Napier. One son Mr Douglas GODDARD, paid the supreme sacrifice in France during the Great War.

The person listed at the top of the page will be a descendant or an in-law. I have checked the 1991 Electoral Roll for Howick and the 1991 Telephone book and she is listed under R M & P N INGHAM, 13b Takutai Avenue, Howick, phone (9) 534 3838. (You will need to check if there is an updated number)

I have included all information on the surname GODDARD although they will not be related to John and his family but I thought you may like to have this.

Sorry to have taken a while to answer your letter but it arrived at a busy time for me and getting to the Newspaper can only be accomplished when the archivist is available when both of us can fit it in.

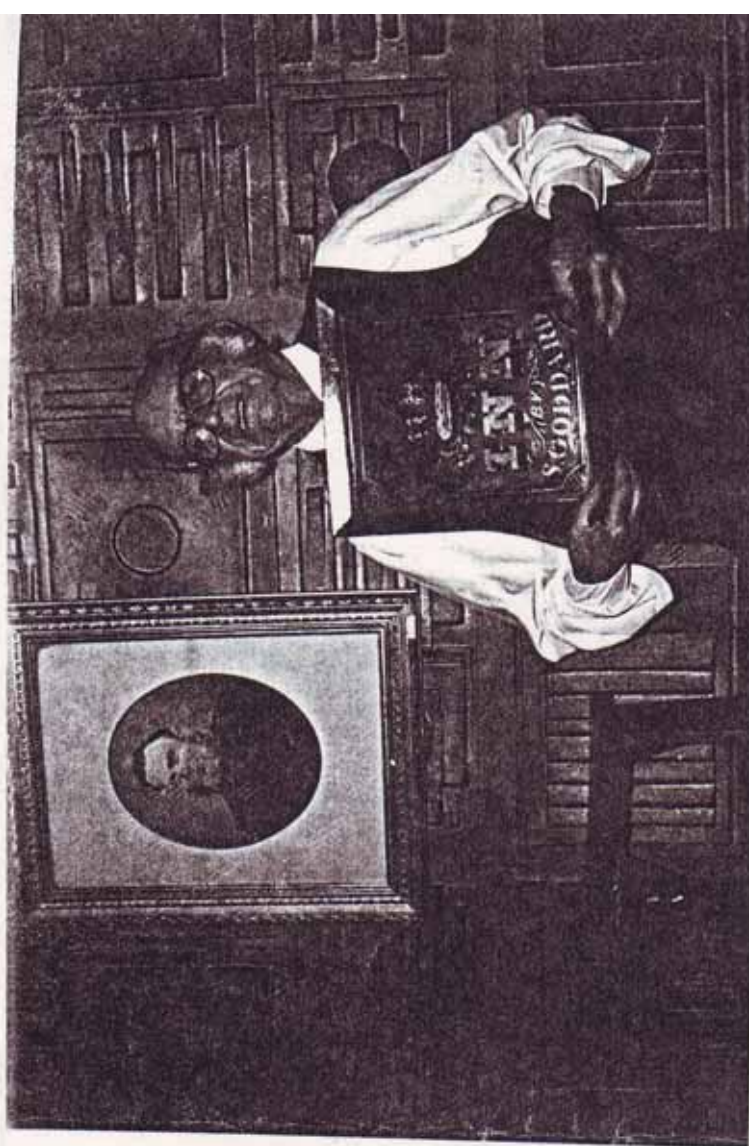
