Dear Margaret and Harry,

I have received your letter with enquiries about the Silchester Goddards.

I am afraid that I do not know any more about your branch of the family than that which I told Pat Bisset when she visited us a year or two ago. She left with a large family tree over which we worked nearly all afternoon I seem to remember. The Goddard builders of Silchester were the descendants of William Goddard who was James Robert's eldest brother. The present day representative is Stephen Goddard of Buckhurst Hill in Essex whom Pat met while she was over here.

I advertised in the Hampshire Family History Society's magazine for descendants of Evangelista Sarah, Louisa Ann and William Robert Goddard and had no reply. I am sure that I wrote to one of your family and told you this at the time. I will pass on your request to Richard Goddard, who writes the Newsletter, for a mention in the "Can you help?" column. However, the Newsletter only reaches 250 people; why not pay for an advertisement in the *Family Tree Magazine* which is seen worldwide by over 30,000 people. I am sure that you will find a copy in your local family history research centre where the advertising rates are displayed. If you have any difficulty ask your local representative, Julie Goddard in Christchurch to advise you. Or are any of you on the Internet? You can reach millions of people through that I am told.

On your behalf I looked through the 1881 census of England for Evangelista (whom I am sure was called either Eva or Sarah at home), Louisa and William. I found three possibilities, but on closer examination none of them seemed likely.

Yorkshire, Normanby in Mi...

William Goddard aged 30 Bricklayers Labourer born Middlesex, Twickenham he had a wife, born in Surrey and two sons, Archibold,(8) born in Twickenham & Isaac, (2) born in South Bank, Yorkshire. It therefor appears that he has only recently gone to Yorkshire, not having lived there almost all his life.

Surrey, Deptford St Pauls

William Goddard aged 31 a draper, born in Croydon, Surrey
The place is correct if James Robert had left the three eldest children behind with relatives, but then I found that William's elderly father lived with him and his name was William also.

Kent, Frindsbury

William Goddard aged 31 a butler on a visit
He was born in Middlesex in London. The occupation does not seem right for the son of a carpenter.

I found no Evangelista at all and no Louisa who was single and the right age.

I would suggest that you have a family conference on one of your nice sunny summer days over Christmas and all catch up with the family tree as it is at present. We have been having mild, wet weather up till now, but Christmas is in sight and frost and snow is forecast for the next few weeks.
