Dear Pat,

Thank you for your letter.

I have passed on your story about the three Goddards at the graduation ceremony to Richard, for the Newsletter. It is just the type of information that should go into the Newsletter, but which people do not tell us.

With regard to your family tree and Goddard enquiries:

According to my notes you had decided that the father of William Goddard who married Pamela Gooby, were George Goddard and Elizabeth Wigg of North Waltham who were married 4 Nov 1745.

You would not be able to get a birth certificate for Stephen born 1792 because they were not begun being issued until 1837, and were not compulsory for another 50 or so years. The only record you would find would be his baptism record in Silchester parish church register - if he was Church of England.

Secondly, George Goddard of Hawley; there were, and are, a great many Goddards in Hampshire. In the 1851 census George was living at home with his parents

James Goddard aged 44 born Hawley  
Martha Goddard aged 43 born Windsor, Berkshire  
Jane Goddard aged 16 born Hawley  
Ellen Goddard aged 14 born Hawley  
George Goddard aged 12 born Hawley  
William Goddard aged 8 born Hawley  
Martha Goddard aged 6 born Hawley  
Emma Goddard aged 4 born Hawley

James had married Martha Giles at Hawley on 2 Sept 1828.

There were 79 Goddards living in the 1851 Hawley census area so I think that the family is firmly fixed in this area.

George as a hotelkeeper could have moved from town to town, but unless you have any firm evidence that he came from Oakley or Silchester, then I would not think it likely.

Regarding Charles Goddard the brewer of Salisbury. There are two **Charles Goddard** in Salisbury St Martins parish in the 1851 census

**Charles Goddard** aged 44 born Salisbury  
Mary Ann Goddard aged 36 born Romsey, Hampshire  
John aged 10 born Eling, Hampshire  
and

**Charles N. Goddard** aged 54, his wife Ann and at least five children.

No mention of a Thomas in either family. Looking in detail at the 1851 census of Salisbury would tell which Charles you enquirer was looking for as it would show the occupation - which I do not have in my notes.

SILCHESTER

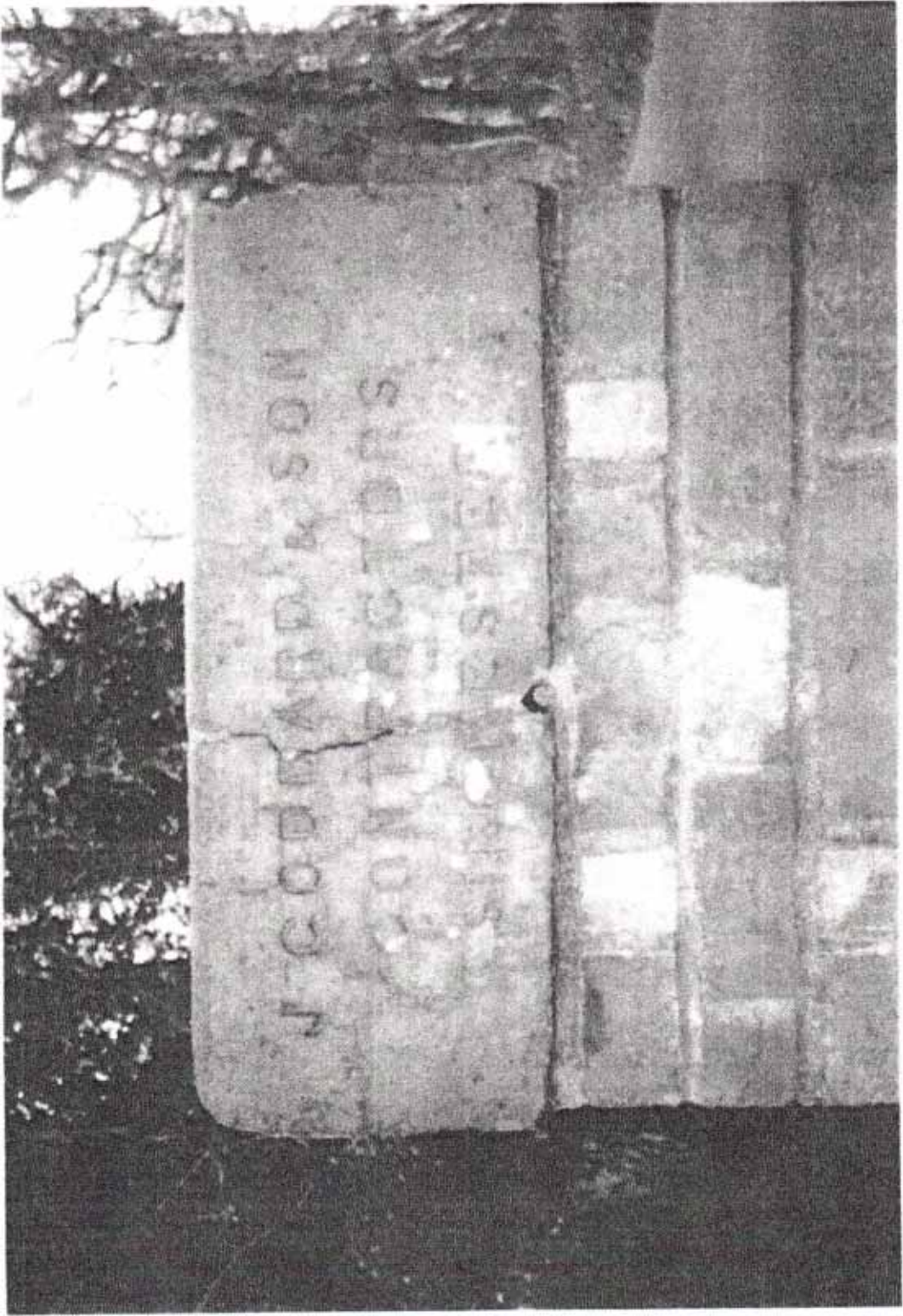

 Long time no contact! Have stopped gardening, real cold wind - & back to some paper work. Couple families I would like some info on if possible. Both are connected to me - even a bit tenuously. One more to my sister. The other family's <sup>is also</sup> stories have them connected to my Hampshire lot. but I haven't found any in the 191.  
 , Supposedly 2nd cousin to my Grandfather (George Robert) which means he is cousin to my Gt. " " James Robert, Silchester. Only names I found was a Herbert John born to Will & Jane 27/3/1864 Hawley. No good. Other was a death - Herbert G. d. 10mth. 5/4/1870 Silchester. Maybe - the names I have - -

Wallace came to N2 sometime before his 1st marr. in 1895. He worked as a railway worker then he seems to become a cleaner / manufacturer. - died 15/5/1942. I have his family born in N2. Actually Margaret of Cambridge (Harry) was the one to get the information together but we never got any further. It might ring a bell or two with what you have on the computer there. The other family, Charles, is also a long shot. Rene would be really pleased to find out if we are connected but I doubt it. There was a brother Charles <sup>b 1820</sup> - brother to my James Robert. - Charles Allen b 1820 - 4th May - he also was a brewer "that is a long shot". Cant see him going all the way to Salisbury. My brother Bob has worked out that Stephen of Silchester b. 1782 @ Cakley - his parents were William <sup>1743</sup> & Pamela <sup>1746</sup> nee Goolby & Williams parents Richard & Sarah nie. 1742. also all Cakley. Any way of checking this. Would it be possible to see or get birth certificate for Stephen? What do you have on the computer

for the Silchester family? I had an enquiry from Alberta re John & George Norman. not so long ago. Seems the two came to NZ in 1875 from the Jersey Isles, went to Napier & George eventually married Mary daughter of James Robert my Great Grandfather.

Jim of Addelstone sent me a copy of C D Rom (get it right) on Silchester Goddards which I have really enjoyed. Got most of it printed out as don't have a computer. Has some interesting stories of the older family also photos. I asked Stephen (Buckhurst) ~~to~~ about Roe Cottage, Silchester. Was the cottage James R. stayed in whilst doing his apprentice with Uncle Thomas 1839. Stephen remembered it from his young days. Alas when he went to Silchester to photograph it he discovered it had burnt down several months before. He did manage 2 photos from somewhere for which I was really grateful. We must have driven past it at least twice on our previous visits to the village! & didn't think about it.

I see Stephen has given me the address of the present owner & he is interested in the history of it so that will be another letter to do!

We moved over the hill from Whangamata last Dec. for several reasons. Have found a slightly bigger house, has a much bigger garden, has small town which I can walk to & believe it or not its quieter! Whanga had continuous logging trucks going through passed our gate, full & empty! the price of living where there masses of pine trees! Anyhow I can now spread my wings in garden, splash about in the swim pool & sleep peacefully at night! The garden was very overgrown & we have had a few busy days to get it straight. & a few bon fires. There is still heaps to do but is looking so much better. Some very nice friendly neighbours too.

Not doing quite so much pottery now of course but have done enough to participate in 3 more 'fairs' before Xmas. We are off to Bridgman on the 28th to visit my daughter there & my sister up in Harvey Bay. maybe see a whale this time! 21/6/00 My eldest daughter Jane, graduated ~~a~~ Bachelor of Education on 19/4/00 in Hamilton - after 8 years study along with bringing up two children - youngest a small baby - by herself. She has been teaching now for 4 years. On walking into the large

hall for ceremony who should I bump into but Frank & family from Retouva - his grandson also graduating! Also another lass that had done <sup>some of</sup> her training in James school. So we have 3 Geddards entering the world of teaching - graduating

Gene Bisset - Bachelor of teaching

Karl Nicholas Geddard - Bachelor of Education

Michelle Lewis " - Diploma of Teaching (Graduate) one year program.

Gene had asked Michelle re her family history but as there was a split family she didn't seem to know. Father away somewhere dx & mother not approachable. Was a lovely day & quite a ceremony - very colourful with the dignitaries gowns/robes glowing in the lights.

Well I seem to have run out of news! Is cooler today, overcast sky - not rain, just grey. Got lots done yesterday in the garden - was lovely sunny day so took chance of more garden work. Guess could say good winter so far!

# SEARCHERS

**David Pike, 391 Phillip Murray Ave, Oshawa, Ontario, Canada, L1J 1H1 :**

On 9 November 1825, Charles PARKER, of Milton, Hampshire, married Jane SPRAGG. Their marriage took place in the parish of St. Paul's Anglican Church, Trinity, Trinity Bay, Newfoundland. One of the witnesses to their marriage was my ancestor Samuel HOBBS, who was born in Ditcheat, Somerset in 1793. Samuel also settled in Newfoundland where he married in 1823. I would like to contact anybody interested in researching the PARKER family of Milton, in the hope that I might learn the details of Charles' voyage to Newfoundland. It is my speculation that Charles and Samuel may have sailed to Newfoundland on the same vessel.

Any information on the former Union Castle Line e.g. where records are kept, were they taken over by another shipping line?

JEFFERY George (born circa 1912) married Lucine, of French nationality, and lived at Southampton in 1950s. He was a Union Castle steward.

ADHIMAR - any in London/Wroxham, Norfolk. When did Frank and Annie marry, and where? Their son, Eric, died at Acton, London, around 1978 probably in his 60s or early 70s. Where was Eric born? He married Joy ELLERY pre 1939 possibly in Ryde, Isle of Wight. The name ADHIMAR is thought to originate in Southern France but there used to be a Turkish village of the name. Bishop ADHIMAR of Puy was a Crusader.

OHARA - Bridget and John married Preston, Lancs, about 1850 but no trace found on 1851 census - born Ireland, place unknown. Copy marriage certificate is unclear - Bridget's maiden name could be FRANCOY or FRANEY.

DARE - Isabella, known as "Bella". Lived at Uphaven nr Swindon 1950s and had a son who was a Jockey. Bella was son of my husband's grandmother, Mary Anne ATTRILL (nee McMINN) born after 1880. She also had a daughter. Any information on DARE descendants and their whereabouts now will be welcomed.

I am stuck in 1771 and getting desperate to find further information on my grandparents x6. Thomas SHEPPARD married Hannah HOWARD at Kimpton in Nov 1771. They had at least one son, Charles (bn 1772), who was my grandfather x5. I have been unable to trace any more children. I would particularly like to find the parents of Thomas - the family appear to have lived in Kimpton and Ampot, but although I have discovered lots of SHEPPARDS, none match up with Thomas.

I would also be interested to receive information on any SHEPPARD with the christian name Harvey, which appears in quite a few generations up to the mid-1800s. I would like to know where it originated in the family.

I trying to help Pat Bisset, nee Goddard, of New Zealand has been over in this country trying to find descendants of her great grandfathers brothers and sisters. Great grandfather James Robert GODDARD, a carpenter of Silchester, moved to Marylebone, then Doncaster, then Deptford before emigrating to NZ in 1874. He took his second wife and their children, but left behind William (born 1850) and his sisters Evangelist/Evangeline Sarah (1853) and Louisa Ann (1855) who could have returned to Hants. James Robert Goddard's sister Caroline married Ambrose HAM and the family wonder if any Ham descendants (the names Ambrose and Joel run through the family) are members of the Society. Likewise are there any members of the ALLEN or ALLAN family and the GOOBY family, both of Wootton St Lawrence, who also married into this Goddard family whose graves fill a corner of Silchester churchyard.

Seeking information on Sarah and George WILTSHIRE. Sarah MAFFEY (b.1813 at Lockerley) married 1839 at Southampton, George WILTSHIRE (b. 1815 at Millbrook). George was a coachman, then railway clerk and later a tenant farmer on the estate of Lady MILLS of Millbrook. Children included; Sarah b 1841; Georgina b 1843; Anne b 1847; and Edward b 1850s.

Searching for VENTHAM (all spellings). Trades were bricklayers and agricultural labourers. My tree is from 1764 onwards but I need help in tracing further back. Also trying to get in touch with David James VENTHAM b. Brentford, married Caroline in 1983 (stockbroker) living in Ealing, London, 1981.

In the Nov 1992 HFH I appealed for info on "Brickness Mill". I am pleased to report that it has been located! It appears that the Salford census enumerator wrote Brickness in mistake for Brockness - which is a shortened version of Brockenhurst.

The baptismal entries of 2 of 4 children of Thomas ELLERY (miller) appear in the Brockenhurst registers: John Barnes ELLERY (b 1827) and Jane ELLERY (1828). Thomas ran Brockenhurst Mill.

Baptisms are still sought for two older children: Thomas (b 1823) and Nicholas John (b 1825) both of which may, hopefully, be found in the New Forest area.
