I do not have Thomas Goddards details other than knowledge of his name on my grandparents marriage certificate (copy enclosed).

Their information on an Albert and Rose Goddard of similar birth dates is not consistent with the information provided by my Aunt Rose, as entered on my family tree (copy enclosed).

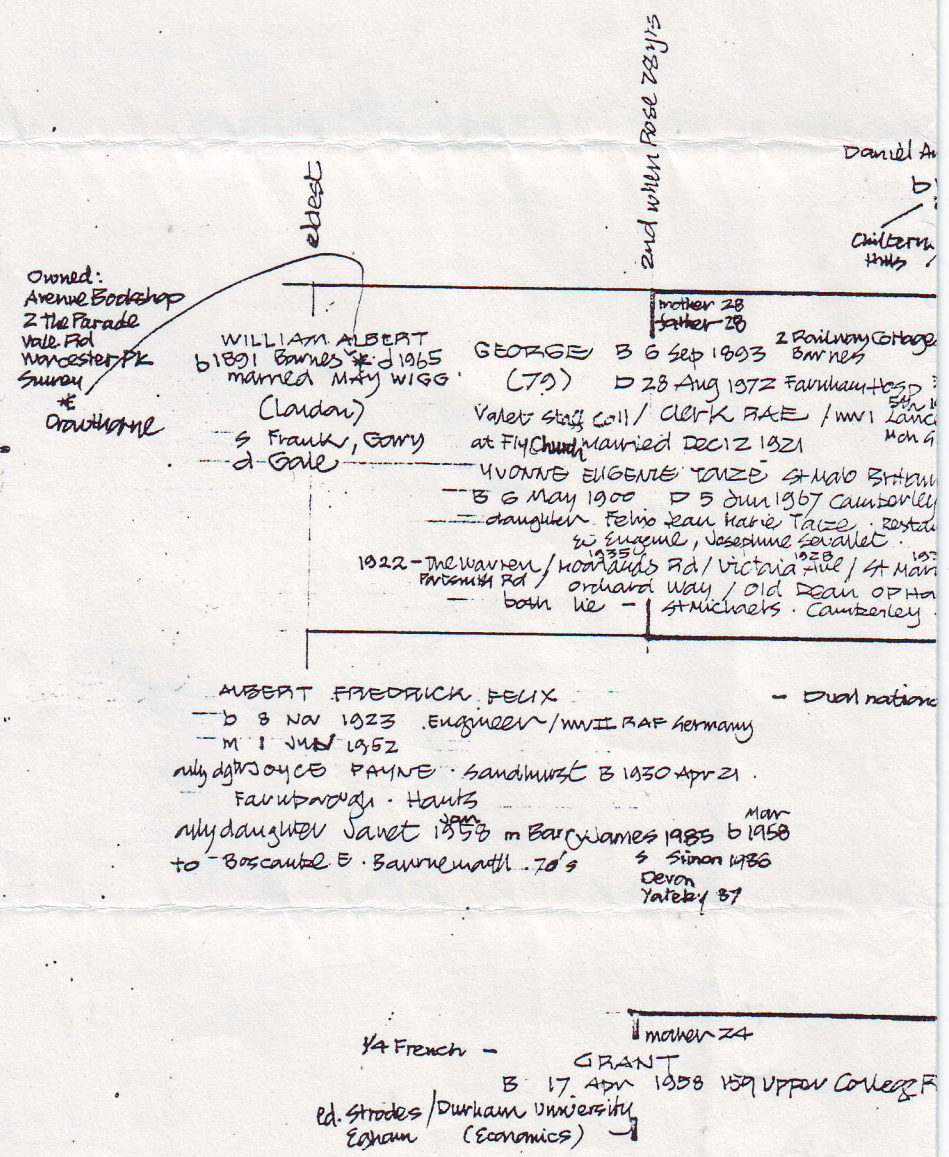
My enquiry is prompted by the current Newsletter advising that enquirors of some time ago should try again !

Brian, sorry for the delay in replying but I have been out of the country.

My family, as far as I am aware, has little or nothing to do with Finchamstead. Rather they all came from along the Blackwater valley encompassing Yateley, Hawley, Frimley, Yorktown, Cove and Farnborough.

I am not sure that I can throw much light on your query but do have some of observations.

- First I agree with you that a Thomas Goddard married Sarah Reynolds at St. Peter's, Yateley on June 9 1762. witnessed by Richard Brown and John Reynolds.
- I have assumed this Thomas to be the son of **John** Goddard and **Ann** Smither who was baptised at Yateley in 1741.
- As you note there appears not to have been any issue from this union (whichever Thomas it was) until a son, John, was baptised at St. Peter's, Farnborough, in October 1769, followed by James (1772), Arthur (1774) George (1777), Benjamin (1783) and Ann (1784) all baptised at Yateley.
- John, the first born son, I have assumed to be named after his grandfather, in line with the previous four generations going back to John of Cove (1647-1692) and the first born daughter after her grandmother. A speculation.
- Another Thomas Goddard, a farmer, married Mary Priseman at St. Peter's in February 1765 and (perhaps significantly) one of the witnesses was Ann Goddard and the other was Thomas Evans. Thomas Goddard, son of John & Ann, had both a mother and a sister called Ann.
- The issue from this union were, in order, Mary (Dec 1765), Thomas (May 1767) and Elizabeth (Dec 1770) which would support your thesis on family names.
- To recap. Whoever the first Thomas was who married Sarah Reynolds they was a 7 year gap before starting a family.
- An additional problem is that St. Peter's, Yateley, baptism records only show one Thomas (son of John & Ann) baptised there between 1700 and 1767. The other Thomas may have been the son of John Goddard & Sarah (maiden name unknown) baptised at St. Peter's, Farnborough in 1734 or 1737, or from elsewhere although resident within St. Peter's, Yateley in either 1762 or 1765.

Not a lot of help I am afraid.

Brian some more information for you to cogitate over.

I am attaching two versions of the descendents of Holland Goddard. Version 'A' has Thomas Goddard, son of John & Ann(nee Smithers) marrying Sarah Reynolds. Version 'B' has Thomas, son of John & Sarah, marrying her. Version 'B' also speculates that Nicholas Goddard (about 1625-1666) who married Mary Thair was the son of Phillip of Cove/Hawley who may well have been a brother of Holland who was buried 30.04.1626 at St. Peter's, Farnborough. If they were brothers it's likely that their father was Holland Goddard. Version 'B' posits that my family are in fact descendents of Nicholas - John 1658, John 1693, Thomas 1737, James 1772, Thomas 1801, William 1838, Edwin 1881 and William 1912. Looking at Version 'B' the recurrence of the 'Arthur' also strikes me as significant as a family name- 1699, 1732, 1774, 1845 and 1863. Version 'B' also places the family firmly in Cove and Hawley that also ties in with available records.

Unless one of the 'Thomas's' who married Sarah Reynolds and Mary Priseman came from another parish e.g. Finchampstead, Ash or elsewhere, my scenario would make sense for the Cove, Hawley, Farnborough, Yateley area.

Thanks for your latest input - you have confirmed a little more information on the earlier generations. I have left them to concentrate on those around 1850 and where their detail is in the Berks Record Office, for the time being as I have come to the conclusion that some time will have to be spent in the Surrey Record Office to collect the detail on the early Farnborough side. The trouble with that area is that the Guildford lot were just as prolific and as fugal with their names making splitting the families exceedingly difficult. But after Christmas I must try to get over there to gather some of the Farnborough parish details.

Of course the real problem arises from the fact that there are 52 parishes and 3 counties within a 10 mile radius of Yateley and the Goddards about here were always on cross-border forages!

I hope to send out draft trees for comment early in the New Year, but I doubt if they will contain any further information on the earlier roots than you already have.

> I'm descended from a William Goddard (born 1848, christened in Yately,
> Hampshire) and am interested in tracing my ancestry back and out to
> other cousins. After noticing a mention of your association on a
> bulletin board on the Genes Connected website, I thought I'd write to
> see what assistance you can offer in helping me.

>

> For reference, my William Goddard joined the Royal Artillery and was
> stationed in Malta during the 1870s. He returned to the UK in the
> early 1880s and worked at Broadmoor as an attendant for a number of
> years. While there, he married Elizabeth Hudson and I'm descended from
> their eldest daughter Elizabeth Emily Hudson Goddard - their other
> children being William Charles and Eleanor Melita. William's parents
> were James Goddard and Emily Thrift (who were married in 1847). After
> Elizabeth Hudson died in 1905, William may have married his cousin
> Alice Goddard (although I'm not 100% sure of this or of the exact
> relationship between William and Alice). William died in 1926. I don't
> have that much information about James or his ancestors.

> If you can provide help in tracing this line of family back further
> (or are aware of any members with ancestry in the north Hampshire
> area) it would be appreciated.

> Dear Gordon

Thank you for sending your family details. I do know that there are several
Goddard families in north Hants. and over the border in Berks. and Surrey. However
I don't hold the records submitted by our members so I don't know if we have any
information about your branch. My role in the Goddard Association is an
administrative one as membership secretary and I'm not able to carry out any
research. But I don't want to be unhelpful. If you care to join the
Association our research co-ordinators would be available to check our indexes for any
connections

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and you would be able to place an enquiry in our newsletter. Have you looked at our website www.goddard-association.co.uk? In the meantime I have looked at the 1881 census and found James & Emily aged 55 and 53 with children Mary 15, Charles 12 and Granddau Alice 5 at Hill Corner, Hawley. James' father should be named on their marriage certificate. At the same address is James 28 b.Yately, (probably another son) wife Annie 24, Thomas 2, Elizabeth 6mths. Wiliam would still be in Malta. At Bourne Farm, Yately were George 51 b. Hawley, wife Caroline 47, George 19, James 15, Charles 13, William 9, Louisa 7. At Starve Acre, Yately Common were another James 35 b.Hawley, wife Jane 34, James 11, William 8, Clara 3, Fredk. H. 1. These are probably all related in some way - using the same Christian names! I hope I'm not duplicating your researches! John
