As promised, some more bits and pieces which may be of some use: there is a degree of speculation and I am still working on it. I am looking forward to receiving the CD and have sent my cheque today. For an accurate record of St.Peter's, Farnborough, someone will need to view the original parish register at SRO at Woking: I would be most interested in a copy of their results. No doubt you, like me, have seen Holland transcribed (indeed recorded in parish records as Howell) on occasions: Howell is the anglicised form of the Welsh name Hywel, which was common in the Middle Ages when it was derived from a vocabulary word meaning 'eminent, conspicuous'. Given the old drove way and the Blackwater market there may be a connection. Just a thought! Also I strongly recommend the following site 'Current value of old money' to be found under Ask Jeeves. It is maintained by R.Davies, a librarian at the University of Exeter (my alma mater). For example, Nicolas's inventory of £74.02d in 1666 has an equivalent value of £6774.72. You can also use it to calculate the value of the attached wills. Although not wealthy, these Goddard's were certainly men of substance. You may well be able to identify the land holding referred to. I liked the mention of the Enclosure Act.

Dear Ernest,

Since our telephone conversation of the other day I have made copies of all the relevant papers on the Hampshire Cove and Yateley Goddards, with the Banbury and Irish ones thrown in for good measure. I have spared you the New Zealand ones because they are descended from the "black sheep" of the Banbury Goddards who were sent there by the family. The Banbury Goddards were tobacco dealers with Bristol roots, bankers at Market Harborough in the next generation and, on moving to Leicester, Imperial Typewriters and Goddard Polishes.

We keep getting asked how the name "Holland" became to be used. My husband, Brian, thinks that it is given to immigrant Goddards from Holland. I think it is given in memory of one of the many Lord Hollands - like the names Cecil, Gordon and Herbert after the illustrious families with those names. In the Banbury Goddards when they became bankers, "Stanhope" was used as a first name perhaps as a gesture to the man who introduced £10 (I think) bank notes.

There are also Cheshire Holland Goddards my husband says, but I do not have anything on file.
