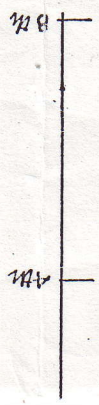

Subject: Goddards of Yateley

The Yateley Society, a Civic Trust and a registered charity, is the amenity society for Yateley. We have a very active Local History Group which mounts an exhibition and gives an lecture in Yateley library each November.

In 2001 we intend to research four Yateley families. We should like one family to be Goddard since the family has been in Yateley over 400 years and scores the highest number of occurrences in our baptismal registers (291) -- about 60% more than the next highest.

QUESTION 1: Do you have any members in our area with Yateley/Hawley ancestors? (North East Hants bordering Surrey and Berkshire) If so, and if there are any that might be interested in working with us on this project, would you ask them to contact me at this email address or phone 01252-873378.

QUESTION 2: Do you already have trees connecting into the Goddards of Yateley and Hawley? One of our members (the former church archivist) does remember someone from the *Goddards of Europe* coming down from the Midlands to extract the Goddards from the registers -- but that was probably 15 or 20 years ago.



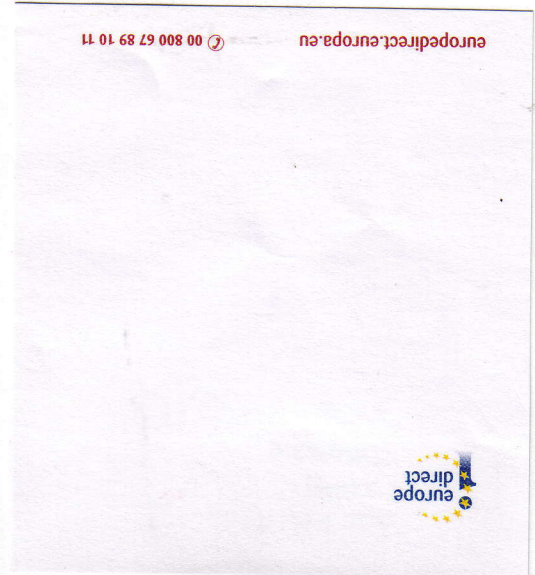

Dear Mr Goddard,

Apologies for the slight delay: I'm afraid that in the past few days I have suffered a severe throat infection which rendered me almost speechless and unable to swallow solid food and very little liquid nourishment. Thankfully, with the aid of anti-biotics and rest, I am now recovering. However, the illness prevented me from going up to Winchester at the weekend to check the records on your behalf. Rest assured though, I will endeavour to get up there over the next couple of months or so. In the meantime, I will try to give you lines of enquiry that I will probably follow up there. I think it's likely that the ALBERT in question was the son of THOMAS AND SARAH GODDARD. The baptismal date is November 26, 1865 at Cove in Hampshire. Albert looks to have been the youngest member of the family. Other children appear to have been:

FREDERICK WALTER: November 24 1861

ANNE: December 26 1858

WILLIAM: August 27 1854

CHARLES: December 26 1852 - ~~eldest~~ - *wid of succession*

ELIZA: July 29 1859

Note the two youngsters born on Boxing Days, six years apart.

This information is taken from IGI indexes and can be cross-checked at Winchester by looking at various records. I will hope to look at the Hawley parish register for the years 1840-1849, on the assumption that Thomas married Sarah there. Marriage registers after July 1837 give the following details: names of groom and bride, ages, occupation of groom and the names and occupations of the two fathers - this would be useful. Our only snag is that weddings tended to take place in the bride's parish, so we'll have to hope that Sarah was a Hawley girl too. In any event, we can also look at the Hawley Census returns for 1871. I would be assuming that, six years on from his birth, Albert would be living with his father and mother in the same area. The census should confirm all the family details and, if we are stuck on the marriage place of Thomas and Sarah, the birthplace of Sarah. It should not be too difficult to get back a reasonable way with only a morning or so's work. It helps that I know where and what to look for. As I said previously, it may take a little time for me to get up to Winchester, but, don't despair, I will get there. Perhaps you could before leaving for the States give me a call and inform me of your address in Florida.

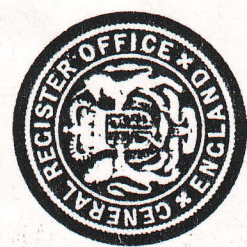
