William was born EST 1820. He married Susan SMITH 1855. At 35 years of age William became the father of William Thomas GODDARD in Mile End New Town, London, 02 OCT 1855. At 38 years of age William became the father of Henry Thomas GODDARD MAR 1859. William became the father of Frank GODDARD in Bethnel Green, Middlesex, ABT 1861. 1855 On son's (William Thomas) birth certificate, occupation was recorded as a Brewer's Assistant.

1879 On son's (William Thomas) marriage certificate, occupation was recorded as a Collector.

1.1. William Thomas GODDARD

William was born in Mile End New Town, London 02 OCT 1855. He was baptized in Whitechapel, Stepney, London, 1856. Religion: religion unknown. He married Ellen WISEMAN in Stepney, Middlesex, 03 AUG 1879. Occupation: Cook

At approximately 24 years of age William became the father of Lavinia GODDARD in Marylebone, Middlesex, ABT SEP 1880. He was listed as head of household in the 1881 census in London. At 26 years of age William became the father of William Thomas GODDARD in London, 15 JUL 1882. William became the father of Sydney GODDARD EST 1885. William became the father of Henry Roland GODDARD ABT 1889. At 43 years of age William became the father of Madeline Violet GODDARD in Fulham, Middlesex, 24 FEB 1899. William died 05 JAN 1907 in Hammersmith, Middlesex, at 51 years of age. Occupation: Restaurant Cook

His body was interred 11 JAN 1907 in Hammersmith, Middlesex, Hammersmith. J H Kenyon Limited, Undertakers 45 Edgware Road, London W For the funeral of the late Mr William Goddard

To an elm coffin french polished, padded and lined, fitted with four pairs of brass gilt handles an inscription plate a funeral Car and pair of horses to Hammersmith Cemetery 2 carriages and pair 3 drivers' wages attendance of Conductor and assistants £7/- - Cemetery fees 16/6 Total £7/16/6

1.1.4. Lavinia GODDARD

Lavinia was born in Marylebone, Middlesex ABT SEP 1880. She was listed as ^{daughter} head of household in the 1881 census in Marylebone, Middlesex. Only appeared on the 1881 census. No-one in the family had heard of this child and thought that William was the eldest. Possibly died very young.

married to Ann Fish Boyce *See other tree*

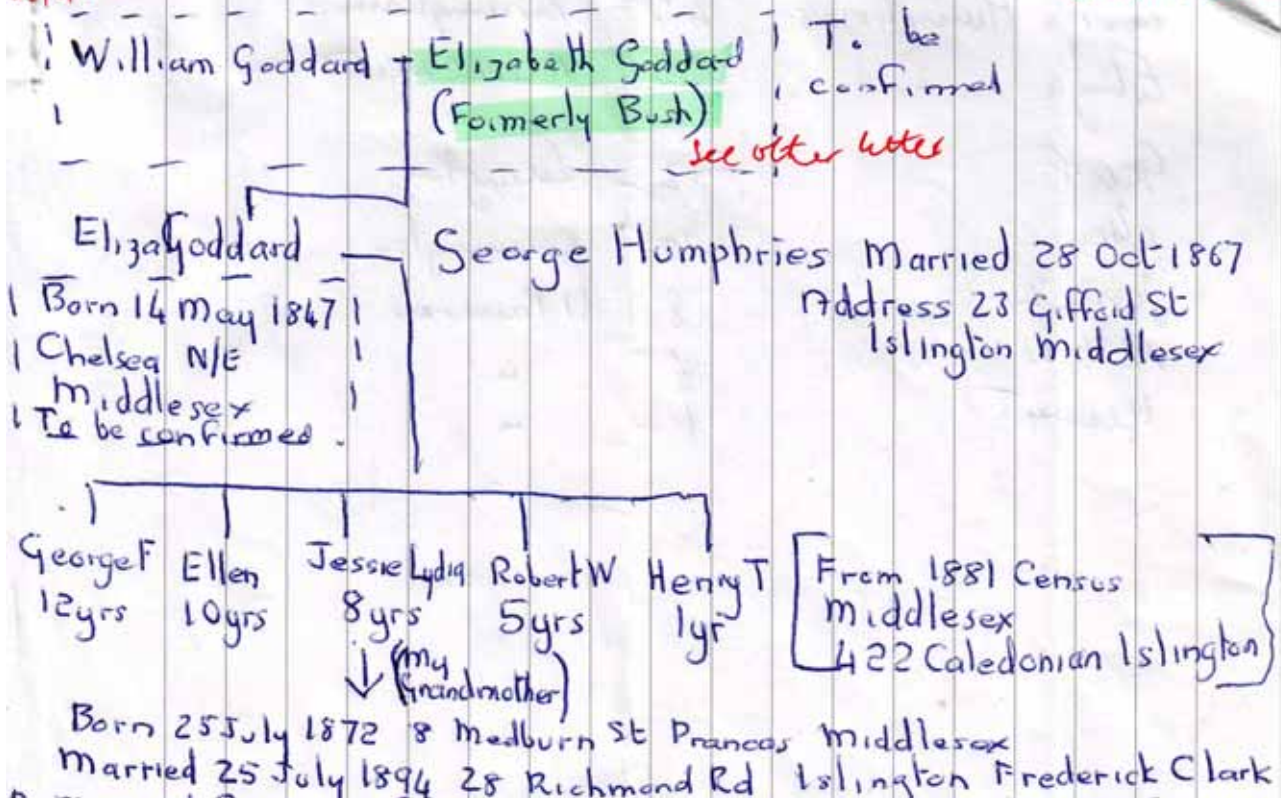

Eliza Goddard

Your enquiry about your Goddard ancestors has been passed on to me by John Goddard, our membership secretary.

I am afraid that I did not find very much about the Goddards, but did find **George Humphries** in the 1881 and 1851 census, and print outs are enclosed.

In the International Genealogical Index (I.G.I.) is a record that **George Humphries son of Robert Humphries and Ann nee Fish was baptised at St Thomas's, Birmingham on 26th May 1839.**

Unfortunately I cannot tell you anything more about **Eliza Goddard**. There seems to be a little confusion in your letter about the name of her mother; you have it both as Elizabeth Goddard and Ann Fish Boyce. Have you obtained her birth certificate? That and the 1851 census record of Chelsea (which we do not have) would give you more clues.

New member **Barry J. Watts** of 1 [redacted] ough, Sheppey, Kent has an ancestry named **Emmeline Goddard** who was born in Westminster in 1850/1. She married the oddly named **James Edward Phair**, her first cousin, in 1870 at Eccleston Chapel, Westminster. At her marriage she was described as the daughter of **GGeorge Goddard, farmer, deceased**. Just imagine the days when it was possible to be a farmer in Westminster! Are any other members related to Emmeline?

We have also been given details of a **Benjamin Goddard** by a non-member living in Australia. Benjamin married **Catherine Harvey**, who was employed as a silk winder, in 1793 at All Hallows, London. They had at least six children, including a Benjamin and a Mary Ann. In 1811 Catherine was accused of stealing stockings and, being found guilty, was sentenced to transportation. She sailed on the "Minstrel", taking two of her children with her, and arrived in Australia in October 1812. Husband Benjamin Goddard, ex-Royal Navy and a carpenter, joined her in Australia, where she was now free, in 1816 aboard the "Fortune". Benjamin died in 1836 and Catherine in 1840 at Sydney. Young Benjamin (born 1797), who had gone to Australia with his mother, married and prospered. Please contact Julie at Newbury for further details and a name to contact.

1881 CENSUS

The Goddard names from the 1881 census for the counties of **Cheshire, Norfolk and Staffordshire** are now available. Write to Julie for details.

There are only a few counties to go: **Yorkshire, Durham, Kent, Lancs, Surrey** and the all-important **Middlesex** which will cover the main part of London and could reveal where your new-Londoner ancestors came from.

QUERY FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA

New member Mark Goddard of Kalgoorlie has traced his ancestors back to two brothers **Joseph** and **William Goddard** (born 1815 and 1817 respectively), the sons of James and Hannah Goddard (nee Dixon), who were sentenced in 1838 to 10 years transportation for stealing linen. Both Joseph and William were employed as grooms in London at the time of sentencing. Joseph sailed on the "Barrosa" in 1839, married in NSW in 1855 and died in 1883 leaving no children. William sailed on the "Portsea" in 1838, married in Sydney in 1851, and died in 1871-2, leaving 8 sons and 2 daughters. Mark says that during World War I his grandfather looked up his relatives in, or near, London, but all contact has since been lost. The middle name **Fordham** has been used in the family and Mark wonders if this could be a clue - the village where the family lived, perhaps.
