I send you all the Gooverss I have recently collected. The
name does not occur once at St. James Piccadilly & only once at
St. Giles in the Fields - St. Leonard's Shore-ditch then a fashionable
quarter & only second St. Clerkenwell has the few I have extracted,
the very early ones all in the 18th century MSS. I think belong to
Wiltshire but if the later ones were accidental from them I think
that they also declined in rank - These extracts have been made
by an indefatigable genealogist, a friend of mine who is also a
barrister & therefore likely to be correct - He is always at this
sort of work, either in London during the season, or in the
country wherever he may go for the Autumn and even in foreign
countries wherever he has business. It has been working at
St. Andrews Hoborn lately & at some of the smaller city churches. I
don't think to go to Clerkenwell where he would be sure to reap a
rich harvest. It Giles in the fields is full of names of the highest
rank & exhibits the period of fashion between Clerkenwell, St.
Martin's St. James Piccadilly which most cases will confirm.
It also shows St. Leonard's decline nearly so early as might
have been expected Norton & Haggerston keeping up a good supply

Thank you for your enquiry and I enclose a leaflet about the association. Our Derbyshire contact, Albert Goddard, lives in Chapel-en-le-Frith and we have printed the history of the Derbyshire Goddards that he has done.

As to your enquiry; I am afraid that no one has done much research into the London Goddards. I have a file of enquiries which we have had over the years but have very little on Shoreditch, really the only thing being a copy of a letter which is in the Wiltshire Record Office (Ref; 110/23 Clyffe Pypard miscellaneous records). This is a letter from a researcher who looked at various London registers for the Goddards of Clyffe sometime in the 1800s. The baptisms, marriages and burials of Goddards from 1538 to 1700 of St Leonards, Shoreditch are given. This is outside your time span but you may have a copy if you wish. The writer mentions that St Leonards, Shoreditch was "then a fashionable quarter and second only to Clerkenwell".

Thank you for the Goddard names on the Kettleshulme village memorial. We have access to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission lists, and a printed list of fatalities in the First World War, but knowledge of names on a particular memorial is useful. The Imperial War Museum is trying to collect all the names on all the war memorials in the country and put them on computer. Surprisingly, no one had recorded all of them before. I have done the dozen or so in Newbury, finding it very interesting. Though some names were duplicated, such as on a memorial inside and outside a church, no list was the same as any other!
