Dear Ian

How kind of you to send me a complimentary copy of the Goddard Assoc. Newsletter. I would be very keen to participate in some Goddard research project as you know, and I wonder are any in the offing? I am currently involved in the FreeCen and FreeBMD projects which are going ahead well, especially the BMD. Have you ever accessed the site? It is up to over 91 million entries now, so becoming more useful all the time.

I hope I haven't presented myself as some angry dragon, so in case I have, I will accept your invitation to rejoin in the hope that data which must be held by the Society and members, will be made more readily available. Please let me know if anything is in the pipeline that needs a bit of slave labour!

It looks as though our small Goddard line had petered out here. No sons have been born to my brother's children, and time has virtually run out. However, my mysteries persist in spite of accessing the 1901 census. It appears that my grandmother (who married George Goddard in MDX in 1880), was born in France of all places. It puzzles me how a cab proprietor would be having a family in France (British Subjects)!! At least I was able to get the names and ages of my father's siblings. Perhaps you could advise me on how to access services records in England for WW1. Maybe some of his brothers were in that war. I have searched the Commonwealth War Graves site, but not all casualties have next of

kin information, and of course, they may have survived.

I am enclosing a cheque for \$20 and a run down on my Goddards which may be suitable for the newsletter one day to see if I can stir up the possums a bit.

My Goddards are an elusive lot who seem determined to remain hidden from me. It is time to throw my family names into the Goddard melting pot to see if a bit of stirring brings the odd one to the surface.

My George Goddard was born in Bath, Somerset abt. 1858. He was the son of George GODDARD and Ann DAINTON. This couple already had a son Albert born abt. 1855. It is likely that young George had a twin sister Emily Jane. There may have been other children but I haven't found them to date.

Around 1860, George and Ann gathered up their family and moved to the Paddington area of Middlesex. George had been a stone cutter in Bath, but I don't know how he earned his living after the move.

In due course, young George became a painter and decorator, and married Lucy Alice BUSBY at Holy Trinity, Paddington in 1880. His big brother Albert married an Irish lass, Bridget REARDON from Limerick, in the same church in 1876. Albert was also a painter and decorator.

Here are the families of the two brothers.

Bridget died before the 1901 census possibly in 1899.

Emily Jane married a gent called Hilbert Thomas HALE and they had these children:

and maybe more. This came from the invaluable 1901 census, and I link this family to mine as one of George's children, Beatrice was listed as a niece staying with the Hale's.

My father was secretive about his family and strangely, he made a mystery trip to New Zealand in his old age in the 1970s. He declined to discuss this trip, so I hope it was to make a connection with a family member whose descendants might be reading this in 2004. (I should be so lucky!)

Somehow, all my Goddards seem to have evaporated along the way and I have had no luck in tracing any of the above other than my father, who came to Australia in 1913 and married here in South Australia in 1916. I must have dozens of cousins and second cousins somewhere out there....are you one of them?

Dear Mr Dadd,

I appreciate that as an OAP you must watch the pennies - don't we all! The annual donation to the Goddard Association is £5 for OAPs (less than the cost of a copy birth certificate) and you can join for a year, or become a permanent member. We produce a quarterly Newsletter in which members can advertise their family tree in case some other member recognises it as his own; there is an annual get together (this year's was in King's Lynn); and a Research Co-ordination Dept at our address. We do not actively do research for any member, but if we have information on the family you are seeking, or can suggest means and methods for further research we are happy to do so.

As you write, your ancestor John Goddard could have come from anywhere and lived in a time when people were becoming more mobile. I have looked through our file of letters and trees from people with London ancestors (which loosely covers Middlesex, Surrey and Essex) but have found nothing which might help you. Likewise with our database as identifying one John Goddard from another, even with the benefit of roughly knowing the place where the family live. I would suggest that it might be more productive to look for the Delieu family as being a more unusual name. Have you thought of advertising in *Family Tree Magazine*? Or joined one of the London ancestors' societies? Have a look at them in the current General Research Directory under Societies-England-London. Was the Delieu family of Huguenot origin? There is a Huguenot Society.

Sorry not to be of more help. We once counted the number of John Goddards in the country in the 1881 census and made it over a thousand.

Greetings

I've received the following from Ronald Dadd ma[redacted]
You will probably be better able to deal with it, so I've given him your email address.

Hi John,

My son Timothy and I have been researching our family's forbears for about four years. My mother who died in 2001 was very sharp to the end albeit somewhat deaf and had an excellent memory for the details of her family. One of her two grandmothers she referred to as Grandmother Goddard and we have identified her as Emma Goddard (b 1855) the daughter of John Goddard and Sarah Delieu. Emma was born in Mary's Row, Bromley, Bow, Middlesex in the East End of London whence her family seems to have come for at least three generations.

So far we have been unable to find anything about John Goddard. As you can see it is likely he was born before civil registration was introduced in 1837. There was quite a lot of movement of families from one side of the Thames to the other in the 19th century so John could have come from what was then Surrey (e.g. Rotherhithe) or Kent (e.g. Deptford). I note from your web page that your association's members cover Surrey but no mention of Middlesex. At the moment I am working through the 1851 census for the London area but so far to no avail.

As an OAP I have to be careful with my money and so I'm wondering if joining the Goddard Association would give me access to a data-base of Goddard family members into pre 1837 times, the web page does not make this clear. Perhaps you could advise me to assist with making the decision.

Your letter of enquiry about your Goddard ancestors has been passed on to me.

I am sorry to have to say that we have no record of Caroline Goddard the daughter of William Goddard and Jane Chitts. Unfortunately no one has been brave enough to tackle the immense job of researching Goddards in the London area. There were 1136 people named Goddard in Surrey in 1881 (probably a few less in 1851) and these would come from probably 150 different unrelated families!

I would suggest that you consider joining our association, leaflet enclosed, and advertising in our Newsletter to see if any member who has not yet informed us, has found your Goddard family while doing their own research. Alternatively you could concentrate on the Lock and Chitts families and you might find a clue to the Goddards while doing it.

Dear Julie,

For some time I have been looking for my great-great-grandmother Caroline GODDARD's birth or death details. I have her possible parents William GODDARD and Jane CHITTS (she bp 8 Jul 1796 Kingston- on Thames)

I have her marrying 16 Aug 1841 St Lukes Norwood Surrey, George LOCK. (he b ?C1819 Croydon, d ?Mar 1844-Jan 1845) He apparently died before the birth of his daughter, Olive, 7 Jan 1845 in Surrey St Croydon, as he is given as deceased on her birth certificate.

I found her a widow aged 28 on the 1851 census at 3 Husons Court, Middle Street, Croydon, (birthplace given as Hook, Surrey) with her two children James LOCK , 8 , and daughter Olive ,6. James birthplace is given as Rouen, Normandy, and I have not been able to find his birth.

I found a Miss Caroline GODDARD buried in Croydon in 1853 of a matching age and thought that -maybe- she had reverted to her maiden name .

But in the last GODDARD newsletter I saw the entry on page three about a James GODDARD, of Kinbury, Berkshire, whose mother was a Caroline GODDARD who died in 1888. Could this possibly be MY Caroline?

Could she and her son James have kept the name GODDARD? Where were these Berkshire GODDARDS born? Do you have that information?

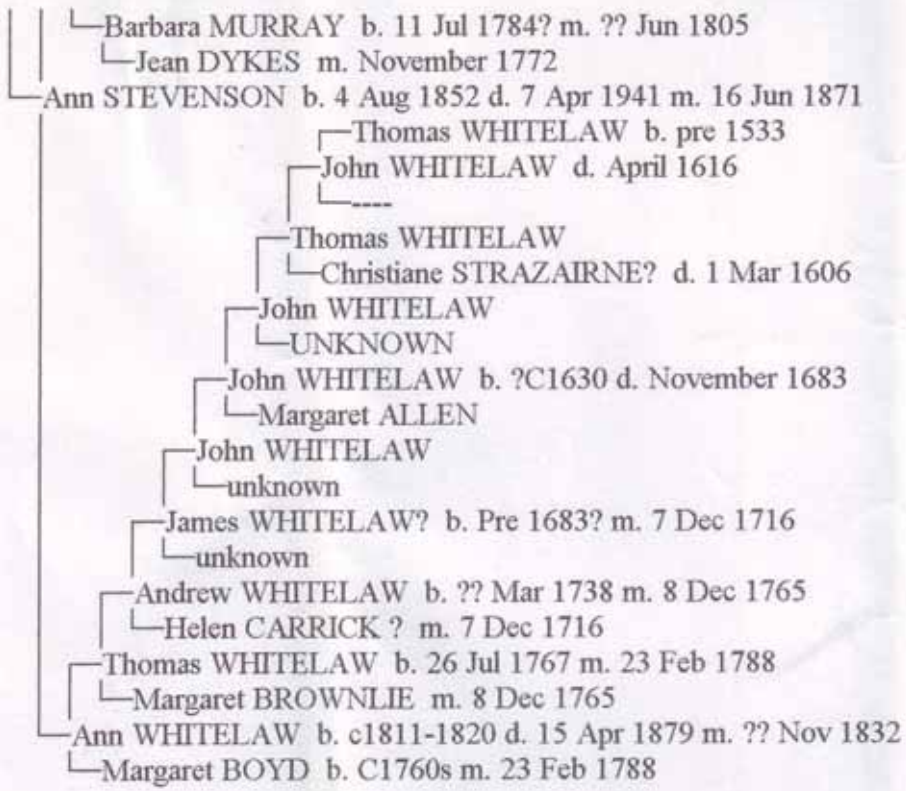

Dear May,

Thank you for your enquiry, but I am afraid that I must disappoint you.

The Caroline Goddard who was mentioned in the last Newsletter as being buried in Kintbury churchyard was the wife (I am sorry that it was put in the Newsletter as mother) of James Goddard, a shoemaker by trade. He is recorded as being born at Tottenham park (no connection with the place with the same name in London) in nearby Savernake Forest; and she is on the census as having been born at Thatcham, between Newbury and Reading in Berkshire.

There was another Caroline Goddard supposed to be buried in the same churchyard, but no relation, however I have not been able to find the grave yet. The headstones crumble very quickly and become unreadable. This Caroline was born Caroline Kimber at Easton Royal in Wiltshire, but did move to London for a time with her husband William Goddard. They also had a daughter named Caroline, born in 1859, but I have her recorded as having married Stephen G. Hotson.

Caroline was a popular name because it was the name of the queens of both George II and George IV.

I would suggest that you get the marriage certificate of Caroline and George Lock, which should show the names of their parents. And the death certificate of George Lock. What is the birthplace of Olive in the 1851 census? I can see no reason why Caroline should have returned to using Goddard as a surname - or do you have inside information about this? Have you looked for a marriage of a Caroline Lock soon after 1851? Widows usually remarried in order to have some financial support. I am told that you have good research facilities in New Zealand, but if you are in any difficulties in looking things up, why not contact our NZ co-ordinator, my namesake Julie Goddard at 2/36 Young Street, Christchurch 2 and ask her for advice?
