Dear Mr Goddard,

Thank you for your letter. I have decided to join the Association and enclose details of what I know about my Goddards.

My Goddard connection is that my maternal Great Grandmother was Emma Ann Goddard. As you will see from the enclosed they were from London but with Oxted (Surrey) and Mansfield connections. Possibly Thirza Frances was not the only child born to George and Sarah in Mansfield.

Following Emma Ann's death, her brother Charles William became the guardian of her six surviving children and I have a copy of the admission report from when he arranged for two children to go into Dr Barnardos.

I have a death certificate for a Sarah Goddard who might have been Emma Ann's sister. She died 7th October 1861 aged 40 in the Camberwell House Lunatic Asylum. Possibly too old, but in the right area and Emma Ann's son died in the Metropolitan Imbecile Asylum so there could be a genetic link.

I had also wondered if Charles Samuel Goddard who married in Islington District June 1879 ^{or} might have been a connection but have not explored this yet. This is on the basis that there are several Charles Samuel Dolling on my other line.

I would be interested to hear from any Goddards connected to myself.

George Goddard married Sarah Burnal(1) at Oxted, Surrey, in 1825
(IGI)

On his children's marriage certificates his occupation was given
as "hatter". Similarly on his son Charles William's birth cert-
ificate.

I have not managed to find George on any census. None of his
children's marriage certificates indicate that he had died and
he may have been one of the witnesses at his daughter Thirza's
wedding in 1858.

According to the 1851 Census his wife Sarah was born in Oxted,
Surrey, around 1804. In 1851 she was at 4 John Street, Stockwell,
employed as a laundress, with three of her children living with
her. She was stated to be "Head Husband Left".

Dear Mrs Gomer,

I am afraid that our records of London in the 19th century are very few. No one has yet been brave enough to tackle the area and we have no record of **Emma Ann Goddard** and her marriage to **Levi Dolling** nor her father **George Goddard** a hatter from Southwark. I will have a note put in the "Can you help?" column of our Newsletter, but from past experience, I do not have much hope of any success.

I am enclosing a leaflet about the Goddard Association. People poured into London from the provinces, looking for work, in the 18th and 19th centuries. We have records of a family from Ogbourne St George in Wiltshire who settled in Westminster and had a bookseller and stationer and another large family group who moved from Silchester in Hampshire to the market gardens in Deptford. There is another family who were in the river boat business and a further family who established the eel pie shops in Greenwich (after the head of the family, a sea captain, was stabbed to death at Constantinople). There are London Goddard clockmakers who emigrated from Paris in the 16th century, a stained glass manufacturer at Shoreditch, a piano maker and a firm of eminent Goddard lawyers who dealt with the legal side of the abdication of Edward VIII.

If you can trace Emma Ann and her father back just another generation - is George the hatter in the 1851 census? - we can perhaps help you further.

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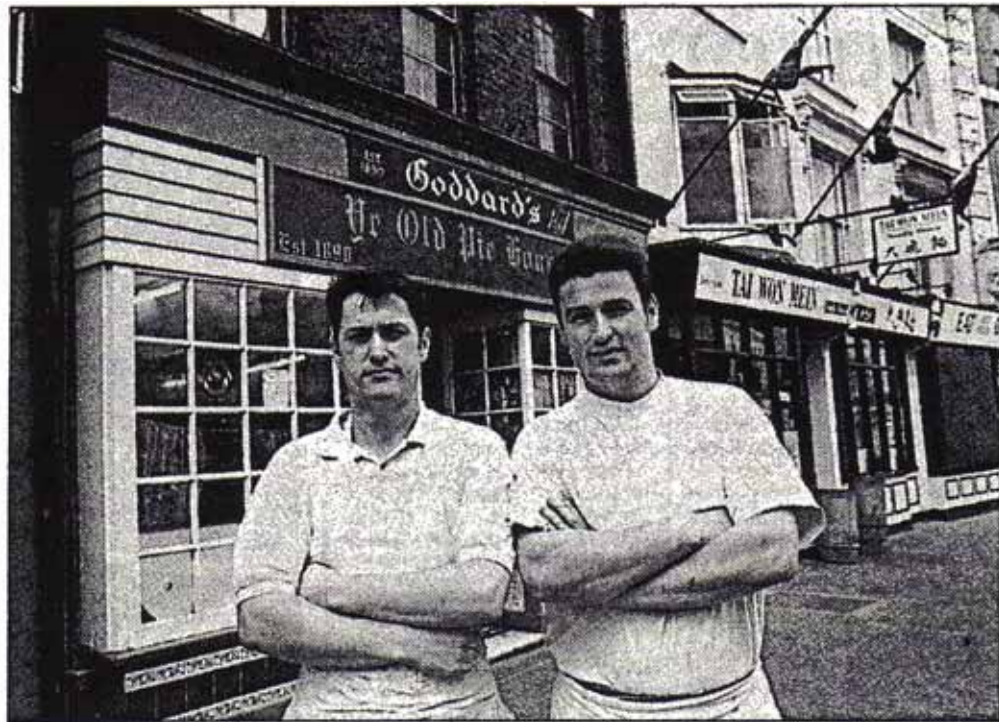

Tony Banks to visit. He got it listed.

The Goddards are freeholders. But they could still be turfed out if the ministry's inspector confirms a compulsory purchase order.

"They shouldn't put something like that down,

bang wallop, like Milton Keynes, in the middle of a conservation area," Jeff says forcefully, in between fetching pies out of the oven.

"We serve everyday food. It's not haute cuisine. But the council and English Partnerships (who are overseeing the development) have a contempt for small businesses.

"The Dome could be a good business opportunity for years to come.

"But they should leave all that modern stuff out on the peninsula. It's not what anyone comes to Greenwich for."



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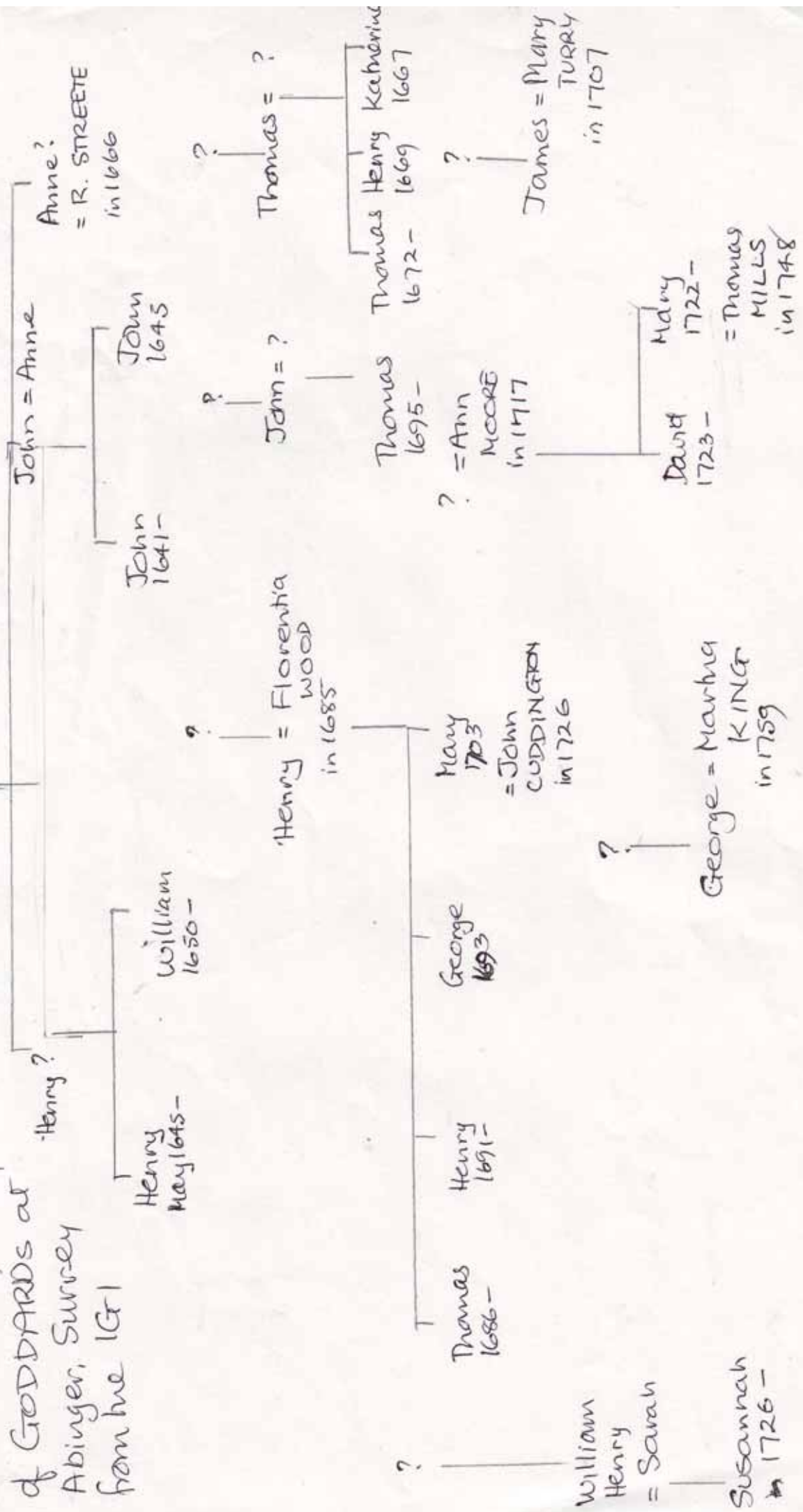

Dear Mr Goddard,

I am so pleased that you have found us! I enclose a copy of the association's latest newsletter and our brochure, which will tell you how to join and what we have to offer.

Unfortunately for you **William Goddard** the name of your ancestor is very common. The International Genealogical Index, which is only partially complete, gives two William Goddards around the time and place which you give;

William the son of Edward and Elizabeth was baptised at Southwark St Saviour 24 Sept 1817
William the son of William and Sarah was baptised at Southwark 2 July 1820

Do you have any more information about him? I have asked our New Zealand member, Julie Goddard of Christchurch, if she can help you with immigration records and if you tell us more we can see if we can discover anything more from this end.

Thank you for sending the IRC coupons to defray our costs. It will not be necessary to send postage if you become a member, only money expended on your behalf if we do any specific research.
