I am a regular subscriber to Family Tree and see in the latest issue to reach me (March) the name Goddard in the One-Name Studies. I have just recently begun researching into Goddard and Oliver here and have got no further as yet then the death Certificates of my parents-in-law. I also found Arthur Albert Oliver (my father-in-law) in the IGI but found no other members of his family. I now learn that in order to discover more I need to send the relevant information about him on the IGI to Salt Lake City and they will forward to me (2 IRCs) his family list. So I will do that shortly.

The information I have on Edith Catherine Oliver (nee Goddard)

Born - Croydon, Surrey (no birth date given but was aged 71 when she died 18 May 1967, at Nelson, New Zealand. She had been in NZ for 18 years.

Her father was John William Goddard, lamplighter.

Mother, Louisa maiden name not known.

She married Arthur Albert Oliver in England probably c 1919; they had five children.

I am hoping you might have some more information on Edith in your files. Meantime I am happy to contribute the above to your records.

Note?
The Lords of the Admiralty commanded the Masters attendant and the master's shipwright and three or four of the ablest Elder Brethren of Trinity House, to measure the two new ships building at Deptford and Woolwich. (They, Peter Pett among them, returned a favourable report 29 Dec.)

22 Dec

The Admiralty ordered the above comparative abstract to be made out. **Mr Henry Goddard** the builder complains to Secretary Coke 29 Aug 1623 of want of timber to proceed with his ship, that he has been catechized by Sir Kenelm Digby and Captain Pett at the instance of Kenrick Edisbury, and his son and foreman have been ill-treated; however he "will continue his work and will not say, as Andrew Burrell did, that he would as soon build a ship in hell as in Deptford yard" (State Papers Domestic)

3 Jan 1633

Goddard complained again that through the opposition of Mr Edisbury £150 had been unnecessarily expended in workmanship and threatened to resign his patent if he was not protected from further molestation

22 Jan 1633

The order was given by the Admiralty for launching on the 29th and 31st of this month when His Majesty proposed to be present (The Henrietta Maria)

... there were no copyholders and the demense lands, besides those granted in fee to the Royal Hospital, being part of the old Palace and tiltyard were as followeth:-

Wm James was born at Milford Haven c.1721. Went to sea at 12 and commanded ship when 20 years old. Long service with East India Co., chosen Director of East India Co., a governor of Greenwich Hospital. Purchased Park Farm Place, Eltham, created Baronet 25 May 1778. **He married Anne, dau. & heir of Edward Goddard of Hartham, Wilts.** She died in 1798. Their only son Sir Edward Wm James died unmarried 16 Nov 1792. His only dau. Elizabeth Anne James, married 16 Dec 1783 aged 18, Thomas Boothby, Lord Rawcliffe. Sir James her father died on her wedding day.

A Faculty was granted 10 Dec 1793 to Dame Anne James, widow, to erect a tomb in the churchyard for her family exclusively and to remove and entomb there the remains of of the following persons from the parish vault under Eltham church viz. her cousin Brig.Gen. Thomas Goddard, bur. 24 July 1783 aged 39, Her husband Sir Wm. James, Bart. bur. 22 Dec 1783; her father Edward Goddard, Esq. bur. 17 April 1789 aged 88; her still-born child bur. 5 Aug 1780

Frederick and Herbert Goddard were both born in London and came to Wendens Ambo, near Saffron Walden Essex when their father William Goddard, a builder and haulage contractor, became the land lord of the Neville Arms (now no longer existing) As well as running the Neville Arms at Audley End Station William Goddard continued as a builder and haulier and his sons helped in the family business. Both 'Fred' and 'Bert' served in the first world war and on their return, and after

their father's death, expanded the haulage business considerably.

In 1928 the brothers moved to Saffron Walden - moving to adjoining houses and purchasing an electrical business. They added road carrying ^{and farming} to the haulage business. Times were difficult but by sheer hard work and their excellent partnership they founded one of the town's most successful family businesses which still continue today under John (Fred's son) and Stewart (Bert's son)

The brothers both became town councillors and Fred served as Mayor of the Borough twice during the 50s. He was also made an Alderman. In November 1975 the honour

of Very Distinguished Citizen of the Borough
of Saffron Walden was bestowed on Fred Goddard
— this had only been conferred on five other
citizens previously. Bert carved his brother's
name on a seat he had erected to Fred's
memory — this still stands at the top of the
High Street. The local street Goddard Way
is also named after Fred.

Bert had one daughter Jean
(1926-) and one son Stewart ⁽¹⁹³⁰⁻⁾ who has three
children and two grandchildren. Fred also
had a son and daughter: John (1930-) has
five sons and daughter Pauline (1928-) 3
children and 2 grandsons.
