Dear Francis,

I have had a quick look at the tree for your line via Edith Goddard, but I have only used the information that I have readily to hand and so have not been able to make much improvement on the information you already have.

The snag arises with the father of Edwin, James, unfortunately he was born in a popular area for the name "James Goddard", and there are apparently several born in the parishes in and around Guildford Surrey about the time he would have been born. This means that you need to investigate the information that is in the Godalming parish register regarding his marriage to Harriet, (daughter of George & Mary Pincott), hopefully to find his father and/or mother acting as witnesses. This information will be Surrey Record Office, this is in Wokingham and these records will require searching there, but you may find brothers and sisters to Edwin from the same source. Of Edwin's children, I have not found Albert on either the 1881 or the 1901 censuses and I presume that he died in Lambeth at an early age. I did find Oliver following the same profession as his father and married to Blanche in the 1901 census index, (www.census.pro.gov.uk). But I have not been able to locate Edith or Alfred Teil in the 1901 census, probably because I did not spend long enough searching the various spellings of their surname.

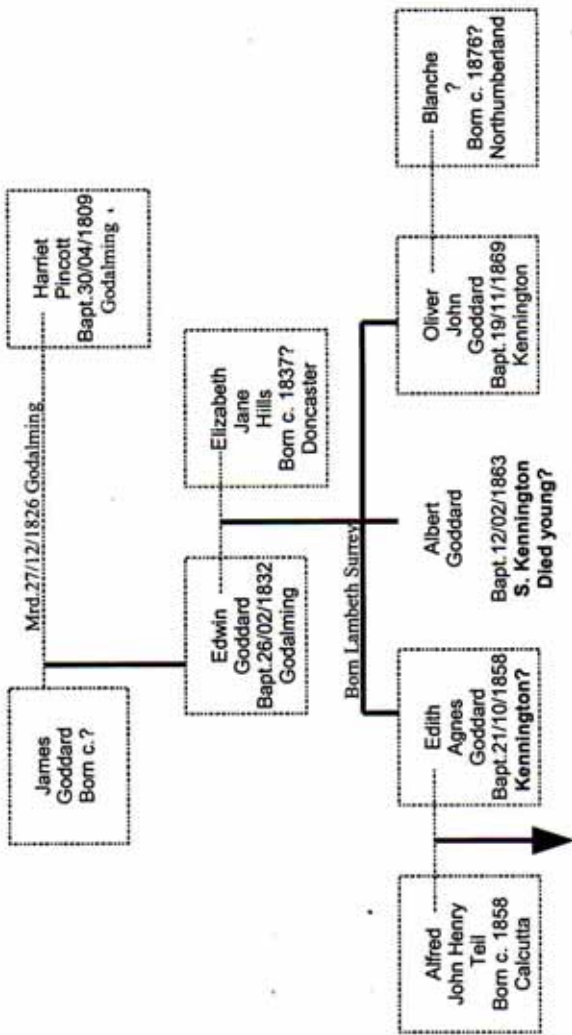
To trace the "Teil line" I suggest you investigate the records of the East India Company, I think they are at the Public Record Office at Kew, or you could try, for a start, "Family History in India" (<http://members.ozemail.com.au/~clday/>). I have come across the name spelt this way in Germany, But seeing that the obvious uncle of Edwin is named Mowbray, the German connection, if any, could be several generations back. As Edith was an artist there is the possibility that your picture is a self portrait, but in any case, it might be worth trying to trace where she trained and if she is known in the the Royal Academy Records either as an artist, or for any exhibitions she may have had.

I have put in most of the references that I have found and hope that they will be helpful to further your investigations. Sorry I cannot be of more help at this time, but there are so many Goddards in the Guildford area further research will have to be done in the local area. If you cannot do it yourself the magazines "Family Tree" and "Practical Family History" each month have advertisements for people offering to research specific county records, both magazines are on the shelves of our local W. H. Smiths so you should be able to get one or other locally and possibly in your public library.

Dear Mr. Goddard,

I recently accessed the Guild of One-Name studies page on the internet and came across your name and address relating to the Goddard name. I hope that you do not mind my contacting you.

Late last year I paid a visit to the UK during which I managed to undertake a little research of my wifes family connections. I found that her great grandfather Henry Brooker had married a Elizabeth Godart c1845-1848 and possibly in the area of Woodford Bridge, Essex. Sadly time did not permit me to confirm this while in England.

My follow-up research here in New Zealand has been less fruitful, and I am now in need of a renewed kick-start in my research of Elizabeth Godart.

I wonder if the Godart name is a derivation of Goddard? and if so whether you may be able to assist in any way.

Queenie Goddard said that her grandfather, William, was an inspector of the L. & SWR and SR at Richmond and Windsor. In the 1881 Census William was age 60

The earliest member of the family found to date is JOSEPH GODDARD. He married SUSAN.

The child of Joseph and Susan Goddard was JAMES GODDARD, born about 1798 in or near Leatherhead and baptised on 17 August 1800 at Leatherhead. He died on 16 October 1882, in Windsor workhouse, a gardener, aged 84.

James Goddard married SARAH MUSK 4 March 1821 in Esther, Surrey. She was born in 1803 (ref entry of death in March Q 1868), and died 1868 in Eton. On 11.7.1864 James & Sarah received £3.00.00 at the Prince Consort's Windsor Association (For improving the condition of labourers and others) Annual Meeting - for bringing up their family in sober and industrious habits. James' death certificate was signed by his son, William, of Richmond. The 1881 Census, for Windsor "Union Workhouse" shows James was a widower, aged 76 and a farm labourer, born Leatherhead

Queenie said that her brother had 43 years' service with the L. & SWR and SR. Marie said he was in the goods yards at Nine Elms.

Doreen nursed him as he died. He possibly had cancer of the lungs, but never smoked. Doreen was in a room at the top of the house and ate bread, cheese and Guinness. Charlie and his family would take over and sit with Reg while she ate. (Charlie was a long-term lodger with the family). Doreen went back home with her parents, Walter and Olive, after the funeral. Queenie wanted horses and a carriage, as for her parents' funerals, but had to have a hearse and cars, with men walking to St Peter and St Paul's church at the bottom of Church Street, Teddington. They went past the house, where they stopped for a moment, then to the cemetery, at the top of the road.
