Denise

I'm glad you didn't become another statistic on the Snetterton road! I recall cycling along that in the days before cars were so numerous.

Goody usually stands for Goodwife (there is an old pantomime called Goody Two-shoes) and is usually the familiar name of the elderly widow of the village, on whom orphans are placed to be reared, or who lays out the dead and certifies that they have been "Buried in wool" when that stipulation was required.

Glad to know that you have joined up the Stow Bedon Breckles lot. Could you let me have the link for my files please. I have lost contact with Joanna Blatchley at the address I have. Have you actually heard from her? My cousin is a Stow Bedon church warden.

Banns were required by the Church of England from the mid 12th century. There is a useful booklet called "Marriage Laws, Rites and Records and Customs", by Colin R. Chapman. During the Republic of 1640-1660 marriages were civil ceremonies rather like the Register Office ones today.

Unfortunately the records weren't kept very well by the civil registrars.

We don't remember when the AGM is, but Richard is said to be printing the next Newsletter and it should be out next week. Yes, I would like to know when and where as the Berkshire, Wiltshire and Hampshire and Leicestershire Magazine could be notified if I knew six weeks in advance.

Hi Brian and Julie  
Can I pick your brains?

I went down to Bunwell last week. Managed to nearly get killed near Snetterton, where they failed to grit the road and the back of the lorry decided to come into my lane, whilst the front was going the other way in the other lane. It's the first time I've driven straight for cones (managed to get out the way). Loads of accidents all along the roads. Fortunately I just caught the start of the blizzards on the A11/M11 and got home after 5 and a half hours. Unlike some who were stuck there all night. Quite exciting really.

Anyway - as to the research no further forward really. There are other earlier Goddards in Bunwell, but no direct links to me. They are also definitely Goddards not Gallards etc.

A chance connection somewhere may be with a Goody Goddard. He seemed to be claiming all sorts of things from the parish in 1777, for mending shoes, coals, rent etc. He had a wife and at least one son and daughter. (I think this was money they gave out between Michaelmus's etc - can't spell). Interestingly (in the parish chest) was a census of 1777 (June) there was a family headed by Rachel Goddard with 4 people under 16. No mention of Goody, no deaths etc. Wouldn't it be nice if he had a son called John (I can but hope) - more research is needed. Any ideas. Have you come across any other Goody's (it's not a well known nick name for something?) Also when do banns start being done formally?

Some news on progress so far with some of the Norfolk lot. I have been putting out appeals for trees.

I think I've managed to link up 2 Goddard Wright Wiggs.

I've managed to link up 3 Goddards from Breckles and Stow Beddon (Joanna Blatchley, Cath Everett and Helen Cullum) so some progress. Am writing to let them all know.

PS can you remember when the AGM is - I seem to have lost the date somewhere between old and new diaries. I'd like to put an advert in the Norfolk FHS magazine, and I think the spring closing date for editing is soon. I suppose I ought to give Richard a ring and find out if he's got a venue.

Dear John and Eileen,

Julie told me in her last letter how much she enjoyed taking you around and showing you her beautiful country. Brian is at the moment in Spain, together with our daughter, the babies, our son-in-law and his mother and her friend. Cipriano's mother and her friend agree with you that journeys are often far too long. The flight from Caracas to England, via Germany, seemed to take forever, they said.
