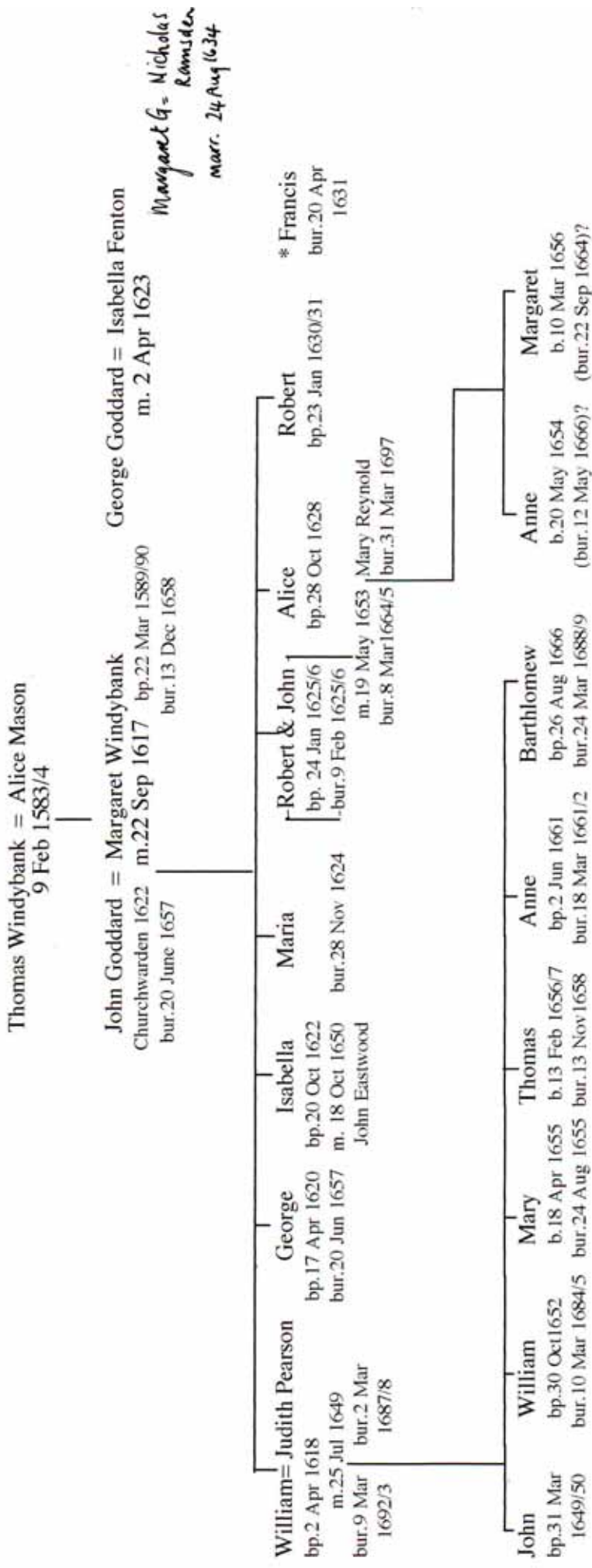

You will note that Charles is absent in this census as he had already been transported in 1843. Incidentally his middle name was Parkin, In the baptism records I found all the children of Margaret & Benjamin except Charles.

It appears that Benjamin was the son of John Goddard of Chapelton, and was born 1798. There are many more Goddards in the Chapelton/Ecclesfield Registers I believe but do not know the relationship. John I think may have been m to Mary x . Johns father could be Richard G. of Wincobank

Not known but suspected that BENJ.G. married to Margaret x and that she may be a Parkin ? There were Goddards in Whitley, Wincobank, Green Head & Wood End ?

I am no direct (Australian relation)with Andrew Goddard but there is always the possibility that we are related somehow by going back to our English forbears.

In particular may I thank you for all the interesting matter re the name Goddard & Parkin.

Dear Mr Kirbyshaw,

One of our members tells me that you advertised your interest in the **GODDARDS** of Ecclesfield in one of the family history journals some time ago. We have had an enquiry from a Glenn Goddard in Australia about his ancestor, **Charles Goddard** who was transported to Tasmania in 1843. It is thought that the father of Charles was **Benjamin Goddard** who married a Margaret in Ecclesfield before 1821, though the firstborn to be baptised seems to have been a Sarah. Glenn Goddard says that the name "Parkin" has been used in the family as a middle name for some generations.

I wonder if you are still interested and if you can help. (My apologies for troubling you if our member who told me of your interest has already been in touch. She is not clear on that point).

Oh, I've just thought! I can look in Sheffield FHS Members' Interests list! And....

There's someone researching Goddard in Ecclesfield, in the 19th century which sounds vaguely promising:

Dear Mr & Mrs Goddard,

I obtained your name from the Gen. Inter. Index and i wonder if you have any information on Goddards? [Hollow laughter at this end]

My Goddards originate from Yorkshire and are mentioned in the 1841 Census Ref. HO 107-1327 page 14 No.12. Benjamin Goddard married a Margaret (unknown). Firstchild mentioned in baptism records that I can find was Sarah of Ecclesfield in 1821. In family there is a record of Charles, but no baptism that I can find he would be born/bap ca 1820. He appears in Census for 1841 but not in later ones as he **was transported to Tasmania in 1843**. He had in Chaple-town in the township of Ecclesfield the following sisters Mary, Elizabeth and brothers John and Benjamin.

The father of Benjamin (married to Margaret) was a John Goddard b 1774 Chapeltown who married a Mary (unknown) who died in 1810.

Do you have any records of these Goddards in your files please? the name Parkin comes through our family, both my father and uncle had the middle name "Parkin" but I am not sure where it has come in.

I would be pleased to hear from you with any information we can exchange. Lookingforward to hearing from you.

Dear Mr Goddard,

We are very interested in your letter; particularly as the **Charles Goddard** you mention is the first Goddard we have heard of who has been transported; no disgrace to anyone of course in the days when any minor offence could lead to a sentence of transportation for seven years, or life.

We have no record of any Goddard family at Ecclesfield, but can guess which branch they probably came from, so I am passing a copy of your letter over to Mrs Rosemary Lockie of Cheltenham, who is researching this branch of the family. It would have been helpful if you had given us the occupation of Benjamin Goddard as given in the 1841 census and whether there were any other Goddards in Chapeltown and Ecclesfield. We have no record so far of a Goddard marrying a Parkin, but as you suspect, it can be a surname used as a personal name. The name, Parkin, itself having been originally a first name - that is Peterkin, or little Peter. [Parkins are also a northern cake, made of ginger and treacle, flour and egg].

I enclose a leaflet giving some information about the Goddard Association and perhaps you will join us. We do have several members in Victoria at Ormond and Malvern East, and Berwick.
