Dear Brian & Julie Goddard,

I joined the Association last year because I discovered a 'Goddard' in my family history. I am wondering if you are able to further my research on this side of the family. My father's mother's father - Joseph Fletcher - married Lizzie (Elizabeth?) Goddard on January 3rd 1880 at Rosedale Abbey in Rosedale village, North Yorkshire. On the certificate, her father is named as Joseph Goddard Excise officer and her place of birth given as London on the 1881 census, with her age given as 34, making her year of birth ~~ca~~ 1847.

The couple lived at various addresses in Yorkshire finally living at Rosedale. She was a schoolmistress and my g. grandfather varying from coal miner to book-keeper in his working years.

Do you have any information which may help me along on my research of my family or does the information I have given

fit in with any other family history
that you may know of?

Dear Susan,

You would not believe how little interest there has been in Yorkshire Goddards in the eleven years we have been running. I do not even have a file for them. However do not despair.

*I do have the 1881 census of **Goddards** in Yorkshire and cannot see any more Goddards in Rosedale. Does this mean that she was the Rosedale school mistress and had moved there from somewhere else? The only **Joseph Goddard** who might be her father, that is he was born in London, is aged 88, a widower, brass founder, living at Dringhouses in a house with Joseph Terry as the householder. This would be about 40-50 miles away from Rosedale.*

There is a specialist index for Customs Officers 1831-1881 (I am taking it that he was in Customs and Excise). I enclose a photocopy of the entry in "Specialist Indexes" by Jeremy Gibson for the Federation of Family History Societies. Try them. "Family Tree Magazine" had an article on Customs and Excise Officers several years ago. If you phone the office on 01487 814050 between 8.30 and 4.30 Mon to Fri they should be able to find the article in their index and will sell you a photocopy of the article, or a back copy of the volume it is in.

To trace the family when they lived in London will need a lot of hard work. Try "Marriage and census indexes for family historians" by Jeremy Gibson and Elizabeth Hampson, published by the Federation of Family History Societies ISBN 1 86006 067 6 - or you can borrow our copy. Let me know.

Next you can put a plea for help in the Goddard Newsletter by writing to Richard Goddard, the editor, address on back page. You are too late for the February issue, but should get into the next one. If after following all these suggestions and getting nowhere, you could put an advertisement in "Family Tree Magazine" or "Practical Family History" - I take it that you are familiar with one or other of these magazines for family historians? It costs £2 or £3 for an advert. or you can wait until they have a free offer, as I usually do!

Please keep in touch and let us know how you get on.

Dear Mrs Goddard

Mr Jack Fairfax has asked me to reply to your enquiry of 25 April.

Sir Bryan Stapleton married Agnes Goddard as you mention. There was no Fairfax/Goddard marriage, but Robert Stapleton (D: 12 March 1635) married Catherine Fairfax (daughter of Viscount Fairfax of Emley) of Walton, Yorks. Their daughter married William Fairfax (1631-1674) of Steeton, Yorks.

The line that married into the Fairfax family is not the same as that of Stapleton/Goddard although they have a common ancestor in Sir Bryan Stapleton and a daughter of John St. Philibert who had the distinction of having slain a Sarazin (sic) in the presence of three kings, England, Scotland and France.

The presence of the arms at Gilling is due to the fact that a collection of arms from all Yorkshire is displayed whether or not they related to the Fairfaxes.

Dear Dawn

Thank you for sending me the descendent chart of your Goddard family which I will add to our records.

I don't hold these records myself so am unable to say whether we have any information on your branch of the Goddards. Our research co-ordinator doesn't index 20th century persons on the basis that information should be easily obtainable from civil registration and family sources.

Although our research records are very considerable we are still very dependent on our members to provide copies of their research and family trees. The information we have gathered on individual branches of the Goddard 'family' is only a small percentage of what must be available.

I notice you have James G. (19/3/1843) as born in Derby. I have checked the IGI but he doesn't appear on the old edition I have. If it was Derbyshire rather than the town there are a lot of Goddards in the north of that county around the High Peak and south of Sheffield. Also you should be aware that in that area particularly the name is sometimes recorded as Gothard.

We should be very pleased to have copies of the results of your research in due course. In the meantime I hope that you will take up my invitation to become a member of the Association and look forward to hearing from you again.

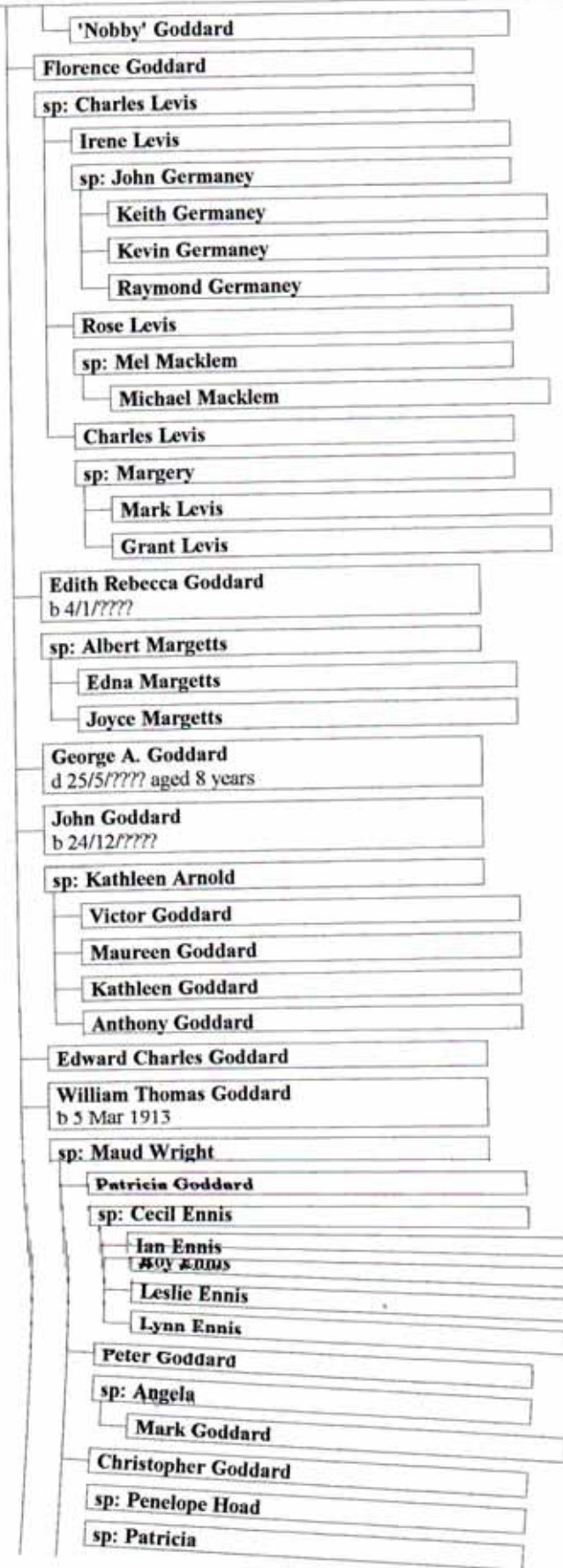
