On page 15 of the memoir mention is made of Sir Thomas Phillipps, and the Reader of Crowood, Ramsbury. *Enclosed is a pedigree, showing the connection. Visit to Japan

Members of Chapter may be interested to hear that I recently visited Japan in connection with the Robes of the Realm exhibition now drawing to a close at the Tokyo Fuji Art Museum. As you will know the exhibition was organised for Ede and Ravenscroft by the Marquess of Reading with assistance from Somerset Herald who attended the opening ceremony.

HM The Queen had agreed that the Garter Insignia worn by the late Emperor Hirohito (collar, George, Star and Garter) should be added to the exhibition and these were duly despatched in December by the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood. In addition Garter King of Arms kindly agreed to lend the late Emperor's Garter Banner and Crest and these were displayed to good effect in the Museum. At the invitation of the President of the Museum I gave an illustrated lecture on the Order of the Garter with the help of a female interpreter who even succeeded in making the audience understand that the Garter Crest of the late Sir Edmund Bacon (the ermine pig now in the Earl Marshal's Court) was a pun on his surname!

In view of the shortness of my stay I was not able to arrange a visit to the Imperial Palace which stands on a wooded island surrounded by a moat but I was taken to the Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden where some of the late Emperor's funeral ceremonies took place and I noticed that the papers were beginning to report on the preparations for the new Emperor's enthronement rites the most important being Sokui-no rei (Enthronement Ceremony) on 12 November and Daijosai (Great Food Offering) on 22 November.

On 22 January I invited to my hotel the leading (or perhaps the only) Japanese heraldist and author Mr. Mamoru Mori who is known to several Officers of Arms and whom I had received at the College in 1984. We exchanged several books and he gave me among others his 'General Armory' containing illustrations of all known Japanese 'mon' and which I should like to present to the College Library.

The officials of the Tokyo Fuji Art Museum (and of the Fuji Art Museum near Mount Fuji, which I also visited) all showed a great interest in English heraldry and ceremonial. Both Museums, together with a University, several schools and other institutions, were founded by Soka Gakkai, a Buddhist lay organisation of international standing which has bought Taplow Court, near Maidenhead, the former home of the Grenfell family. I was received with great pomp and ceremony by the President of Soka Gakkai, Mr. Daisaku Ikeda.
