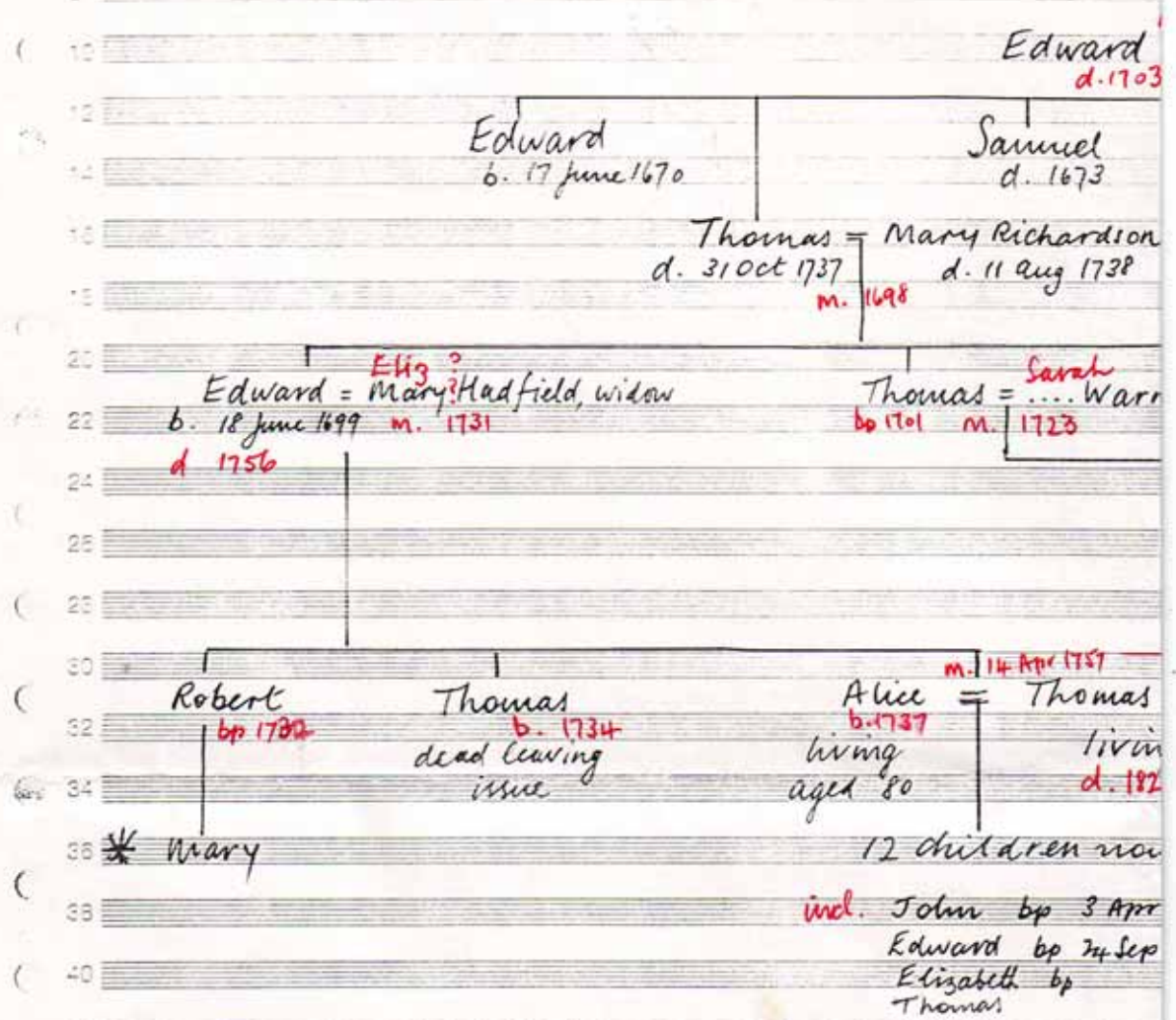

Dear Mr Goddard,

Thank you very much for your letter of the 18th with corrections to my tree and the extracts of wills, etc. The wills are very helpful and I wonder what the source of them is and whether there are more. Presumably the originals are at Chancery Lane, but I shall ask if these extracts are at Trowbridge.

John (d1501) mentions his 'goostly' father and I wonder if he was a 'godfather'. The same John mentions his elder son Thomas, but no other son of his. Perhaps another son died young or was disinherited.

I have only recently come across 'The Goddard Book' at Trowbridge and am glad to note that you are revising it, as it is not so easy to follow! I shall try to obtain a copy of the earlier chapter you mentioned and eagerly await the outcome of your present research. You seem to have taken on a huge task.

I should be interested to find out more of the Ernley connection or connections, as I live in the parish of Bishops Cannings, though my address does not indicate that. I wonder if the Anne in the will was later misnamed Jane of the coffee table books. Anne seems to be of an earlier generation than the supposed Jane, daughter of the John d1571, whose monument is in the church. There are said to have been five John Ernleys in a row, so it may be difficult to prove which one was the father of our Anne.

I notice from the Hants Visitation Vincent had a daughter, Ellinor, but she must be too early for my William Grinfield.

A recent reply from the Wilts FHS Nimrod Index tells me of:
No marriage found of William Grinfield and Ellinor Goddard.
1695 Nov 19 Mr William Greenfeild of Marlborough and Mrs Mary Goddard at Salisbury Cathedral. They look like mine.
1740 Nov 30 Mr Edward Grinfield of Ogbourne St George to Mrs Ann Goddard by lic at Salisbury St Edmund. They too look like mine, though Edward was elsewhere described as of Lockeridge.

Bridget Danniell. My source for her is a photocopy, possibly of a photocopy of a handwritten tree supplied by Pamela Colman at the Devizes Museum in 1990. It would not copy again very well. It is called Goddards of Hartham. The first mentioned is Thomas of Ogbourne (will pr 1538). Wives are cut off unfortunately, but the children are all those of Anne Ernly, none of Jane Bradstone.

Apparently Thomas's widow married again in 1538 a George Raleigh?
The entry is Edward Goddard d1676 ' ? = 1 Bridget Danniell at
Melksham 1635/6', but the three is not clear. In the next
generation Edward (d1679) is described as kinsman of Jeffrey
Danniell and Richard Goddard of Clatford Esq.

My cousin, Martin Pinnell in Australia will be interested in
these corrections, as will my nephew, Alastair Kinross.
