Dear Brian,

I enclose two photos which I took in Rousham Church recently. Rousham is a small hamlet with a lovely house and garden, landscaped by William Kent, on the River Cherwell between Banbury and Oxford. Steeple Barton is about five miles west of Rousham.

The Victorian superscript on the tomb says:

The Effigies of John Dormer who died AD 1581 and of his Wife Elizabeth Goddard. Removed 1851 from the Chancel of Steeple Barton Church.

The following notice is also in the Church:

The small lancet window to the west of the entrance has glass brought from the Manor House at Seswells Barton, inserted here as a memorial to General James Dormer in 1742. The arms and initials are those of Sir John Dormer and Elizabeth Goddard, who built that manor house in 1580, and whose kneeling figures are in the niche in the Chantry Chapel (brought here from Steeple Barton in 1851.)

The Arms are obviously those of the Clyffe Pypard/Swindon family, but the only Elizabeth in the 1989 edition of your databank who would fit is number 01035 - and you do not mention Sir John Dormer in that edition. Can you place this poor Elizabeth, who lost her husband just one year after they had built their new manor house?

We shall be going to the AGM this year - as Swindon is now much more convenient for us than Buxton! - and I will hope to see you there. So dont bother to write if you are coming, but please let me have my photos back then.

An estate at Lyford, consisting of 3 hides, was held of the Abbot of
Abingdon at the

Domesday Survey by Rainald, the ancestor of the Helen family, and this
part

of Lyford followed the descent of St. Helen for two centuries. In 1428
Thomas More and others held the land which had belonged to Philip de St
Helen. It was doubtless his estate which came to be known as More Place
and

appears in the 16th century in the hands of the Yate family. John Yate
died

in possessed in 1541.

Was commemorated in Longworth church, by a brass plate (now missing) set
in

a gravestone which lay on the south side of the chancel and was
inscribed:

Of your Charity pray for the Soule of John Yate, Merchant of the Stapull
at

Calais, and Johanne his Wife, the which John deceased the ... dau of ...
in

the Yeare of our Lord, MD ... The said Johan deceased the XIVth Day of
Aprill, MDIX.

The brass also represents his four daughters by his first wife?

Will written 1537, proved 1541 [this needs checking - Charney Bassett
book

p.16 suggests John is still alive in 1545].

Manor of Kentwood: OJohn Swafield and his wife Elizabeth, the tenants of
the

other moeity of the manor, were in seisin in 1509, when they granted
their

interest in it to John Yate, Edmund Bury and Robert Hide, probably
trustees

of James Yate and his wife Mary, who owned it in 1526. James and Mary
granted it to William Fettiplace in that year with a quitclaim from the
heirs of Mary. From this time the whole manor of Kentwood was held by
the

Fettiplace family.¹
