Thank you for responding to my inquiries concerning Enoch Hubbard. Your letter was very informative and after receiving it, I went to our State Library in Grants and checked some more on the IGI. As you mentioned, I found the parents of Charlotte Mayfield and their other children, which I had not been able to do previously. I believe our Enoch Hubbard married Hannah Coates, and I'm not sure how the two families are related, but I think it's likely that they are. I really enjoyed the information you sent about Northhamshire up to 1855. If you could photocopy your book I would very much appreciate your efforts. I'm enclosing a check for \$5.00 to cover the expenses. If this is not sufficient, please let me know and I will reimburse you.

The 1791 birthdate we had for Enoch could have been a typographical error or miscommunication as it was taken from family records. I noticed that the IGI records were mostly taken from extraction.

Yes, I am a Mormon. In fact, I served a mission to England for eighteen months between Sept. 1966 and March, 1968. I was mostly in Reading where our mission headquarters was, but one time our mission president took us up to Nottinghamshire to the Royal Dalton factory and I was able to see just a little of the beautiful countryside and think that my ancestors came from that area. It gave me a good feeling. It's kind of interesting that I met my future husband while I was in England. He was also a Mormon missionary. We'd both like to visit England again sometimes.

I have enclosed the family history of Henry Holland and Hannah Astill. When I made the copy I got the paper a little close on the left hand margin and took off a few letters especially on the second page. I hope you'll still be able to read it. You, those ancestors didn't know what hardships lay in front of them but they did have the courage to leave their friends and homeland to go to the unknown as a prophet of God had asked them to do. I admire

their faith and perseverance.

I've also enclosed 2 pedigree charts mainly on the Astells. On sheet #1 Hazel Maul Hubbard is my grandmother on my mother's side of the family. You will notice that Hannah Astell (#5) and John Astell (14) were sister and brother. Besides working on the Hubbard line, we'd like to find more about Harriet Wille and her parents to your hints connect with any of ours? I do not have any information (biographies) on them, unfortunately, but as you can see most of them came from Plumtree (or Plumtree). Can you tell me anything about this parish?

I will probably hire a researcher that is a member of the church and lives in Salt Lake. He is very familiar with the parish records, but I appreciate your recommendations, and will keep your letter in my file for future reference.

Dear Mrs McNeill,

Thank you for your very interesting family tree and biography. I am sorry that you have had to wait for the photocopy from the book on Nottingham, but someone had borrowed the book and I had to wait until it was returned.

I should very much like to be permitted to refer to the family details you have given in any further articles I write about the Mormon migration from England. There is very little published about the subject in this country. I will enclose one article I have already written to show the type of article I write. Dr LaMar Berrett of Brigham Young Univeristy will give me a good character. I should also like to write a little piece about your family for the Goddard newsletter.

I think that the photocopy of the chapter about Nottingham will answer your enquiry about Plumtree parish. I have marked the place. A book entirely about the city would tell you more. I am visiting my sister who lives 15 miles from Nottingham tomorrow and will ask her to obtain one of the Nottingham council's leaflets when next she visits. I cannot see any immediate connection between our Astills and yours - except that they must have been of the same family at one time in the distant past.

Your enquiry for other Goddards who are descended from Enoch Goddards appeared in our Newsletter recently. Did you have anyone contact you?

Thank you for the cheque for the postage. It is surprising how few people send anything to reimburse me.

Dear Mrs Goddard,

I am trying to trace my Goddard ancestors and have not, as yet, had much success.

My grandmother's maiden name was CLARA GODDARD and she was the second child of BENJAMIN and EMILY ANN GODDARD ^(born on 29/3/1868) - Emily Ann's maiden name was POLBARD. She married THOMAS LEIVERS on the 6th November 1889 at Kimberley, Nottingham.

I think her grandfather's name was also BENJAMIN & he probably married ANN HANSON - but I am not sure of this.

They originate from TAG HILL, Heanor, Derbyshire and were connected with the Wesleyan Methodist Church - and as they were Non Conformists it is making the tracing of them more difficult.

I have been advised also to try GODHARD and GOSHARD, but have not had much success yet.

If you could provide me with any information, or could advise me where to write, I would appreciate it very much.

Dear Mrs. Handley,

thank you for your letter of the 8th June, we are sorry that we have not replied before, what with holidays and what with one thing or another we have been a little overwhelmed. We do not have any direct information that we can give you at this time on your family, however, we do have at least two family groups being researched in Derbyshire who are predominately Methodists and who have several relatives named Benjamin. (normally an uncommon Goddard name). There is a group of Goddards that who were mainly lead miners initially based around Stoney Middleton from about 1750, this family had several Benjamins, Georges and Joels, are they names that ring a bell with you?

The other families that are known to have the odd Benjamin or two are from around Chapel en le Frith and Stockport, they are all strongly chapel, probably three distinct families who do not inter-marry, one family of farmers, another of stonemasons and builders and there was another of carriers. These families have been partially researched from about 1700 to the present, but there are large gaps, as usually only the direct descendants of the present researchers have been followed back

In order to be able to tie your family to one of these families, or not as the case may be, we need more information and as an aid I ask the following questions.

1. Can you draw a family tree for the generation you have.
2. Have you been able to find the family on the census for 1861, 1871, 1881, or 1891? All the earlier census returns should now be available from your local reference library or more likely, through the local history association. Information from these will give place of birth, trade approximate age etc., and possibly other members of the family which may help to form a pattern for you to follow back.
3. Can you get a copy of the marriage certificate for Benjamin and Emily and the birth certificate for Clara, both will be available from The General Register Office, St Catherine's House London. They will give you considerable information which may help in your search.

Enclosed is a copy of two pages from The Dictionary of Genealogy giving a few local addresses, but for real local help on all related topics please get in touch with the both the Derbyshire and the Nottinghamshire Family History Soc., you will find that they will be able to give you real help.

If you can give us a little more information we should be able to put you in touch with the particular researcher who is presently doing the same family group as yourself, if luck is on our side! Please let us know how you get on and if we can give further help.

Thank you for your letter.

One of our members, Mrs G. Handley, of [redacted] East [redacted] 10
3EQ, has a family tree with some similar family names - Goddard and Leivers- and originating
from Greasley.

I am sending your letter on to her. Between you it could be that you can construct a fuller
family tree. Remember that there were many non-conformists (that is people who were not
members of the Church of England) and therefore their baptisms and marriages are not re-
corded in parish registers.

The Goddard Association is hoping to print a booklet on the Derbyshire Goddards around
about Christmas (price about £3). Many of the families were very large and it could be that
some members spread out into neighbouring Nottinghamshire.
