

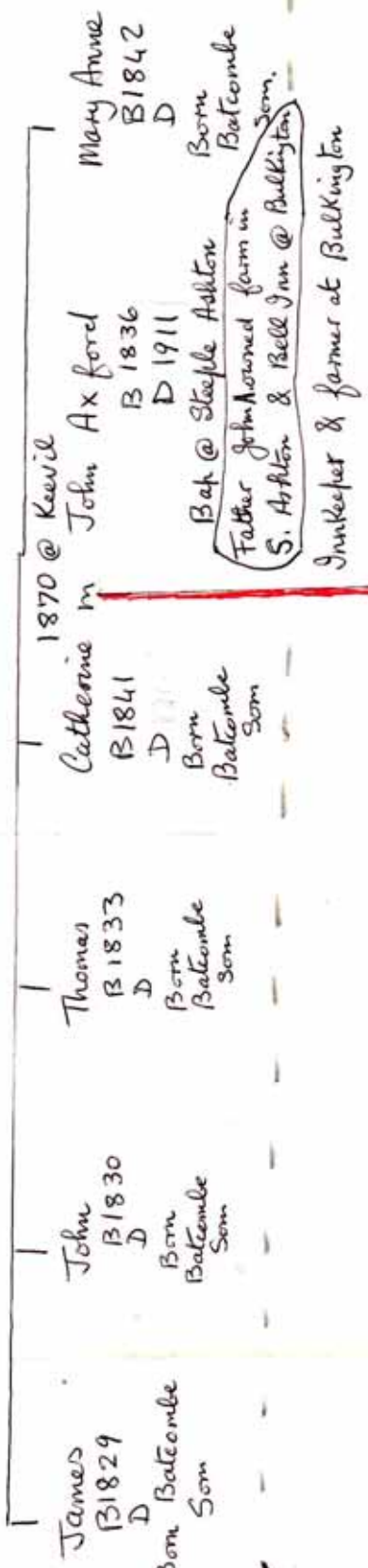

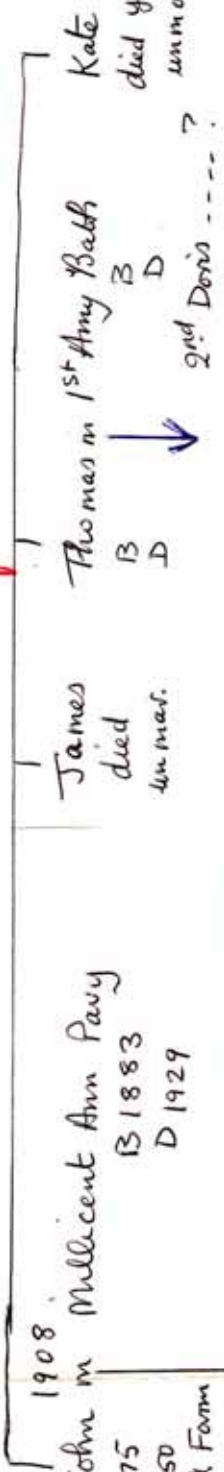

This is the last will and Testament of
Thomas Goddard son of Batcombe in the County of Somerset
Yeoman made this Twenty seventh day of January one thousand eight
hundred and thirty four as follows that is to say I give and bequeath
unto my wife Dorothy Goddard all my Farming Stock Goods and
Chattles Implements in Hewlantry & all my money personal Estates
Securities and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever during the term of her
natural life for her own use and benefit and at her decease or
within Twelve months after to be sold or valued and the money
arising from such sale or valuation to be divided equally between
my six children named as follows William James Sarah Ann
Dorothy and Elizabeth my son Thomas excepted having received his
share of my Property at the time of his Marriage) and if either of the
above named Children should die before their Mother then his or
her share to be equally divided between his or her Children if any
but if no Children then his or her share to be equally divided
between the then surviving Mothers and sisters named as above And
I hereby nominate and appoint William Goddard, Yeoman, and

James Gibbons, Coar, of the Parish of Batecombe joint Executor in
Trust of the my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty seventh day of
January one thousand eight hundred and thirty four - The mark of

APPEARED personally *William Colledge* of the Parish of *Batcombe* in the County of *Somerset* Yeoman and *James Gibbons* of the same Parish Baker the joint Executors in trust

Executors named in the last Will and Testament of the said *Thomas Goddard* late of *Batcombe* aforesaid Yeoman

who died on the *twenty seventh* day of *February* 1831, And made oath and said that the Personal Estate and Effects of the said Deceased, for or in respect of which a Probate of the said Will is to be granted by the said Court, exclusive of what the Deceased may have been possessed of or intitled to as a Trustee for any other Person or Persons, and not beneficially, and without deducting any thing on account of the Debts due and owing from the Deceased, are under the value of *Two Hundred*

Pounds to the best of these *Deponents* knowledge, information and belief. AND they lastly made oath and said that the said Deceased was not at the time of his death possessed of or intitled to any Leasehold Estate or Estates for Years, either absolute or determinable on a Life or Lives to the best of their knowledge, information and belief.

This is the last Will and Testament of me Ann

Goddard of Bayford within the parish of Stoke Newington in the County of Middlesex as follows, that is to say, Whereas I am seized or possessed of a certain undivided Share or Interest of and in the Dwellinghouse Garden Yarnbarton and premises at ibingford aforesaid now occupied by me together with Mr. John Buppell and Wife my Mother the Executors and occupiers of the several other undivided Shares part or Interest therein and my personal property and Effects is in the Hands of the said John Buppell and used in the Way of his Trade carried on for the Profit and Support of all of us and my said Share of and in the said Real and Personal property is in my Estimation of the Value of One hundred and Eighty five pounds six Shillings and eight pence Now it is my Will and I do hereby give devise and bequeath my said undivided Share parts and Interest of and in the said Dwellinghouse Garden and Yarnbarton with the Appurtenances And also all my personal Estate and Effects unto my friend and Neighbour Mr. John Inge In Trust to permit and suffer the said

John Duffell and my said Mother to have hold and enjoy my said undivided Share or parts on the said Dwellinghouse and premises with the Appurtenances during their natural lives and the life of the Survivor of them and also to possess my said personal Estate and Effects for the purpose of continuing the Trade now carrying on during their natural lives and the life of the Survivor of them And on the death of the Survivor of them or at any time during their lives or the life of the Survivor of them it is my Will and desire that if the said John Duffell his Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns shall pay into the Hands of the said Heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns the said Sum of One

Hundred Eighty five Pounds six Shillings and Eight pence to be by him applied in manner hereinafter mentioned that then and from thenceforth my said undivided Share or parts of and in the said Dwellinghouse Garden Barn Barton and Appurtenances And also all my and personal Estate shall become and be vested in the said John Duffell his Heirs Executors Administrators

Will of Thomas Goddard, senior, of Batcombe: yeoman: proved 1834.

This is the last will & testament of Thomas Goddard, senior, of Batcombe, in the county of Somerset: yeoman: made this 27th day of January, 1834 as follows (that is to say)

I give & bequeath unto my wife Dorothy Goddard all my farming stock, goods & chattels, implements in husbandry - all my money, personal estate securities & effects whatsoever & wheresoever, during the term of her ~~life~~ natural life, for her own use & benefit.

And at her decease or within 12 months after, to be sold or valued, & the money arising from such sale or valuation, to be divided equally between my 6 children named as follows

William - James - Sarah - Ann - Dorothy - & Elizabeth

My son Thomas excepted, having received his share of my property at the time of his marriage.

And if either of the above named children should die before their mother, then his or her share to be equally divided between his or her children, if any. But if no children, then his or her share to be equally divided between the then surviving mothers & sisters named as above.

And I hereby nominate & appoint William Colledge, yeoman, & James Gibbons baker, of the parish of Batcombe, joint executors in TRUST of this my last will & testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 27th day of January, 1834.

Will of Ann Goddard of Bayford, Stoke Trister: Somerset: spinster,
proved 1812.

This is the last will & testament of me Ann Goddard, of Bayford, in the parish of Stoke Trister, in the county of Somerset: spinster: as follows (that is to say)

Whereas I am seized or possessed of a certain undivided share or interest of & in the dwellinghouse, garden, yarbarton, & premises at Bayford, aforesaid, now occupied by me, together with Mr John Bussell & wife (my mother) the owners & occupiers of the several other undivided shares, parts or interest therein, & my personal property & effects is in the hands of the said John Bussell & used in the way of his trade in the said real & personal property is in my estimation of the value of £185.. 6.. 8d.

Now it is my will & I do hereby give, devise & bequeath my said undivided share, parts & interest of & in the said dwellinghouse, garden & yarbarton with the appurtenances, & also all my personal estate & effects unto my friend & neighbour Mr John Ings IN TRUST to permit & suffer the said John Bussell & my said mother to have, hold & enjoy my said undivided share or parts in the said dwellinghouse & premises with the appurtenances during their natural lives, & the life of the survivor of them. And also to possess my said personal estate & effects for the purpose of continuing the trade now carrying on during their natural lives & the life of the survivor of them.

And on the death of survivor of them, or at any time during the lives or the life of the survivor of them, it is my will & desire that if the said John Bussell, his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, shall pay unto the hands of the said John Ings, his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns the said sum of £185.. 6.. 8d - to be by him applied in manner hereinafter mentioned - that then & from thenceforth, my said undivided share or parts of & in the said dwellinghouse, garden, yarbarton & appurtenances, & also all my said personal estate shall become & be vested in the said John Bussell, his heirs, executors, administrators & assigns subject only to my mothers estate & interest therein hereby given her.

But if the heirs, executors, administrators or assigns of the said John Bussell shall neglect or refuse for the space of one year after his death to pay the said sum of money- then it is my will & I do authorize & desire the said John Ings, his heirs, executors or administrators to call in & collect my said personal estate, & also ~~to~~ sell & dispose of my said undivided share or parts for the best price that can be obtained for the same, either by public auction or private contract, as to him or them shall appear most advantageous.

And I do declare that the receipt of my said trustee, his heirs, executors or administrators shall be a sufficient discharge to the purchaser of my said real estate for the consideration paid.

And it is my will that the said sum of £185.. 6.. 8d. if paid, & my said real & personal estate taken by the said John Bussell, his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns. And if not paid by him or them, but my said real & personal estate disposed of by my said Trustee in the manner above authorized & directed - then that the said sum, or the produce of the said sale be applied by my said Trustee in the following manner.

Will of Ann Goddard, of Bayford, Stoke Trister, Somerset: spinster:
proved 1812: cont.

.....(that is to say) Two third parts of the said sum or produce for the sole use & benefit of my sister Elizabeth, the wife of Mr John Knight (but not to be subject to his contròl or engagements, but to hers only, as if she were unmarried)

And the remaining one third part of the said sum or produce of the said sale unto & for the benefit of my niece the daughter of my late sister Mary Lander, deceased.

And I give the same sums or legacies unto my said sister Elizabeth Knight & niece Ann Lander in the said proportions accordingly.

I appoint the said John Bussell & John Ings executors in trust of this my will, which I declare to be my last will & testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20th December 1810.
