

Extract from Br. Kearney's "West Twyford"

p. 42. Twyford Abbey Farm

Robert Cook resided at Twyford Abbey Farm from at least 1851 to 1862, it may have been later but not after 1868 as the name of the new Tenant of Twyford Abbey Farm appears in the register of [the] Church of West Twyford. A son of James Alexander and Hannah Goddard was baptised at St Mary's West Twyford on 10th April 1868 and was given the name Arthur James and the following year another son was baptised and received the name Alfred John. In 1870 James Goddard had all the estate of ~~the~~ Twyford Abbey held by Robert Cook except that of the "plantation" which was apparently held by Andrew J. Holy. In 1878 the land around Twyford Abbey was let as ~~has~~ ^{has} already been shown above, this means that by the time the Goddard family had ceased to rent the ground ^{only} the house itself (sic) This was due no doubt to the death of James Goddard on 7th November 1877 at Twyford Abbey Farm. He was then 64 years of age and was buried at West Twyford on the 12th November. He was succeeded by his ^{mother} [son?] William who resided at the Farm.

.... There were also other changes in the district of West Twyford. The Goddard farm and livestock were sold on the 12th September 1902.

.... Richard Goddard had also a farm next to Clayton's Farm (it would appear that the combined

James was (sic) the James James of Robert Cook and James Goddard), but she did not reside at West Twyford but at College Farm, Wotton Bassett. (c.1925??)

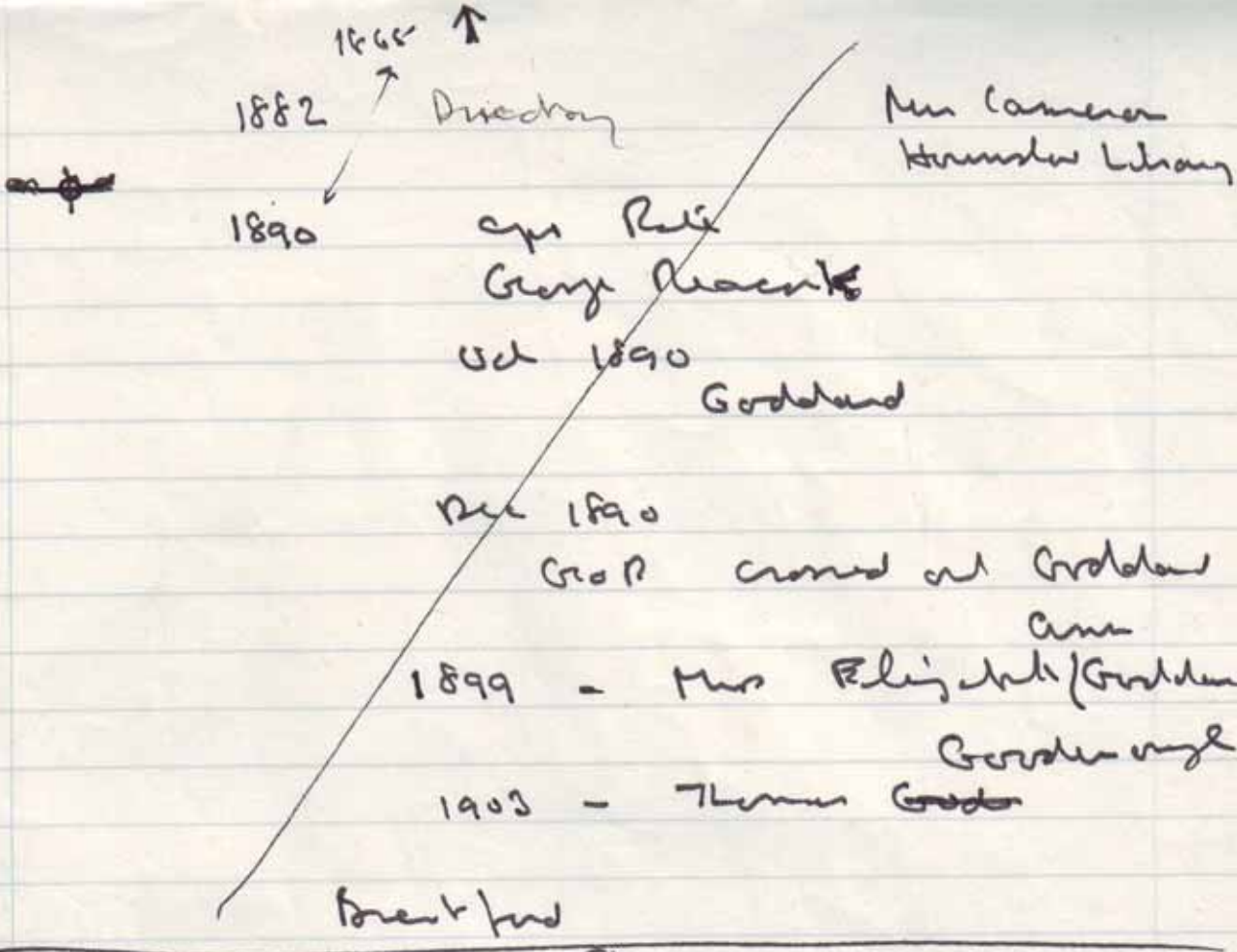
William 1878-1890 Twyford Abbey Farm

Extract from West Twyford Middlesex - Holmes (EERE 24)

p.42

West Twyford Manor House had been for some years in the occupation of James.... Thomas William* built a farmhouse adjoining the old farm buildings. The newer and larger house, on the south side of the road, was built about 1874 by Mr. Goddard.

 Lockwood's occupancy (tenancy) of Wyke must have
 been during this period. NOTE George Lockwood Peasants
 leased Wyke Farm to Peasants 1885.
