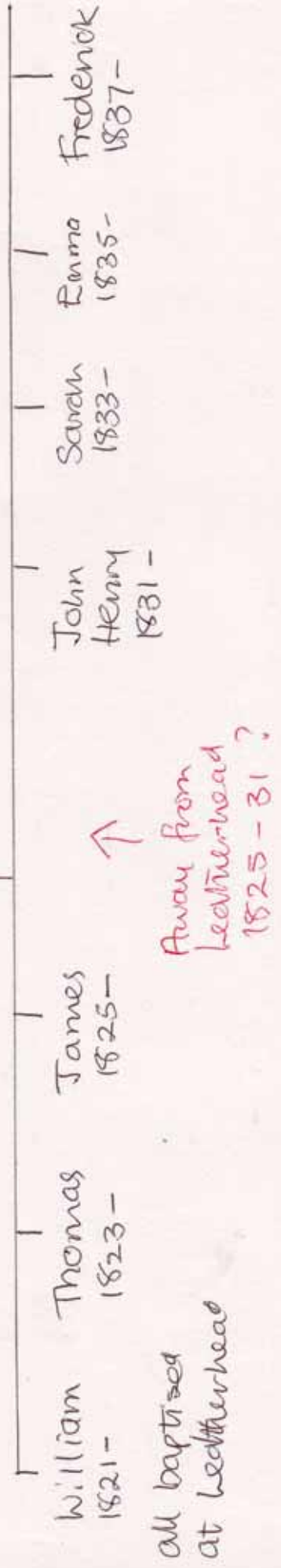

James Goddard a gardener
died in Workhouse on 16 Oct 1882
& his son William of Richmond
reported his death to the Registrar
In the 1881 census he is presumably
the same man was recorded
in the workhouse as being aged 76
& having been born at Heathhead
he was described as a Farm labourer.

Dear Mrs Goddard,

Thank you for your letter and enclosed
envelope (which I've promptly lost! - I passed it
on to my husband to read + it has sailed!!) I
think it read as £7.50 for the fee, which I
enclose.

I do have the death Certificate of James
Goddard, a cooper, who died in the Workhouse
16. 10. 1882 - the Informant was his son, William
Our family did have William, who married Charlotte
nee Ayling (on Ailing - both forms on the marriage cert.)
His son, Walter, was my grandfather's father. I'm
not, however, certain about the James Goddard, above.
William's father was certainly James Goddard
William was married in Lambeth and gave
his address as Nine Elms. James' wife was Sarah
and we have a certificate awarded to them
by the Prince Consort's Association, Windsor, which
does seem to place them there.
William's marriage was June 22, 1845 and
he gave his age as "full".

Dear Mr Goddard,

I have traced my Goddard
ancestors back to James and Sarah
Goddard, who farmed at New Windsor,
Berkshire. I wonder if you have
any information about that branch.

I have a certificate presented to him on
14th July 1864 from the Prince Consort's
Association and his death certificate of
16th October 1882 - he was 84 years old.
I have details of his sons etc but want to
regress through James and his wife.

It was suggested that you might
be able to help me.
