If anything is found on Fredericks birth I would be very pleased to find out. Ann Marias birth had eluded me for many years because her Christian names were 'back to front'. She died at 872, Mill Street Walsall in March 1905 and is buried in Ryecroft Cemetery, Walsall. She had ten children with Samuel Henry Orme.

Frederick Goddard died February 1867 aged 45 at the Workhouse, Walsall. He is buried in Queen St Cemetery, Walsall

My husband's great, great grandmother had the maiden name of Goddard and I would be happy to send you the information / certificates which I have on this branch of the family.

Briefly Ann Maria Goddard married Samuel Henry Orme at Rushall? Parish Church 23.12.1871. She went on to have several Rushalls. eight sons and two daughters, and died in March 1905 aged ~~72~~ 54.

A friend has recently found her birth certificate on which she is registered as Maria Ann (just to confuse me).

Dear Mr Carroll,

I consulted the 1881 census of Staffordshire on your behalf and found the following:

John Goddard aged 45 Head of the family. Coal Miner. Born in Oldham Lancashire
Sarah Ann Goddard aged 44 . Wife of John. Born Cheshire, Macclesfield.
Mary Goddard aged 16. Daughter of John. Servant. Born Golden Hill
William Goddard aged 13. Son of John. Scholar. Born Golden Hill.
Samuel Goddard. Aged 10. Son of John. Born Golden Hill.
Rose Ann Goddard. Aged 8. Daughter of John. Born Golden Hill.
Sarah Ann Goddard. Aged 5 months. Daughter of John Born. Golden Hill.
Jos[eph] Alfred Goddard. Aged 5 months. Son of John. Born Golden Hill.

I then looked at the I.G.I. for Lancashire (in which Oldham is) and found an entry

John Goddard son of Jonathan **Born** 1836 [no further date] in Oldham

There is also mention in the I.G.I. of a "Mrs Jonathan Goddard" and it looks to me as if someone has compiled a **theoretical** family tree and passed this on to the Mormon Church for inclusion in the latest, 1992, edition of the I.G.I. Unfortunately, in my opinion, the LDS (Mormon Church) are now including this dubious sort of in-put. By reading the preliminary instruction microfiche at the beginning of the I.G.I. you should be able to get the key reference number to enable you to obtain from the LDS the name of the person who in-put the information who is probably related to you through one of the other children of Jonathan Goddard.

I checked the Cheshire I.G.I. fiche for the marriage of John Goddard and a Sarah Ann about 1861, but there was nothing relevant.

It is a pleasure to help out fellow Goddards and members of the Goddard Associations.
