Dear Beth,

Very many thanks for your eagerly awaited letter of the 6th. I am digesting the contents. The end of your letter took me by surprise - SIR DANIEL. That I did not know.

Following our telephone conversation I did some research at Tacket Street Church (near Christ Church). In 1900 the foundation stones of a new Church Hall - named Langston Hall - were laid. There were ten, including one which reads:

THIS STONE WAS LAID BY
D FORD GODDARD, ESQ, M.P.
JULY 27TH 1900

The following day (Sat. 28th) there was a full report in the East Anglian Daily Times (E.A.D.T) including a report on Mr. Goddard's comments on the occasion. I have yet to check when the hall was actually opened but they were aiming for 13 months.

I did some research on Daniel Ford Goddard's line. I do not presently have evidence of birth (except from Who's Who - I wonder what evidence they need?) However the 1881 census shows him at 5 Holywells Road (house now demolished - all commercial now). The entry reads:

Elizabeth H. GODDARD Wife M Female 30 Bramford, Suffolk
Ellen S. HITCHCOCK Sister In Law U Female 55 Bramford, Suffolk
Francis SHEPPARD Servt U Female 20 Bacton, Suffolk, General Servant
Phillis A. HAWKINS Servt U Female 18 Runcorn, Lancs (sic) General Servant

I have not checked 1901 - expect to do so tomorrow. This entry gives a 1850 birth date. I imagine Ellen to be mother-in-law.

A report in Ipswich Journal in August 1900 showed a full list of Council members moving on a beside the names of those absent - which included Ald. Goddard.

The 1851 Census entry shows Daniel to be the son of Ebenezer Goddard. The full entry is:

The IGI showed:

Ebenezer Goddard, son of Daniel Poole Goddard & Lucy, chr. 29 April 1816 at Tacket Street Ind.

Boyd showed:

Daniel P. Goddard m. Lucy Hale (sic) 1806 St. Mary le Tower (the Civic Church in Ipswich).

The marriage entry reads:

DANIEL P. GODDARD of ST. Mary Key, singleman and LUCY HAILL (sic) of this parish, spinster married by Banns 14 August 1806, in the presence of Charlotte Atkinson and Charlotte Wright. Lucy signed as HAILL.

I had a look at the Wills Index, which included:

The will of Daniel Poole Goddard shows eight children

DANIEL HAILL GODDARD, EBENEZER, LYDIA ATKINSON, SAMUEL, SARAH wife of Rev. Henry Hollis of Framlingham, LUCY CAROLINE, MARY FRANCES and MARTHA ANN NOTCUTT.

Will made 28 Jan 1836, Executors Daniel Hail Goddard & Ebenezer Goddard. Witnesses J. A. Notcutt King & J. Beaumont.

Will proved 4 January 1843. Effects sworn under £1,000. Testator died 23 October 1842.

I got stuck on Daniel Poole Goddard. I had his main age but no Birth or Baptism until your letter arrived.

The IGI for London shows:

GODDARD, DANIEL P. son of DANIEL GODDARD and MARY chr. 15 December 1783, STEPNEY, BULL LANE IND.

While IGI entries need verification, Stepney is out of range and records will be at London Metropolitan Archive not far from FRC.

I would expect that the mother of Daniel Poole Goddard is MARY POOLE. Maybe Daniel Poole Goddard's father is Daniel - born 1750 at Heveningham - and married to Mary (Poole) circa 1775.

Another generation and we are on to either your No. 6 or No. 7. No. 6 is Daniel (1721) while No. 7 is Don or Daniel (1726) born, respectively at Walpole and Rendham, EXCEPT that 1721 Daniel was born at Swefling - baptised at Walpole Ind.

My view is that 1721 Daniel married Elizabeth Coleman. Certainly my Mary is the daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth (wid. Coleman). When Daniel married Elizabeth Coleman he was a widower and she a widow. That was in 1764. Mary arrived in 1765.

On 14 July 1745, Daniel Goddard, singleman married Mary Gardner of S. Elmham St. James, singlewoman at UBBESTON I have transcribed the entry and intend to photocopy it as I cannot read Daniel's parish and that may be crucial. I still need the previous marriage of Elizabeth Coleman - Husband I believe was William and, probably, married in 1740s, somewhere in the Swefling/Rendham area.

I am trying to link Daniel Ford Goddard's line with mine. I can get to 1720s without too much trouble. Also there is the task of linking your line with mine - maybe a little earlier?

That is all for now. I await your comments and look forward to hearing from you again.

P.S. I would expect that Sir Daniel's mother was Anne Sarah FORD. IGI doesn't show marriage (BERKS).

Studied Chemistry in London and Newcastle. Succeeded father as Engineer and Secretary Ipswich Gas Co. 1877-87. Mayor of Ipswich 1891. Contested Ipswich 1892. Chairman Ipswich Gas Co. since 1887. Founded and built Ipswich Social Settlement at cost of £11,000. Recreations: travelling, golf, photography.

I have not checked Who was Who - or reports in East Anglian Daily Times at times of election, knighthoods or death (1922 -?).

Dear Beth,

Please find a copy of 1721 Baptism of Daniel. But, who is father? G'n is probable, too early for Gordon. IGI has Jn. (for John?). The registers are not in Latin and you came up with Daniel (and Ann)!

After the photocopy I decided to look for the marriage on Boyd, (rather than IGI as I did not know the initial).

Three successive entries under Goddard:

1718 Dan and Mary Goddard, Bury St. Edmunds St. James.

1719 Dan and Ann Cranmer Carlton

1720 Dan and Eliz Rook Sibton

How many Daniels is that?

At Bury St. Edmunds, St. James I found:

Feb. 13, 1718/19 Daniell (sic) Goddard single and Mary Goddard, wid., ye both
???

At Carlton:

Daniel Goddard widr. And Ann Cranmer singlewoman, both of Bruisyard were married October 19, 1719.

At Sibton:

Daniel Goddard and Eliz Rook, May 24, 1720

This entry was in Latin and I could not decipher Eliz's christian name. I believe the Latin for Elizabeth is Elizabethore (probably diphthong) but it did not look like that.

I would agree that Daniel (1721) should be the son of Daniel and Ann - about the right time.

I have not checked burials for the wives, or for one or more Daniels. Did, in 1718, Daniel marry his sister-in law? If Daniel and Ann were 'both of Bruisyard' why did they marry in Carlton?

The Church at Walpole goes back to 1647, but the records do not although they do pre-date the arrival in 1721 of a new incumbent. Records date from around 1700.

Looking again at your letter we should also be looking for the marriage of Robert and Ann, your ggggg-grandfather. (Robert buried 1753 Dennington) and Ann's burial or even re-marriage.

My Goddards do not (as far as I am aware) have any connection with Essex, but maybe I can find out more on Frederick Ernest Goddard's family on a visit to Essex RO at Colchester (see later) where the register should be. It may be on microfiche.

Back to these three marriages on Boyd.

I suggest that in 1718 Mary was older than Daniel, and in 1719 Daniel was older than Ann. If this is three marriages for the one Daniel then Daniel was older than Eliz Rook (unless she was a widow).

I do not think this is crucial. It does not matter if some of that is not as I see it, but it is something to work on.

Dear Robert,

Sorry about the delay in replying to your letters. I had this letter ready to send and then your letter arrived with the information you had found out at Ipswich. Hence the further delay.

It seems we have connections with two different Goddard families, both of which ended up in Sweffling, though a comment in the chapel records in 1866 about a James in my line said he was "a descendant of the person at whose residence at Sweffling the cause of God first commenced" and I believe this was one of the Daniels.

I've had a look at the internet IGI to see what I could find out about the multiplicity of Daniels. Unfortunately most of the information has been submitted by LDS members, rather than from transcriptions from parish records, so it needs to be viewed with some suspicion (there seems to be much confusion among the submitters). I've tried to sort them out and am becoming more and more confused. I think I'll just print it out and see if you can make any sense of it. It might give you some ideas of where to look.

I received some notes made by the late Miss Kathleen Millicent Goddard, who was descended from my Robert and Ann. She lived at the Old Manse in Rendham and was a prominent member of the Chapel. Miss Goddard made arrangements for grave stones with Goddard connections to be moved across the road to the little URC cemetery when the Chapel closed. Unfortunately they were all laid flat and ivy and weather are having their effect. Here is the inscription on Daniel's and Elizabeth's stone (taken from the transcription made by WI members) which was one of the stones moved.

87. S/S H/S fallen (Small) 5.
DANI GODDARD/ died Dec 9 1800/ aged 79 years/ ELIZth his wife/ died
April 13 1792/ aged 67 years

Miss Goddard also gave some notes she had made about the Sweffling Old Meeting House and the "Daniel" branch to the people who now live in the building which was the Old Meeting House. (They are also Goddards, but Wiltshire Goddards!) I believe Daniel and family lived there after the Rendham Chapel was built to house the growing congregation. I have a copy of these notes. Her writing is not very easy to decipher and it is not a very good copy, but this is what I think the notes say. (I have had another thought about why the 1721 Daniel might have been baptised at Walpole. Perhaps his mother came from there and went home for the birth of her first child. I believe that sometimes happened. There are also references to a Goody Goddard. Could this be the reason for what looks like a G on the PR copy?) It looks as if there could be several Daniels at the OMH/Chapel at the same time.

There are question marks where it is not clear:

1694-1720	Daniel Goddard and Wid. Goddard members.
1718	First mention of Daniel Goddard as a Trustee.
1720	Addition to the property at Sweffling called "The Old Meeting House" to seat 120 persons. 6 Directors were appointed, Daniel Goddard of Bruisyard being one.
1721	Daniel Goddard born. Parents Daniel and Ann. Record of baptism in Walpole Chapel.
1722	List of members when Samuel Manning came. Daniel senior and Goody Goddard.
1724 - 1730	Sisters, Anne 1724, Sarah 1728, Sarah 1730, all baptised by Samuel Manning at Sweffling Old Meeting House. (<i>The IGI has parents of Anne and the first Sarah as D and Mary WIX and the second Sarah as D and Anne.</i>)
1734	The Trustees appointed Daniel Goddard a Director. At this date there were a senior and junior Daniel Goddard recorded as yeomen of Sweffling, both trustees. They gave £4-10s to the New House (Manse) Fund.
1740-1741	One Daniel was dead and also Wid Goddard mentioned above.

1740 1740 cont'd	Younger Daniel was 19 when his father died. He was executor with William Chaplin. He inherited everything, but had to pay annuities to his Mother and sisters and let them live in part of the house.
1744	Daniel married Mary Gardiner at Peasehall.
	Children baptised, Daniel 1746, Ann 1749, Samuel 1750 by Dr Wood
1749	Two Daniel Goddards on the Trustee List, one has Merchant Tailor after his name.
1750	New chapel open. Old Meeting House let as living accommodation. A letter with the deeds says Daniel Goddard was a tenant until 1793.
1752	Wife Mary died.
1749-1756	Tailor of Sweffling. 1756 Merchant Taylor on Rendham Chapel books.
1758	His sister Ann, who was ill, made her will and he was executor. His Mother and family mentioned. Mother died 1763, Ann 1785(?)
1762	Member and Deacon of Rendham Congregational Chapel. His sister Sarah had married Francis(?) Freeman and he was present when their daughter Ann was baptised privately.
1764	Daniel now a widower married Elizabeth Colman at Sweffling parish(?) church(?). The Colmans were tenants of one of the Sweffling O M House cottages.
1764-1770	2 daughters of second marriage, Mary 1764, Jamima 1770
1771	Daniel and his sons of his first marriage Daniel and Samuel were all Trustees of the Old Meeting House, Sweffling, which was now replaced by the larger Chapel at Rendham Many years Daniel made up the deficiencies in the Chapel Books.
1787	Daniel Goddard made up the money to settle the Church accounts.
1792 & 1800	Elizabeth died. Daniel moved from Sweffling to Rendham. 1800 Daniel died. Gravestone at Rendham Ind. Chapel.

The notes say that there had been three generations of Daniels at the OMH/Chapel, possibly four. (It's very confusing trying to sort out the above. She (KMG) and her brother had access to the chapel records and it looks as if she wasn't quite sure who was who.)

There are also the following notes:

The younger Daniel (bapt. 1746) went to Stepney, London, then to Ipswich. Buried in vault at Tacket St. Independent Chapel, Ipswich, 1813.

Daniel Poole Goddard, born at Stepney, 1785. Married Lucy Hale 1806 at St. Mary(? it's gone off the edge of the page here). 1842 Buried in vault Tacket St. Ind Ch.

They had 11 children. 8 mentioned in will. The other 3 died young.

Daniel Hall Goddard 1810-1883. Agent Bank of England.

Rev. Algernon Goddard BA. (There's another line below this, but it is half off my copy and I cannot read it. I think he must be a son of Daniel Hall Goddard.)

Alderman Ebenezer Goddard JP 1816-1877. 1son and 2 daughters.

Sir Daniel Ford Goddard 1880-1922 MP in Ipswich for?.

Thank you very much for sending the Suffolk Non-conformist Goddards' family tree. It has added quite a lot to my knowledge. I thought perhaps you would be interested in the a bit more detail about my great-great-grand-parents, Benjamin (06416) and Sarah (nee Smith) (06417) and their descendants, from my notes, as Miss Goddard's tree only mentions two of their children and spouses (06432, 06433, 06434 and 06435) one of whom (06434) was my great-grandfather.

Descendants of Benjamin Goddard

Generation No. 1

1. BENJAMIN GODDARD was born 7th January 1807 in Sweffling, Suffolk. He was baptised at Rendham Independent Chapel on 8th September, 1807 and married SARAH SMITH 8th February 1838 in St. Mary the Virgin, Sweffling. He died July 1884 in Sweffling and was buried at St. Mary the Virgin, Sweffling, 26th July, 1884, aged 77. She died in Rendham and was buried at Sweffling 6th September, 1885.

Children of BENJAMIN GODDARD and SARAH SMITH are:

i. SARAH ANN GODDARD, b. Abt. 1838. Baptised at Sweffling Parish Church on 2nd September, 1838. Married CHARLES EMMERSON, 4 September 1859, St. Mary the Virgin, Sweffling.

2.* ii. JOHN GODDARD, b. Abt. 1839, Sweffling, Suffolk; d. 17th October 1915, Sweffling.
iii. ELIZA GODDARD, b. 1841; m. COLIN BOAST? (This is what I thought the IGI had, but I must recheck it), 27 January 1863, Rendham, Suffolk. Baptised at Sweffling on 30th May 1841. Recorded as Liza in 1851 census. (In the 1891 Census an Eliza Boost (born Abt. 1841) occurs, married to William Boost of Rendham. This must be the same Eliza, as my grandfather Charles Walter was a lodger in the same household, aged 12 and listed as nephew, so either she had remarried or there has been a transcription error. She had several children (at least 7 according to the 1891 census) but I don't suppose you are too interested as they are not Goddards.)

iv. EMMA GODDARD, b. Abt. 1843. Baptised at Sweffling on 19th November, 1843. Married GEORGE GOOCH, 3rd October 1864, St. Mary the Virgin, Sweffling.

3.** v. JOSHUA GODDARD, (my great-grandfather) b. Abt. 1845, Sweffling, Suffolk. Baptised at Sweffling, 20th April, 1845. d. September 1888, Sweffling. Buried Sweffling, 25th September, 1888.

vi. MARY GODDARD, b. Abt. 1847. Baptised at Sweffling on 11th July, 1847.

vii. LUCY ELLEN GODDARD, b. Abt. 1855. Baptised at Sweffling on 24th June, 1855.

*2. JOHN GODDARD was born Abt. 1839 in Sweffling, Suffolk, and married BETSY DANIELS (born Bruisyard) 7th August 1867 in St. Mary the Virgin, Sweffling, Suffolk. Dear Julie,

I have had some correspondence from Robert Wilby (not a Goddard Association member) about a Goddard family from Sweffling. My family (and that of the late Miss Kathleen Millicent Goddard) are descended from Robert and Ann Goddard, who married at Dennington and moved to Sweffling, but this was another Goddard family in the village, with whom mine seem to have no link even going back as far as the late 1600s.

Whereas my Goddards often named their eldest son Robert, the other family favoured the name Daniel. My branch never used Daniel as a first name and the Daniel branch never used Robert!

I know Miss Kathleen Goddard had looked into this family, but I have found nothing in her notes to indicate any connection between the two branches, in spite of the fact that both families were very active members of the Rendham Independent Chapel.

Robert Wilby has connections with the "Daniel family" and has spent some time at Ipswich Record Office looking into their history. I don't know if you would be interested in his findings, in case anyone enquires about this branch. The family moved to Ipswich and one of the Daniels (Sir Daniel Ford Goddard) became mayor and MP for Ipswich. Robert also traced quite a way back without finding a link between the two families and he sent me several long letters about his Goddards which my husband has transcribed. I asked Robert if he would mind if I forwarded the information to the Goddard Association and he was quite happy for me to do so.

I'm afraid I haven't edited the letters in any way. There are five Word documents. I wondered if you would be interested in adding them to the Goddard archive. If so I'll send them as attachments.
