Margaret,

Samuel's mother was a Margaret. I don't know her maiden name but she is shown on the 1851 Census living at Albion Road, Hackney, aged (I think) 65, born in Brancaster, Norfolk. She is living with her sons Samuel, 34, Accountant, William 28, Clerk Insurance Broker, her daughter Margaret Clarke, 32, Granddaughters Ellen and Mary A. Hudson 5 and 3. All this lot are shown as being born in Norwich St. Pauls. Also there is the son-in-law James Clarke, 30, clerk to a merchant born in Essex. I suppose that Samuel's mum Margaret could have married in Brancaster or Norwich St. Paul's but neither of these places have been transcribed and so it would be a matter of ploughing through the parish records to find the marriage.

Do you have the address that Samuel died at in Sudbury? And who was the informant on the death certificate?

Dear Julie,

Thank you for your letter. Yes, I have a photocopy of the page from the 1881 census showing Samuel and his wife and son. The Society of Genealogists found it for me at their open day in May. They also found me their daughter Annie Eliza and her husband and eldest son.

From the information my Grand mother gave me (Annie Eliza's eldest daughter), ~~the~~ Samuel did come from Norfolk. We also have in the family a small round table that came from Norwich. We had, until Mum broke it, a marble rolling pin that

also came from Norwich. Annie Eliza told her Grand-daughter, my Mum, that she used to go to stay with her Grand mother at Bracaster. I appreciate that Annie Eliza would have had two grand mothers. Catherine's family came originally from Wrobeck. I found her and her family in Hereford St<sup>London</sup> before she married. While looking through the Wrobeck records for the Newsham's, I found at least two Goddard families. I didn't send as much information to you as I intended. I am suffering from the complaint I am sure you do yourself, having collected more information than I have time to put on computer. Over all my families, I have over 11,000 entries.

I go to FRC about once every four weeks and my local library once a fortnight. I have been doing this

since November last year. I have got myself into a routine. I have collected all the McAlpin(e) etc on the IGI. I spend an hour on the Scotiabank link and an hour upstairs on the computer. I am at the moment doing a list of the McAlpin(e) on the Ancestral file. I spend some time collecting deaths and now births for three other families. My mother is quite interested in her Monk side and I have been looking at that family. George Monk married Annie Elezi Goddard. I thought a Monk/Shepherd marriage would be impossible to find but I have made great strides with that family. If I have the entries right, I have got the family back to 1730.

However, I have only spent a hour or two on Goddards. I did look on the IGI in Norfolk and on the computer at FRC

As you know the IGI is far from complete and there was no Samuel born 1816/7 in Norfolk. Mum said George Monk was sent to school in Norwich. To that end I found the details of Norwich School. I was delighted to see there was a P. Goddard on the current staff. I wrote to him in July. He was good enough to reply and pass my query on to the archivist. I am still awaiting a reply. I enquired as to whether Samuel, his sons Harry and Frank, and his son in law were actually at school there.

P. Goddard told me that there was a fire at Norwich Record office and some of the records were lost. The school itself which was refounded in 1500 has a lot of records. I have moved my caravan to a new site near High Wycombe, so perhaps next year I can

to go it up to Norfolk & Suffolk and do some research in that area. I have yet to study the Census in Norfolk. I have that CD Rom on order for the 3 county Censuses. I have been advised that I should have it soon.

I do spend sometime at F.R.C. on the census but I am usually following up leads I have found elsewhere.

I haven't been to Sudbury or looked at that census. His wife was buried in Chingford Mount and as far as I know we haven't any connection with Sudbury. Your Brian told me that when Samuel died in 1892 the London cemeteries were full and they used to put the coffins on a train to the nearest station they would accept them for burial.

As far as the occupations are concerned, Samuel was supposed to be an accountant. The family was wealthy enough for the

girls to be taught at home, - department etc. Grandma used to tell me how her Mother had to walk with a broom handle through her arms and books on her head. They were taught needlework, embroidery etc. I heard that Samuel lost all his money on an inadvisable investment. (We were put off such investments) He didn't trust banks after that. He was supposed to have some money when he died but none was found. When his mattress was turned out, the chap who collected came back to see if they had another one like it. It was then assumed that the money was in the mattress. As you can tell I have, when Grandma was alive, questioned her continuously about her family. I now have to prove what she told me was true.

I found the web site on Monday that

Malcolm Goddard has put on the Internet. I also found a Webb site for my URRY family. What Mark Urry has done has put a Webb site on listing in Chronological order any dates concerning any Urry in history. - runs to 37 pages. When contacted he was then able to send me on a Redcom files all the information he has amassed. I now have to learn how to send my information back to him. We were discussing web pages on Sunday for the Goddards.

Thanks again for your letter. As I didn't keep a record of the other stuff I sent you, I hope you will excuse me if I duplicate any none family stuff.
