Dear Brian and Julie,

Having just joined The Goddard Association (membership no 22034) I felt that I should let you have what limited information I have about my Goddard ancestors, so here it is:

Harvey Gorrode (sic!) otp single man married Ann Hinchley of the parish of Botesdale single woman by Licence on 2nd April 1775 at Rickinghall Inferior, Suffolk. He signs: Harvey Gorrode, she signs: Ann Hinchley.

A son, John was baptized 19th August 1790 at Redgrave, Suffolk and was buried there 10th February 1793.

Another John, son of Harvey Goddard (sic!) & Ann his wife (late Anne Hinchley spinster) was born Aug 15th, privately baptized Sept 14th 1798 and received into the congregation May 5th 1799. (Baptismal Register of Redgrave with Botesdale.)

Harvey Goddard of Botesdale aged 71 was buried Sept 19th 1824 and Ann Goddard of Botesdale aged 76 was buried Nov 20th 1825, both at Redgrave with Botesdale.

John Goddard bachelor of the parish of Botesdale married Harriet Bowers spinster of the parish of Botesdale by banns on 24th January 1828 at Redgrave with Botesdale. He signs: John Goddard, she signs: Harriet Bowers.

About 1835 they had a daughter Elizabeth Ann and on April 16th 1837 their son Robert Harvey Goddard son of John and Harriet of Botesdale was baptized at Redgrave with Botesdale, father's occupation: Baker. John 40, Harriett 33, Elizabeth 7, and Robert 4 all appear in the 1841 census for the Street, Botesdale.

John Goddard died of General Caohexia aged 50 on 29th May 1849 at Botesdale. Harriet 43 Baker, Elizabeth Ann 16, and Robert 13 appear at the same address in the 1851 census together with a Lodger, Arthur Burrows, a Barber aged 25.

They all appear again in the 1861 census: Harriet 52 Baker, Elizabeth Ann 26 Dress Maker, Robert 24 Boot Maker, and Arthur Burroughs (sic!) 35 Hair Dresser.

Elizabeth married Arthur Burroughs in the December quarter of 1862 in the Hartismere registration district.

Robert left for London soon after and on 26th September 1867 he (Robert Harvey Goddard) Servant aged 30 of 27 Caroline Place married, after banns, Mary Fletcher aged 22 of 5 Mason's Grove at St Luke's Chelsea. They had three daughters: the first, Sarah Jane (my grandmother), was born at the house of Mary Fletcher's sister in Gungrog Lane, Welshpool, Montgomeryshire on 22nd December 1867. Robert is now described as a Gentleman Butler.

In the 1871 census Harriet Goddard, now 62 and described as Formerly Baker's Wife is still living in Botesdale and has staying with her Harriet E Burrows 7 (Elizabeth's daughter) and Sarah J Goddard 3 (Robert's daughter).

Around this time Elizabeth and her husband took up residence at 48 Guildhall Street, Bury St Edmunds where Robert's second daughter, Harriet Mary Goddard

was born on 11th July 1877; the widowed Harriet also moved there, eventually dying of Sanguineous Apoplexy aged 79 on 7th January 1878, described as Widow of John Goddard Baker Master; the informant was E A Burrows daughter.

Robert's third daughter, Rose Annie Goddard, was born at Stifford in Essex in the December quarter of 1878. As children, Harriet and Rose lived with their parents in the normal way, but my grandmother, Sarah Jane, the eldest, was brought up almost exclusively by her grandfather, Hugh Fletcher, and his unmarried daughters in Welshpool and eventually Montgomery where he was a Tanner.

Robert became a publican, and in the 1881 census, aged 39 (sic!), he was the landlord at The Plume of Feathers Inn, High Road, Loughton, Essex. Mary 32, Harriet M 3, and Rose 2 were also living there. Sarah Jane aged 13 was living with Hugh, Sarah and Ann Fletcher at Prince's Street, Montgomery.

Robert Harvey Goddard died of Valvular disease of the Heart on 14th January 1889, aged 51, at High Road Loughton (probably The Plume of Feathers). He is described as a Licensed Victualler; the informant was M Goddard widow. Hugh Fletcher died in the same year.

The 1891 census shows Mary Goddard widow 48 Licensed Victualler living at Goldings Hill (actually still The Plume of Feathers), Loughton with Harriet M 12 and Rose A 11. Sarah Jane 23 was living at Prince's Street, Montgomery with Sarah Fletcher.

However, my grandmother (Sarah Jane) must have taken up residence with her widowed mother in Loughton shortly after this because on 6th August 1892, aged 24, she married John Greenaway 26, a Carpenter, at Loughton Parish Church where John's father (also John) was a church official and successful local builder. (I became Organist of Loughton Parish Church through the 1960s and 70s.)

Mary Goddard died, aged 48, of Broncho Pneumonia on 11th September 1893 at High Road Loughton; the informant was S Greenaway daughter.

My two great aunts both married: Harriet Mary Goddard married Arthur William Fry in the September quarter of 1904 in the Hendon registration district. By then she was a school teacher and he became a headmaster. My great aunt Rose had a much more glamorous life: she became a Bond Street mannequin and 'married money' spending most of her married life in China. Her married name was Field, but I haven't been able to trace a marriage so assume she married abroad.

My grandmother, Sarah Jane, was widowed in 1927; she died, aged 82, on 6th December 1950 at 3 Lower Road, Loughton of Cerebral Thrombosis. My two great aunts both survived her; by the time I knew them they were both widowed and living in Beckenham / Elmer's End in South London. I vividly remember their periodic visitations to Loughton to see their sister 'Janie'--Auntie Hattie small and rather schoolmistressy, but Auntie Rosie tall and still immensely grand and elegant, and seemingly covered in fox furs! I don't have any records of their deaths yet; Rose went to live with her children in Herstmonceux, Sussex where I think she died in the 1960s.


Incidentally, the three sisters six christian names derived from their mother's six great aunts (Hugh Fletcher's maternal aunts): Sarah, Jane, Harriet, Mary, Rose, and Anne Etches whose brother was the Chief Constable of Doncaster.

I'm enclosing a chart of descent from Harvey Goddard. I noticed while researching at Bury St Edmunds that there were a number of Gorrodes and Gorroods: is this a common variation of the name? It also occurred to me that Harvey may have been a surname, and I came across a marriage of James Garrod

of Mellingham widower to Sarah Harvey of the same parish singlewoman, by licence, on 6th March 1740 at Barsham, Suffolk.

Anyway, I hope this has all been reasonably clear, and I'd be very grateful for any leads or connections that you may be able to give me.

To John my son £200 at feast of St Michael the Archangel next after his age of 21.

To Marie my wife lands, tenements and rents and profits in mortgage of and from George COLLINGWOOD gent for the payment of £240 in 1602 to and for the use of Robert my son to be paid at feast of the annunciation of our Lady next after his age of 21, to bring up sons and likewise two daughters.

To my sister CUTLER £5 within one year.

To Marie HOWE and Alice HOWE my daughters to either £100 at ages of 21 or earlier marriage.

If any die without issue before age 21 his share to be divided equally between my other children.

To John GAMBLIN the elder, John GAMBLIN the younger, William MYRRELLS and Thomas CARTER my weavers 20 shillings apiece.

To Thomas HYNDS my servant £5.

To Thomas TAYLOR my servant 40 shillings if he continues with my wife, otherwise 10 shillings.

To my loving and natural mother Agnes GARDNER three score pounds.

To my father in law Robert ASTERLEY £3.

*penal

Residue to my wife Mary provided within 2 months after my decease she shall become bound in reasonable sums of money by obligation to my sons and daughters. Bonds to be delivered to and kept by my friends Ambros BIGGS of Glemsford and Richard KERRINGTON my uncle. If my wife refuses to be bound, my mother to be sole exor and to have residue.
