This Dorothy mentioned in the Kelsale records says-Dorothy GODDARD late GROOM spinster widow of Nicholas GODDARD aged 84 years was buried 14th JULY 1801.

The Suffolk Parish researcher does not think this is Robert;s mother. She thinks Dorothy would be slightly too young! According to his burial records he would be born about 1733 and she would be born about 1717. When you are talking about this time I think the dates have to be approximate? If my sums are correct this would mean Dorothy would have been 16 at the time of Robert's birth- which to me and at this time would have been possible? What do you think?

The "Parish Chest" is the wooden chest which by law the church was required to have. It usually had three locks and three keys, one of which was held by the parson and the others by the clerk and/or churchwardens. In the chest would be kept orders for removal of unwanted persons to other parishes, the amounts raised for appeals (for sailors drowned in storms after the armada etc) and so on. The records should now be in the County Record Office for safety. It sounds as if you have already looked at all these, or had someone look. For further information the standard work on the subject is "The Parish Chest" by Tate.

Dear Julie

Thank you for your email.

You have the correct Bathsheba. There seems to have been a huge age difference between Robert and Bathsheba but I guess not impossible. It makes me wonder if Robert may have been married before?

My top of the tree starts with Robert Goddard born 1733 and died 1816 in Kelsale aged 83. Bathsheba Levitt born 1779 and dies 1850. Her 2nd marriage was to a Thomas Welham.

Robert and Bathsheba have 5 children-

Robert born 1801 in Kelsale who marries a Mary Goodall and have 2 children Emma born 1831 and Eliza born 1834.

William Goddard born 1804 in Kelsale, but I can find no baptism record!-who marries a Caroline Carr in 1824 from Framlington and in 1827 Henry Goddard is born. In 1867, Caroline dies and William marries again in 1869 to a Mary Styles (nee Coats). On the marriage cert William says his father is Robert so I am quite certain he was part of this family. I am descended from this branch.

Henry Goddard was born 1806 and marries first a Eliza Sewel in 1829 and later a Lousica ?. They have 4 children Henry C Goddard born 1830, Joseph 1837, Jesse Goddard 1841 and Rhoda E. Goddard in 1842. I can find no other records for this family after 1851 census. I wonder if they emigrate?

In 1808 Eliza Goddard is born in Kelsale and I think she marries a Barnabas Collins in 1829.

In 1811 Mary Goddard is born but dies 3 years later.

Beverley, in Tasmania is related to a George Goddard who lives and works in Kelsale but born in Rendham. At one time I was wondering if George was offspring of perhaps Robert's first marriage. His parents were Robert and Hannah but Hannah does not die before Bathsheba's marriage.

The only other Goddards in Kelsale that are mentioned are a Dorothy- a widow of Nicholas Goddard. Dorothy lived to a good age and I do not have the records to hand but was born about 1717?

Are there any other variations of the name Goddard that I could try? I look forward to hearing from you soon to listen for any other ideas you may have.

Several years ago we were contacted by Beverley Watson of Tasmania who was trying to discover the origins of Phillip Edgar Noonan, her father, born 1909, who had always been known by that name until Beverley discovered that he was really Phillip Edgar Goddard. It is not clear why his mother Jessie fostered him with the Noonan family.

Jessie had come to Australia (the Tasmania move was later) with her cousins Agnes, Annie and Obed[diah] Tims/Timms/Timbs in 1902. Jessie was born in 1889 to Edgar Henry Goddard and his wife Jessie, nee Turner. In the 1881 census the family are living at No.25 Great York Mews, St Marylebone with children Edward C. (10), Obed A. (5) and Frederick (1 month). Edward Henry states that he was born in Ipswich.

Still in Ipswich is Henry Goddard aged 54, a carpenter, (born in Kelsale) married to Rebecca. An unmarried daughter, Justina C.R. Goddard was living with them.

Agnes who went to Australia, kept a detailed diary and it is clear that Edgar Henry and Henry were related. The emigrants came back to England for holidays and to meet up with their family back home.

If you feel that you are related to this family I can give you photocopies of the letters that Beverley Watson sent. Though if I supplied so much information I would ask that you considered giving a "donation" to the Goddard Association to help with our funds. The current suggestion is £5 for OAPs and £7.50p for the rest. You get three copies of the Newsletter and access to our Goddard files for a year for this.

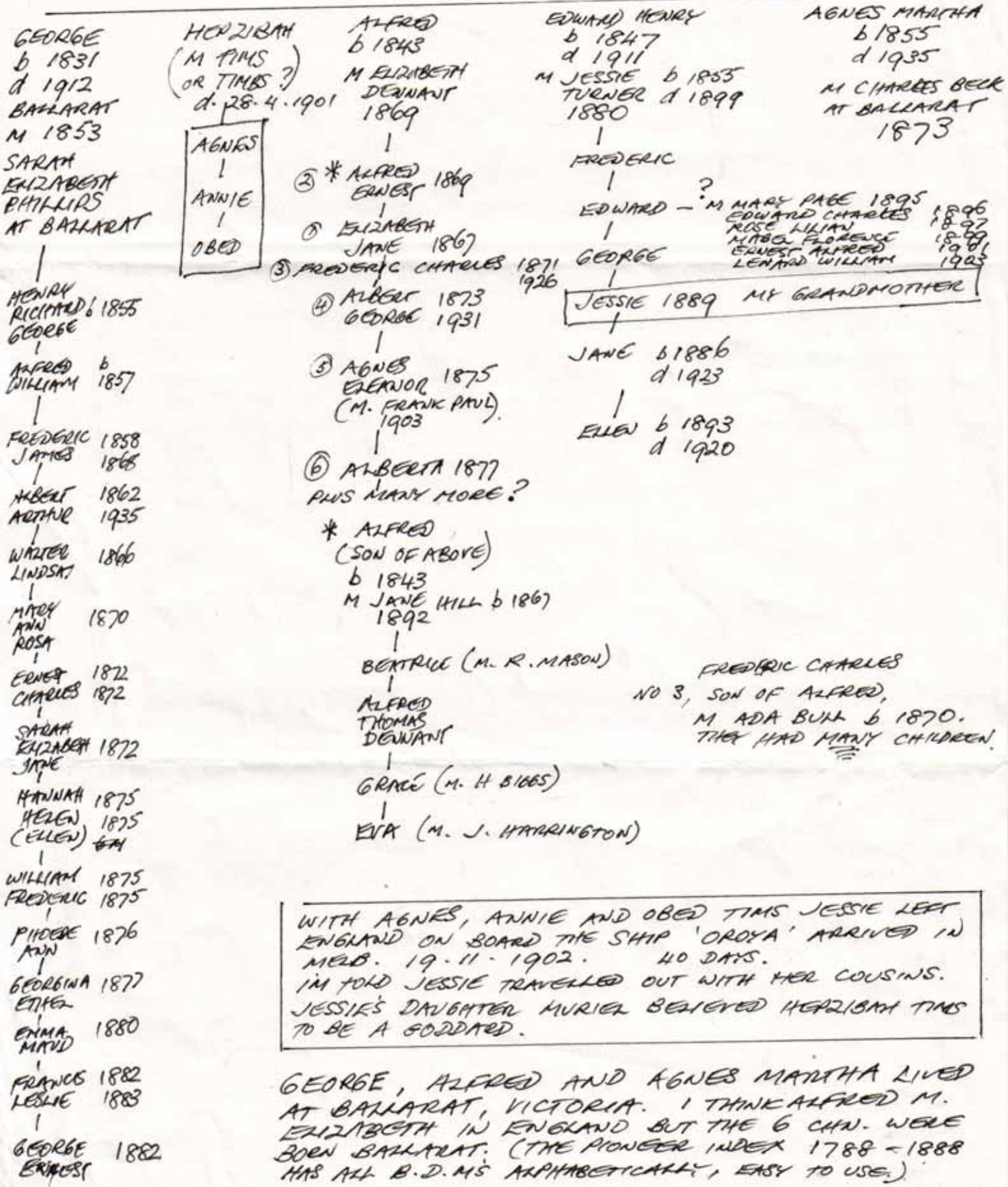
