DEAR JULIE & BRIAN,

I'M A NEW MEMBER AND I'M SEARCHING FOR THE ANCESTORS OF EDWARD HENRY GODDARD WHO MARRIED JESSIE TURNER IN 1880, MARYLEBONE. HE WAS A CAB DRIVER. THEIR CHILDREN WERE WALTER, EDWARD AND MY GRANDMOTHER JESSIE b 1889. SHE MIGRATED TO MELBOURNE, VICTORIA ABOUT 1907.

MY FATHER PHILLIP EDGAR GODDARD WAS b 1909 BUT NEVER KNEW HIS MOTHER OR THE EXISTENCE OF THE 8 1/2-BROTHERS AND SISTERS WHEN SHE MARRIED RICHARD CHARLES GRAY IN 1912 AND AGAIN IN 1917 (DIV. 1917). I HAVE TRACKED DOWN ~~THE~~ 2 SURVIVING CHILDREN, RICHARD HENRY GRAY (AGED 76) AND JAMES NORMAN GRAY (AGED 70) NOW LIVING IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA. I'VE HAD PHONE CALLS, LETTERS AND PHOTOS FROM RICHARD HENRY GRAY AND HE HAS HELPED PROVIDE INFORMATION.

I'VE BEEN WAITING 11 WEEKS FOR A COPY OF THE MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE OF EDWARD HENRY GODDARD AND JESSIE TURNER, I ALSO WROTE A MONTH AGO TO ASK IF MY 1ST LETTER HAD BEEN RECEIVED, NO REPLY.

I AM HOPING THAT WE FIT ON AN ALREADY RESEARCHED FAMILY TREE OR THAT AN ENQUIRY CAN BE MADE THROUGH THE NEWSLETTER, MY FIRST NEWSLETTER ARRIVED TODAY.

MY FATHER CHANGED HIS NAME BY DEED POLL IN 1934 TO PHILLIP EDGAR NOONAN AS IT WAS THE NAME HE HAD BEEN KNOWN BY ALL HIS LIFE. HE WAS VERY SHOCKED AT THE TIME (AGED 25) TO FIND HE WAS A FOSTER CHILD. HE ONLY TOLD US ABOUT 1990, HE DIED IN 1994 NEVER KNOWING HIS FULL HISTORY, JUST HIS MOTHERS NAME.

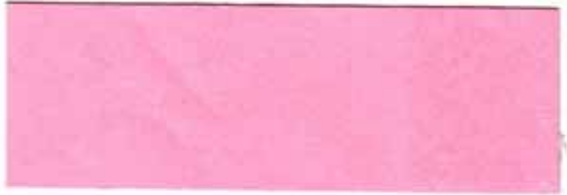

Dear Mrs Watson,

I have been looking through the file of unsolved queries and found your letter of 1995. As your research facilities in Australia are often better than ours - outside London that is- I expect that you have traced your ancestor **Edward Henry Goddard** born 1847 in Ipswich, Suffolk in the 1881 census, but in case you have not the details are as follows

Edward Henry Goddard aged 32 married, living in St Marylebone, employed as a cab driver, born Suffolk, Ipswich.

Jessie Goddard aged 26 married, wife of Edward H. Dressmaker. Born Buckinghamshire, Eton [Eton is now in Berkshire]

Frederick Goddard aged 1 month, son of Edward H. Goddard, born St Marylebone
The reference number is 0144 105 1 1341032 if you wish to see the full entry with an address if you are lucky.

I have a print out of the 1881 census of Suffolk which shows that in the parish of St Margaret, Ipswich there was a **Henry Goddard** aged 54 who was a carpenter and married to **Rebecca** aged 56. there was also an unmarried daughter **Justina C. R. Goddard** aged 28 living with them. Henry appears to have been born in Kelsale, Suffolk, Rebecca in Beyton Suffolk.

If you think that this Henry is your ancestor I warn you that Suffolk is stuffed full of Goddards, but we do have several people who are researching the area.

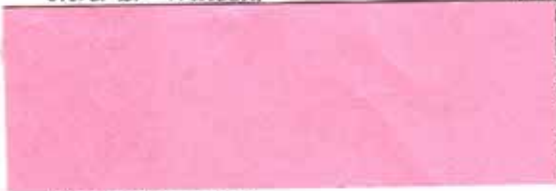

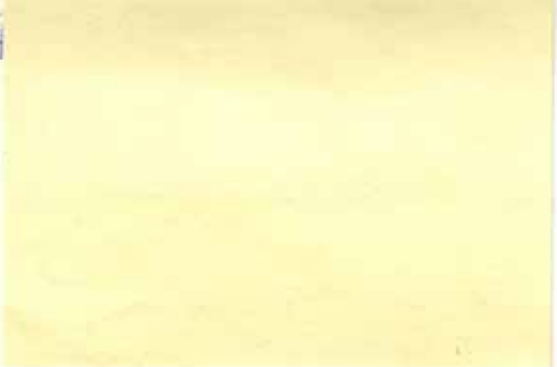

Dear Beverly,

thank you for your letter which arrived a few days ago. I have checked our database, with no success, but I will put your letter in to the pending file. But do not hold your breath, with the limited amount of information that you have been able to give us to work on I do not think that we can put you in touch with any other person who may be researching your branch at the moment. Without full dates and places the task is virtually impossible, have you tried researching the St Catherine's House records for births, deaths and marriages? I know that there are copies available in Australia for research purposes. Also, it is worth trying to find the ships records that they travelled over in or their Australia port of entry records. They frequently have significant personal details, also have you tried, the earlier U. K. census returns and also those for Suffolk and the counties around, widening the search is sometimes worth its weight in gold! In the mean time we will keep our eyes open for other researchers who are possibly looking into your branch and hope that your further researches will result in you being able to add a few more pieces to the jig-saw.

Please write again if you think I can be of further assistance, and please send the tree when you can fill in the dates and places - pre 1900 details only will be put on to the computer. Julie and I have said that we will take on the research co-ordination job again for a while after the ladies who had taken it on from us have had to withdraw their offer as a result of other pressures on their time
