

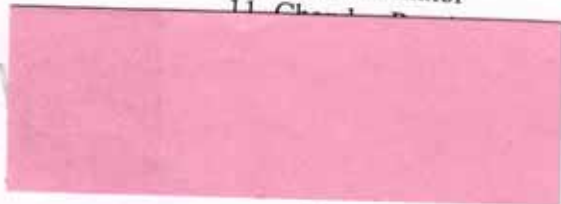

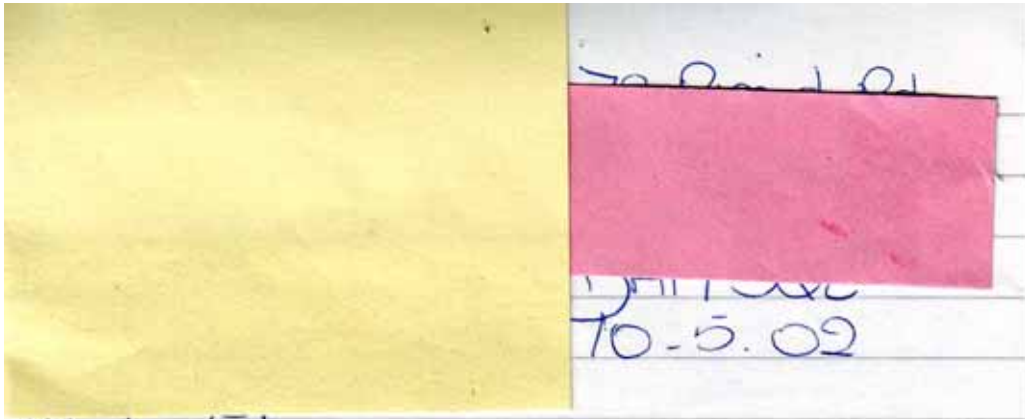
Firstly Thank you

Richangles from Mrs Carr-Bowey

Jeremiah Warren married Ann Goddard 12 Oct 1814
son John baptised 11 May 1834

Thorndon from Mrs Carr-Bowey

Thomas Goddard married Ann
son John baptised 12 June 1654

John Goddard married Ann Wile (?) 3 Jan 1659

Dear Mr Mitchell,

Thank you for your letter. I confess that I am a little bemused; I thought that we had been looking at **George Bouverie Goddard**, the artist and son of George Goddard "of Canal Street, Salisbury, Chemist, druggist, oil and colourman", not **William** Bouverie Goddard.

George Bouverie Goddard, I discovered today, was probably given the distinctive middle name because William Pleydell Bouverie, 3rd Earl Radnor, (1779-1869) was the MP for Salisbury. His connection with the Swindon Goddards was their mutual interest in winning elections. Why not look at the Bouverie life story and see if he was doing something special when William was born. We have a Goddard family, bankers, who called a son Stanhope because Lord Stanhope had just passed some legislation on banknotes at the time of his birth. I enclose a copy of the entry for the Earl of Radnor from the *Dictionary of National Biography*. I am sorry that it not a better copy, but it would break the spine of the book to open it sufficiently to photocopy every word.

I have now found your initial letter to us in the Suffolk file and my replies to further letters over the years. We did in fact have handed in some of the papers of Miss Millicent Goddard that I wrote of several years ago, but they were far less informative than we had been led to believe. I see from the records of letters from other people, that there was a big contingent of Goddards in the Thorndon, Rishangles, and Thornham Magna area. Also at Diss there were Goddards engaged in Brush Making and there is a study group of this occupation.

Have you joined the Suffolk Family History Association? One can advertise ones problems in their magazines and also use their indexes. Bear in mind that Goddard can be written in many ways - depending on the accent of the speaker and the spelling ability of the person writing down the name. In the Thornham Magna registers the name appears as Garrad, Gorrod, Garrod, Garrard, and Godard.

The Boyd's Marriage Index in the Society of Genealogists (have you visited this institution? one can buy a day ticket) Has the following marriages for the period 1701-1775 in Thorndon

- 1734 Thomas Goddard & Frances Rose
- 1739 William Goddard & Eliz Goodram
- 1753 Joseph Goddard & Eliz Hancock

I also have in the files a letter of thanks from Brian A.B.Barton, 15 Crome Close, Colchester, Essex, CO3 4QQ. He had (April 1999) in his possession a sampler with the name Eliza Gorrod on it which had been handed down in his family. Perhaps he is a connection of yours.
