Dear Mrs Nelson,

Thank you for your letter, passed on to me by John Goddard.

We do have some records for Brighton in Sussex, but unfortunately the combination of William Goddard and a wife named Mary is too common for a particular couple to be singled out as the one whom you are tracing. Brighton had several churches and chapels and quite a large population.

*Your best way of proceeding would be to obtain the birth certificate of **Mary Ann Mitchell Goddard**. Civil registration had been introduced in 1837 and you should, I am not going to say will as there were no legal penalties at that date for not registering a birth, be able to get a certificate which would give her parents and their address. Similarly you should be able to find her marriage certificate around 1864/5. Do you have an acquaintance who is on the Internet who could search the indexes of English births, marriages and deaths? Or can you use a Mormon research centre?*


