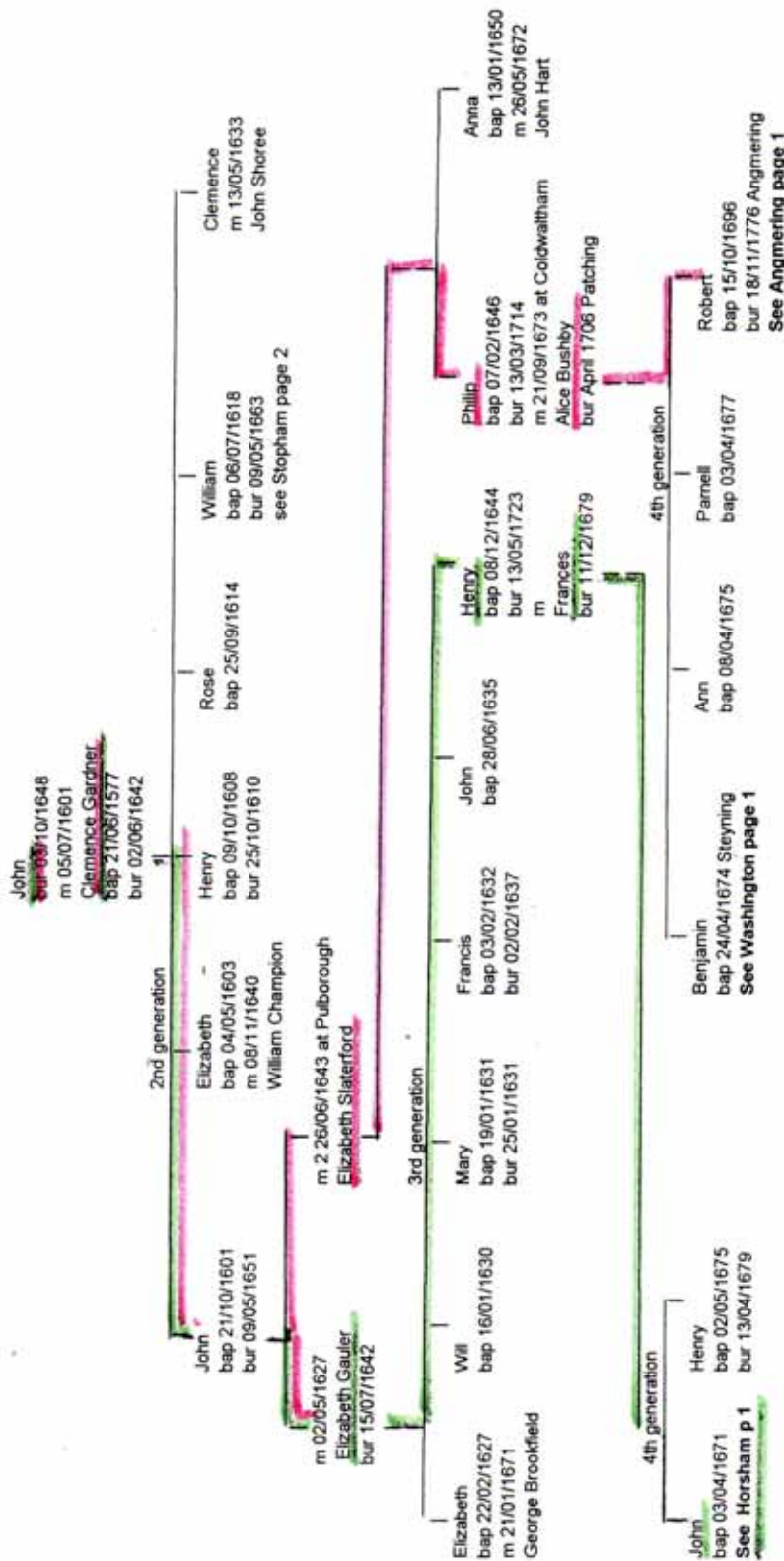

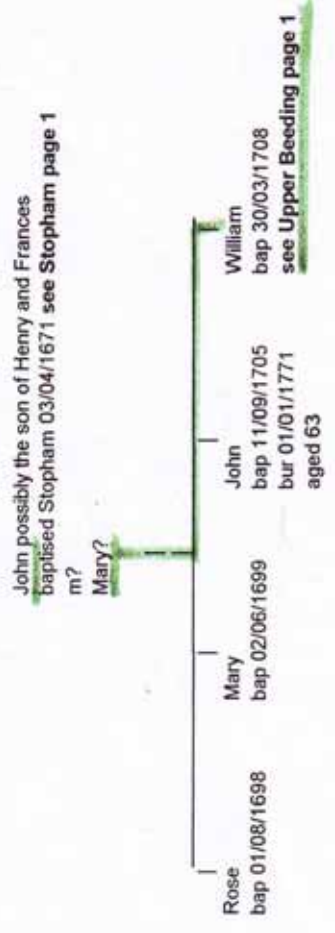

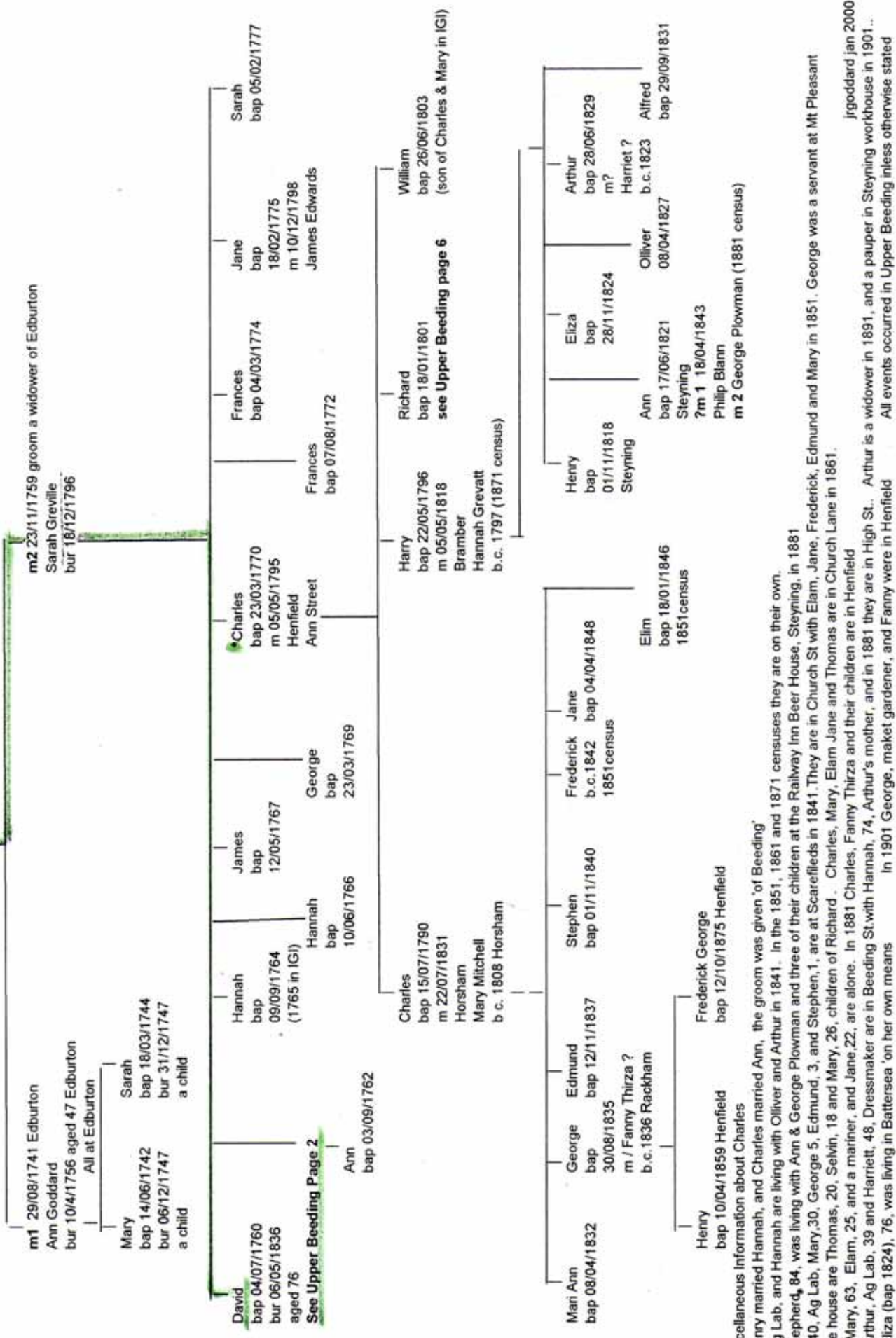
Wendy's line

When Henry married Hannah, and Charles married Ann, the groom was given 'of Beeding'

Henry, Ag Lab, and Hannah are living with Oliver and Arthur in 1841. In the 1851, 1861 and 1871 censuses they are on their own.

Henry, shepherd, 84, was living with Ann & George Plowman and three of their children at the Railway Inn Beer House, Steyning, in 1881

Charles, 40, Ag Lab, Mary, 30, George 5, Edmund, 3, and Stephen, 1, are at Scarefields in 1841. They are in Church St with Elam, Jane, Frederick, Edmund and Mary in 1851. George was a servant at Mt Pleasant

Also in the house are Thomas, 20, Selvin, 18 and Mary, 26, children of Richard. Charles, Mary, Elam Jane and Thomas are in Church Lane in 1861.

By 1871 Mary, 63, Elam, 25, and a mariner, and Jane, 22, are alone. In 1881 Charles, Fanny Thirza and their children are in Henfield

In 1871 Arthur, Ag Lab, 39 and Harriet, 48, Dressmaker are in Beeding St. with Hannah, 74, Arthur's mother, and in 1881 they are in High St.. Arthur is a widower in 1891, and a pauper in Steyning workhouse in 1901...

In 1901 Eliza (bap 1824), 76, was living in Battersea 'on her own means' In 1901 George, market gardener, and Fanny were in Henfield All events occurred in Upper Beeding unless otherwise stated

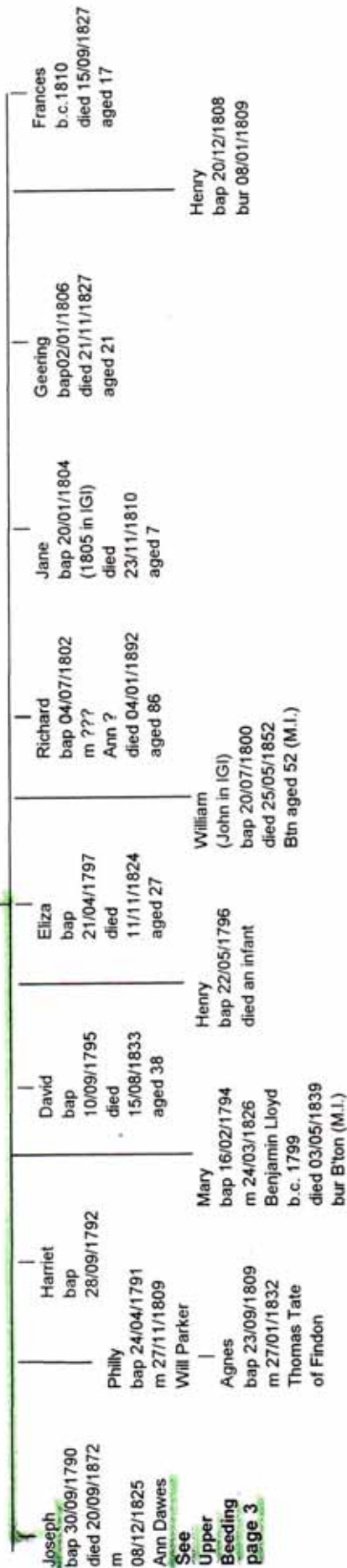

I have been unable to find amariage for Richard and Ann. In 1841 he was 35 and a schoolmaster. In 1851 he was still a schoolmaster, married to Ann, 43, born New Shoreham, living in High St, Beeding In 1861 Richard was 58, and a victualler, and Ann was 50. A David Goddard of Beeding married Charlotte Joyce Reade in East Greenwich on the 7th March, 1822. A witness was Eliza Goddard. In 1841 Phillis, 65, ind., Harriet, 45, ind, Richard, 35, Schoolmaster, Ann, 16 and Thomas, 4 are living in Beeding St. On David's tombstone it states that he 'kept a respectable school in this parish for 50 years'. Mary's husband Benjamin Lloyd and her brother William are commemorated on the same tombstone in St Nicholas Church, Brighton

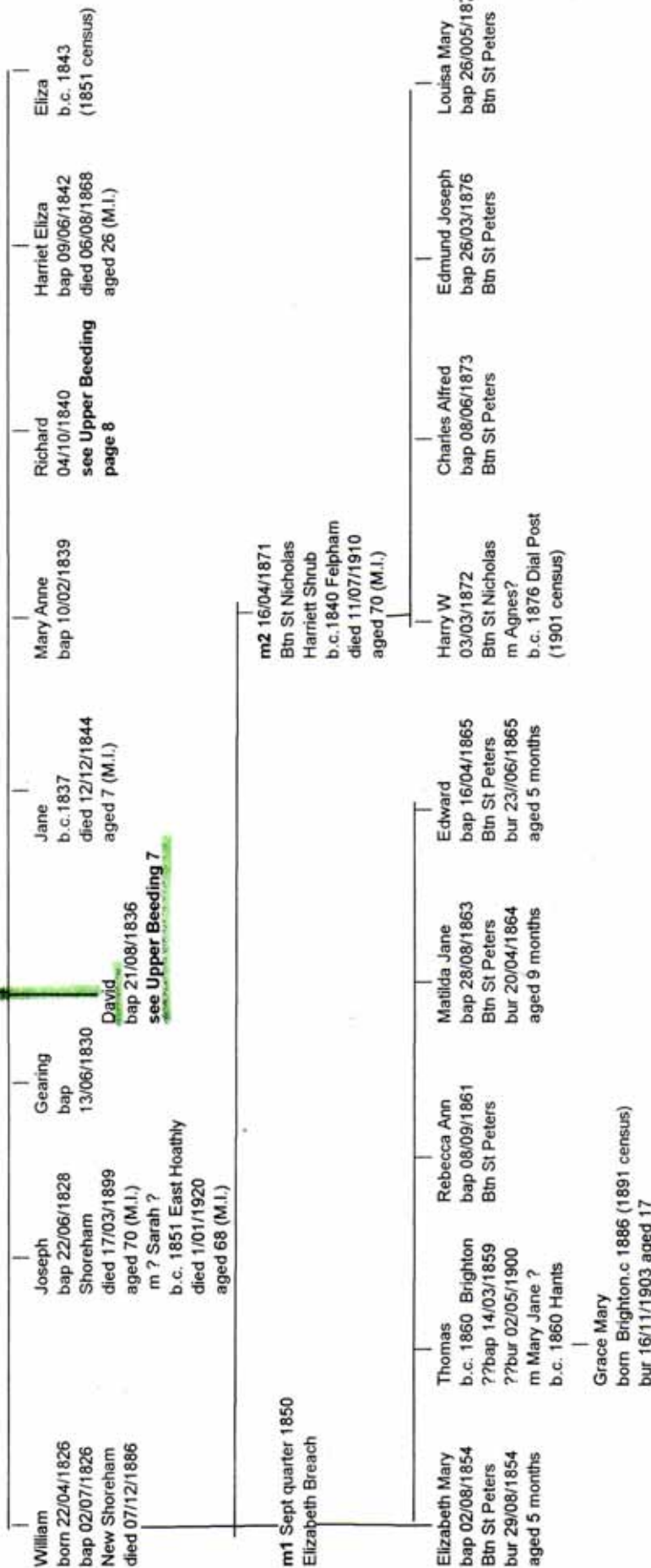

In 1841 Joseph, 40, shoemaker, Ann, 45, William, 15, Joseph, 10, David, 5, Mary 2, and Richard, 1 are living in Beeding St.

In 1851 in High St. Ann, 54, Cordwainer's wife, was living with Eliza, 8, Mary Ann 12 and Rich; On his tombstone it states that Joseph (husband of Ann) was the Parish Clerk for 17 years.

In 1861 in High St. Joseph, 60, gardener, was living with Ann, 64, Harriet and Eliza, 19

In 1881 Joseph was 52 and Sarah was 30. They were living at 30, York Road, Brighton, with George Orling, a grandson, aged 5. Joseph was born in Shoreham. He was a grocer and Wesleyan preacher

In 1891 Joseph & Sarah were in the High St, Steyning with Louisa M. a niece aged 12 (probably William's daughter). Joseph was a Wesleyan preacher

On Joseph, Sarah's husband's, tombstone it states that he was for many years a Wesleyan preacher.

In 1881 William, 54, Harriet, 41, Thomas, 21, Harry W. George C. and Louisa Mary were living at 63, Southover Street, Brighton, with Harriet's mother Elizabeth

No parents names were given when Thomas was baptised at Upper Beeding on the 14th March, 1859

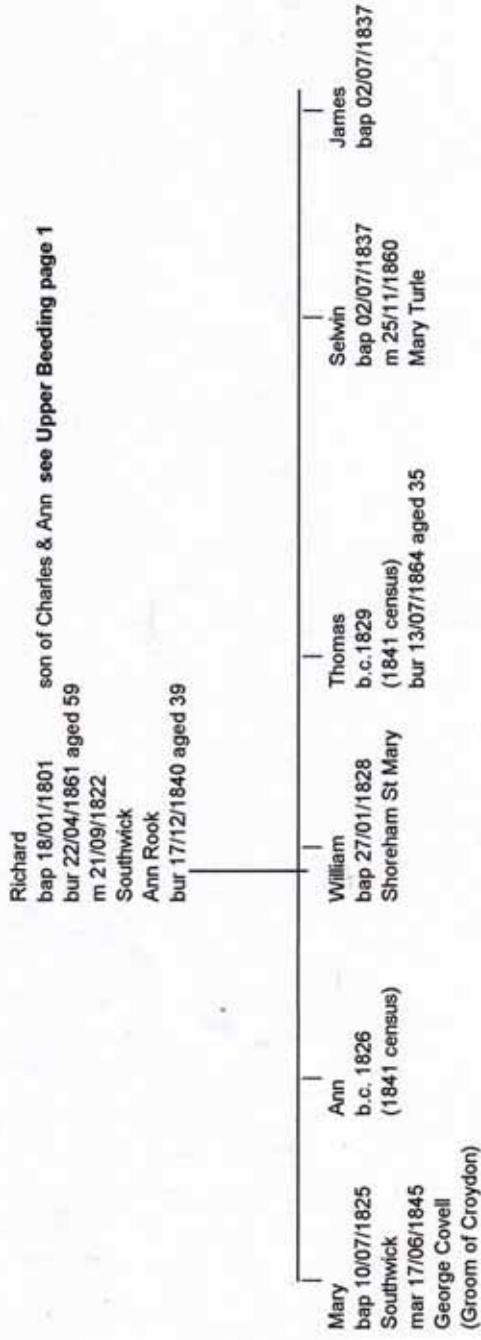
A Joseph was a Grocer of 30 York Rd, Brighton in the Post Office 1878 directory

In 1891 Thomas, 32, was a Grocer and Postmaster in Beeding with Mary Jane, Grace Mary and his brother Harry W. aged 10 who was a Grocer's Assistant

Henry W, 29, and his wife Agnes, 25, born Dial Post, were in Bramber Street in 1901 running a refreshment house.

In 1901 Mmary Jane, 47, grocer, and Grace were in Beeding Street

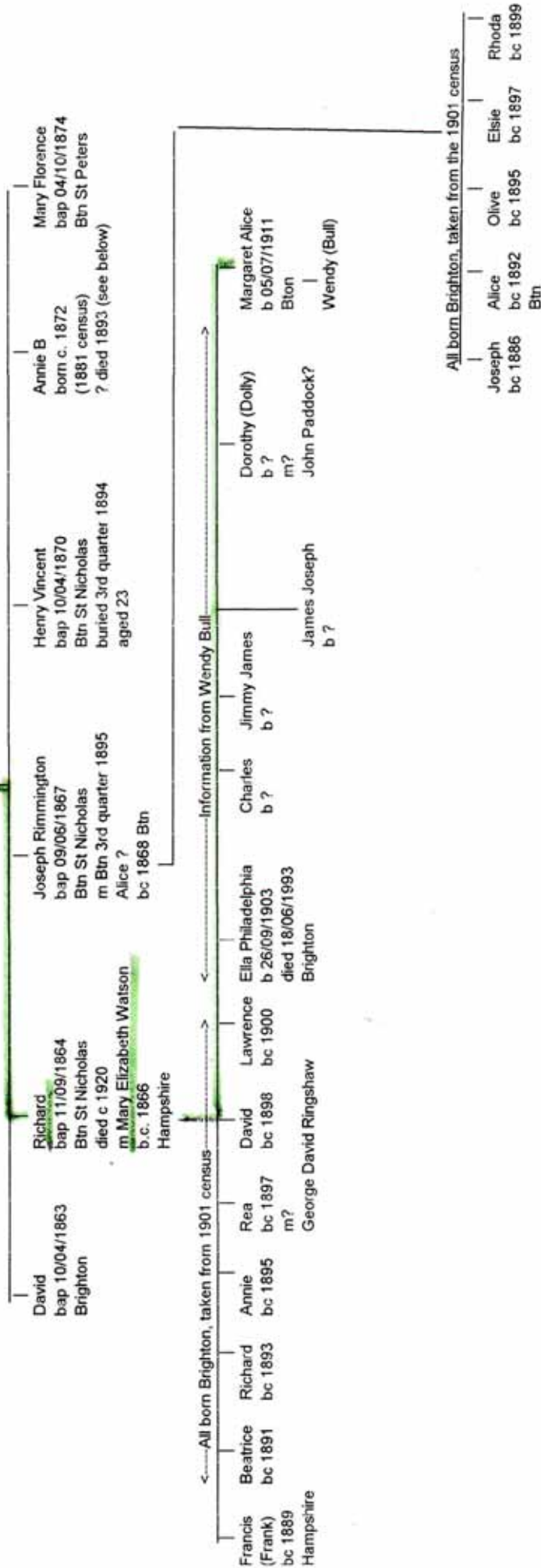

 In 1851 Richard, 50, widower, and James, 15, ag lab, were lodging in the High Street
 In 1861 Thomas was still lodging with Charles and Mary
 Richard left a will proved at Chichester. Ann his widow was the sole executrix. His effects were under £100

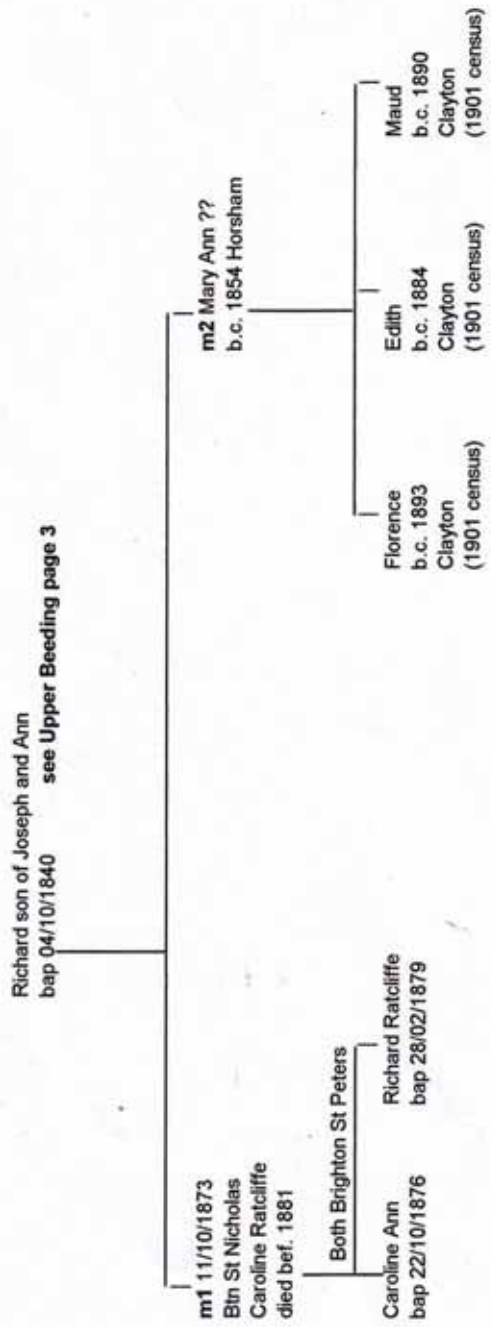

In 1851 David, born Beeding, was a general servant living in Surry St. New Shoreham
 In 1881 Mary, 42, Charwoman, was living at 28, Stanley Street, Brighton with David, 18, Grocers porter, Richard S, 16, Scholar, Joseph R, CS Messenger telegraph boy.
 Henry V, 11, Army B, 9, and Mary F., 6. Her husband David was not there.

An Annie Beatrice was buried in the first quarter, 1832, Steyning Registration District, aged 19
 Mary Florence was baptised daughter of Daniel and Mary
 Richard, 36, hotel porter, was in Windmill St, Brighton with his family in 1501. With them was David, 36, a grocers' porter.
 In 1901 Joseph was also in Windmill St Brighton with his family. He was a Postal Telegraphist, son Joseph was an office boy.

 James Joseph was a fireman who died during the Blitz in World War 2



In 1881 Richard, 40, retired, born Upper Beeding, was at 20, Barrington Rd. Horsham with wife, Mary Ann (born Horsham), Caroline A, 4, and Richard, R, 2
Richard, 60, a grocer and Mary, 47, were in Worthing in 1901 with Edith, pupil teacher, Maud, and Florence
A Caroline, 24, born Brighton was a Confection shop assistant in Horsham in 1901
