Wiltshire Quarter Sessions Records, 17th century - p. 114 - 1636 - Nov. 4 - "Stephen Loker giving information to John Popham, Esq., at Littlecote, saith that, talking with Thos. Hopkins of Albourne, he, Thos., told him he had thrown his prong at a great fat gentleman (Mr. Gaddard) + missed him narrowly, bowed his prong + killed his dog."
