Deed #25. James 1. 1617. Indenture of Francis Goddard to Sir Anthony Hungerford and Mr. Edmund Hungerford, diverting the use of the fine levied by the said Francis to the said Sir Anthony Hungerford and Mr. Edward Hungerford to the use of Francis Goddard, Esqre., in fee, all that belonged to Francis Goddard, Esqre. (except Standen-Hussey. The fine is enclosed in this deed which includes the Rectory with the advowson of the Vicarage.)

Deed #26. James 1. 1623. Feofment of a messuage, garden, 1 acre meadow, and two acres of pasture. Harolds to Francis Goddard, Esqre. (Called "Copped Hall".)

Deeds#27. Charles 1. 1643. Decree touching Rectory of Cliffe Pypard, between Bartlett and Humber. (Concerning the remainder of lease from Thomas Goddard to his brother Anthony Goddard, who is said ^{THESE} to have died about 1605.)

Deed #28. Charles 1. 1647. Sir John Ernley's surrender of the Parsonage of Cliffe.

Deed #29. Charles 1. 1647. Deed of the uses for the Parsonage of Cliffe purchased by Francis Goddard, Esqre.

Deed #20. 1586. Thomas Goddard, Esq., of Standen, conveys the Parsonage of Clyffe Pypard to Anthony, second son of John Goddard, late of Standen, Esq., father of the said Thomas and Anthony, reference being made to the will of this John Goddard, bearing date of July, 1567.

1647. By deed bearing date of 6th December, 1647, there is a repurchase of the parsonage of Clyffe Pypard by Francis Goddard, Esq., of Lancelot Humber, son of Lancelot Humber, who was second husband of Mary Goddard widow of the above Anthony Goddard.

I do not know the exact wording of these two deeds, but Reverend Edward Hungerford Goddard, the present rector (1930) of Cliff Pypard, Wiltshire gave me this data, and perhaps all of this data is not contained in these deeds - some being personal suppositions, etc. of the said Reverend Goddard.

The wooden monumental tablet in Cliff Pypard Church states that Elizabeth Phetyplace Goddard was the daughter of Sir Robert Phetyplace.

G O D D A R D.

Reverend Edward Hungerford Goddard of Cliff Pypard gave me the following data:

~~Anthony Goddard was buried at Cliff Pypard in June, 1606. Lived at Cliff Pypard, but was not Lord of the Manor. The "Parsonage" (Rectorial Tithe) was conveyed to him by Thomas Goddard, July 20th, 1586, but he seems to have had a prior interest in it under his father's (John Goddard) will, dated 5th of July, 1567. The lease passed from him to his wife's son, Lancelot Humber, and was re-purchased by Francis Goddard in 1647. This Anthony had a son John baptised at Calne, October, 1590, by Bp. Jewell - Calne Register.~~

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G O D D A R D.

I, Kingston G. Hadley, believe that Anthony Goddard, son of John Goddard of Upham, son of John Goddard of Upham, had three sons and three daughters. The sons being Anthony, Francis and Richard, and the three daughters being Fraunce, wife of John Kingston; Cathere (n), wife of Christopher Clytter, and Elizabeth, wife of Robert Paulet.

I also believe that Anthony, son of Anthony Goddard if in case Anthony Goddard did have a son by the name of "Anthony", was the father of the Giles Goddard as baptised in the Parish of Cliffe Pypard, Wiltshire, England on August 19th, 1598.

I also believe that the Giles Goddard of Boston was the grandson of the Giles Goddard as baptised on August 19th, 1598.

Rev. E. H. Goddard states that Elizabeth, wife of John Goddard, was the daughter of Sir Robert Phetyplace.

In reply to your letter of 10th July :

I have not actually got a reference to Giles Goddard in my Card Index but, if any Giles Goddard of Wiltshire in the 17th Century did leave a will and that will is not in the Prerogative Court of the Archbishop of Canterbury, then I know exactly where to look for it and it is a search which would cost only five dollars.


Still, you ought to be able to get the evidence you want even if Giles Goddard, born 1598, left no will.

If I were working on this case I should give a little attention first to Anthony and his other children. It will pay you in the end. For instance I see that at Clyffe Pypard there were the following marriages : 1601-2, Kingston & Goddard; 1602-3, Clytter & Goddard; 1605, Paulet & Goddard. Without any further evidences before me, these appear to me to be probably the aunts of Giles, b. 1598. Has it not occurred to you that uncles and aunts leave legacies to their nephews and the children of their nephews ? I have solved many an obstinate problem by looking up wills of the families which intermarried with the family on which I happen to be working.

As to Anthony : I have a reference (period 1558-1602) of a lawsuit brought by a couple of knights against an Anthony Goddard in connection with a debt of one Anthony Goddard, deceased. I have a further reference (period 1579-1587) of a lawsuit brought against Anthony and Edward Goddard, also in connection with money matters. If you would like to have full abstracts of those two lawsuits I could have them prepared for you on receipt of 15 dollars and with them I would send you the full official references enabling them to be verified at any time.

If you would prefer me to take up the case for you I shall be very pleased to do so as it looks as if it might be quite interesting. If that is your wish, please remit 100 dollars and leave the matter with me for a couple of months, after which I will send you a full Report on my researches,

PRUDENCE; ALICE; JOAN; MARGERIE; MARY; MARTHA; SARAH GODDARD; brother JOHN GODDARD; sister PRUDENCE GODDARD; father-in-law Humfry Reade; sister-in-law Mary Prowse; Brother-in-law Mr. George Hartnall; "cousin" Mr. Aquilla Skinner.

MARY GODDARD of the parish of St. Bennet Finke, London, widow, will dated 12 March 1635, proved 6 July 1638 (P.C.C. 91 Lee). Only GODDARDS mentioned are "bros-in-law JOHN and CHRISTOPHER GODDARD and their sister Susan Dawes".

JOHN GODDARD of Blandford, Co. Dorset, yeoman. Will dated 26 May, 1640, proved 10 June 1640 (P.C.C. 86 Coventry). Names brother SIMON GODDARD; "brother William Wilkens and William Wilkens his son"; "bro-in-law William Vallett and his two children.

HUMFREY GODDARD of Lymehouse, parish of Stepney, (London?), mariner, will dated 1 Jan. 1640, proved 3 Sept. 1641 by widow (P.C.C. 119 Evelyn). Names "wife JANE and the children". No particulars.

HENRY GODDARD of the parish of St. Margaret's, Westminster, will dated 22 April 1641, proved 25 May 1642 by widow (Westminster 153 Todd). Names grandchild JOICE GODDARD; wife ANNE GODDARD; daughter Charitie Ripley, alias Attfields.

FRANCIS GODDARD, citizen and haberdasher of London. Will dated 31 Aug. 1642, proved by widow 19 Sept., 1642 (P.C.C. 108 Campbell) names wife ANNE; sons GEORGE and HENRY; daughter ANN.

"ANTHONY GODDARD of Cleeve Peper (Cliff Pypard), co. Wilts., gent. Will dated 14 Oct. 1605. To be buried in p'ish church of Cleeve Peper. Poor of same p'ish. Lease I hold in Cleeve Peper to wife MARY and son GILES, if they decease before expiry of lease, the same to the eld. child of GILES, if he has any, but if they die, to be equally divided between my daus. and their children. Lease in the Manor of Lordship of Albourne, Co. Wilts., to son GILES, but if he die before 21 to be equally divided between my daus. and their children; wife to bring up son GILES during her widowhood. If she marry, Thos. Buckeridge, Xpofer Cleaterd? and bro. EDMUND GODDARD to manage his property until he be of age. Friends Giles Wroughton, John Erneley, Knt. Four God-children, being my daus. children 40s apiece.

Synopsis of "A Memoir of THE GODDARDS OF NORTH WILTS." by Richard Jefferies, Coate, Swindon (Privately reprinted by Dwight Goddard, Cleveland, O., 1912)

pp. 6 to 8. Gives supposed origin of the surname, deriving it from "GODORD" a Norse priest-king. Also remarks on "GODDARD CUPS" in possession of many branches of the Wiltshire family, one still remaining in the hands of "Mr. Goddard of Cliffe".

p. 8. The name GODDARD occurs in Domesday Book in the county of Leicester. In 1202 the Chancellor's Rolls contain entries relating to the GODDARDS of Leicester and Norfolk. "THOMAS GODDARD" had lands at Middleton, in Norfolk in 1233. There were GODDARDS in Shropshire in the reigns of Edward II. and III. The arms of the Norfolk GODDARDS are not the same as those of Wiltshire. In the Visitation for Norfolk, 1433, ROBERT GODDARD appears among the gentry. He was interred at
