Edward Goddard and wife, formerly Mary Elizabeth or Elizabeth Pope marriage around 1788 thought to be at Clyffe Pypard, later moved to London

We would be grateful if you could check your indexes for the above. We have no reason to believe that family tradition is wrong in stating the above, the Goddards and the Popes did live nearby in Clyffe Pypard, but we cannot find any written records of the family.

The children were **George Edward** born 1790
Eliza born 1792
William Henry born 1795 in Wiltshire
Thomas born 1797
Charles Edwin born 1800
Emma Amy born 1803
Matilda Maria born 1808


Edward Goddard had three sisters. One married a **White** and another a **Batchelor**.

We have exhausted our records of Goddards and can only hope that a chance reference will lead us to the right place and records.

I enclose a cheque for £2. Please let me know if you require any more - up to a maximum of £5.

Dear Robin,

This is just a progress report on how we are getting on with the search for your origins. I am afraid that the news is that we have got **nowhere** yet!

We have searched through the parish records of Ogbourne St George, Ogbourne St Andrew and Mildenhall for a marriage of Edward Goddard and Mary Elizabeth Pope and found nothing.

We have had the Nimrod Index of the marriages of **all** of Wiltshire searched and the has disclosed nothing.

Similar results came from various other indexes ; The Various Index, the Goody and Baddy Index (at least they never went to gaol), and the Rover Index (people who moved into Wiltshire).

But there are so many alliances between the Goddards and the Popes in the Ogbournes that we see no reason to doubt that Edward and Mary Elizabeth did marry - but they seem to have escaped being recorded in writing or print! There is a will, dated 29Oct. 1795 and proved at Marlborough on 10 July 1797

William Goddard of Preshute, Wilts, yeoman. To granddaughter Patience Pope my leasehold tenement and garden adjoining that where I now live... To grand daughter Jane Pope leasehold tenement, garden etc now in my own occupation... To my kinsman John Goddard of Charnham Street [Hungerford], chaise driver, Joseph Goddard of Winterbourne, Isaac Goddard of Marlborough, Jenny Veats of Ogbourne, 5 guineas a piece; grand daughters Patience, Elizabeth, Mary and Ann Pope, 20 guineas each; grand daughter Jane Pope 10 guineas; grandson Aaron Pope 15 guineas; all of above legacies to be paid out of rents of my freehold and leasehold properties in the parish of Ogbourne St George. Give and bequeath unto friends William Coleman of Marlborough, gentleman, and Robert Pope of Clatford, parish of Preshute, yeoman, all my freehold lands in Ogbourne St George for 99 years, and all leasehold lands in the same place in trust, to pay Sarah, wife of John Batt Pope, £21 per annum, until their youngest child shall be 21, after that £10 per ann. for life; subject to this charge said freehold premises to grandsons Job and Moses Pope. Sarah wife of John Batt Pope, to live in house given to Jane Pope rent free for her life, but her husband not to reside there until youngest child be 21. Residue to Job and Moses Pope....

which shows the complex pattern of intermarrying even more clearly. We wonder what John Batt Pope had done to offend William Goddard. Had he mistreated his wife and children? But it is Isaac Goddard who appears on the list of prisoners in gaol. He was in Marlborough bridewell in 1775 and Marlborough town committee tried to move him out of the town, together with his wife Elizabeth and daughter Charlotte, in 1777 and 1779. As you will see, we can find the minutia of other Goddards lives, but not that of Edward - yet.

You expressed a wish to pay for any research done for you. I usually bear in mind that members have paid an annual donation and do not make a charge unless the cost of research goes above £5 or so (calculating that the cost of the Newsletter plus mailing is about 70p a time). So far I have paid out on your behalf £2.88 for the Nimrod Index search and £1.68 for the Goody and Baddy Index search. Research done by Brian and I is free. We usually combine the queries of several members, and some queries for the articles I write, and have a day at Wiltshire record office every few weeks and try to solve them all at the same time.

Has anyone ever suggested that Edward and Mary Elizabeth married in London? Was there any reason, which you know, for them having moved to London. Had they relatives who had already moved and made a success of commerce?

We shall keep on searching.
