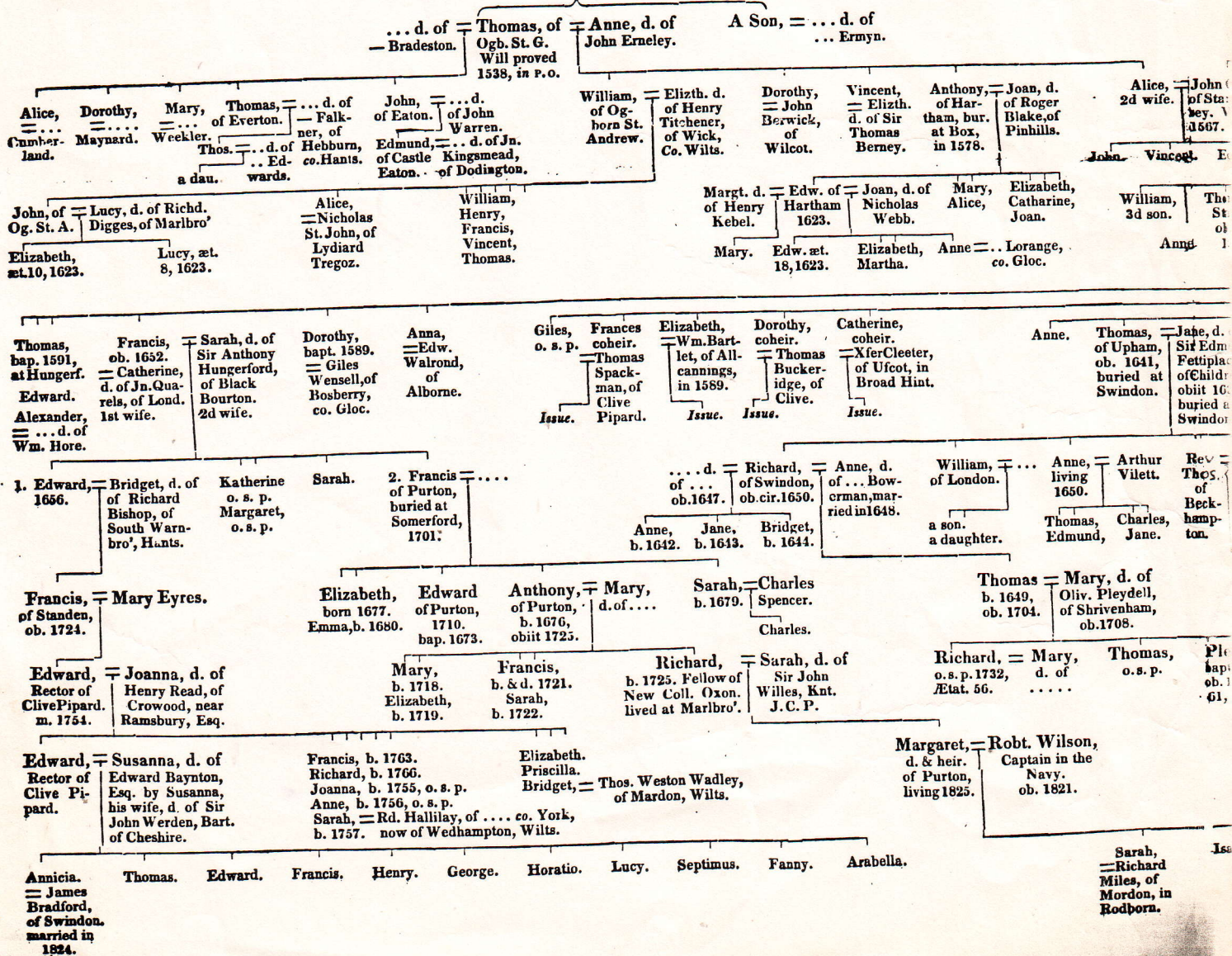


# PEDIGREE OF GODDARD OF SWINLON,

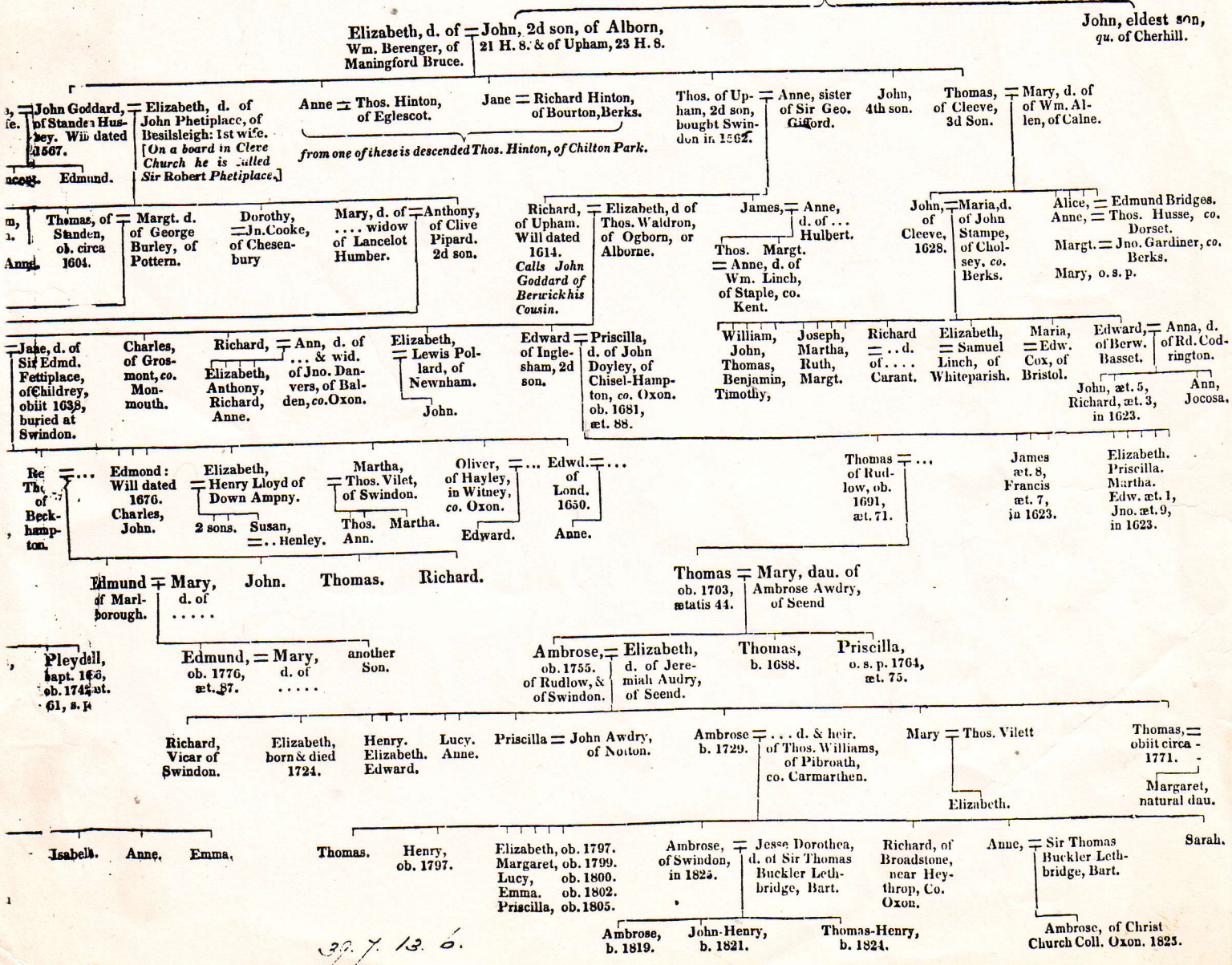

Dear Julie,

Naturally I've lost your last letter in the xmas chaos, but as snow cascades down outside, decided to send you my latest snippets.

After searching around the Wilts/Som border country for my Som. Goddards, & no success - then the Bournes of Bratton & some of their wills - so uninteresting & boring - then a little recce of Bath/Corsham Gibbons - & not a single mention of any Goddards, I then decided to go for all 'Edward Goddard' deed refs.

So came across the enclosed:

Deed 1064/5: Year 1542: Goddards of Clyffe Pypard:

This deed is in latin, so only quote from outside notes:

John Goddard of Standen Hussey has 4 sons: John the elder - Thomas the elder - Thomas, again - then John Junior - all alive now. 1542.

John the father is now making Clyffe Pypard parsonage over to his son John junior.

Year 1567:

Thomas Goddard of Upham, gent. is selling/making over ? to John Goddard of Standen Hussey, brother of Thomas, Clyffe Pypard parsonage.

Year 1586:

Thomas Goddard of Standen Hussey & his brother Anthony Goddard of Clyffe Pypard are sons of John Goddard, late of Standen, deceased & settling his will of 1567, who has left Clyffe Pypard parsonage to Anthony.

Then 'unknown til then that a hidden deed was found concerning Clyffe Pypard being leased to the Abbess Johane Temse of Lacock Abbey & William Lyggins ? gent in year 29 of Henry VIII (1537/8 ?)' with 33 years still to go.

This lease is now bought back by Thomas & is renewed to his brother Anthony on a new 99 year lease at £10 a year.

Witnesses: Richard Young - Thomas Haydock - Thomas J ?aggard

This deed was re-examined in 1608 for Lancelot Humber & by Thomas Bennett

Then year 1647: (this deed is the following on from deed 212b/1912 year 1644) Has approx 20 seals all along the edge, but Trowbridge has now decided not to photocopy any deed with any seals attached.

Mentions all the direct descendents of Anthony again, but with addresses.

So: John Smith is of Stanton (Bernard ?) with his wife Dorothy.

Giles Perkins is of Lydiard Tregoze with Katherine his wife.

Abraham Hale is of Devizes, cardmaker, with Dorothy his wife now deceased.

Richard Springbatt of All Cannings & Jane his wife.

William Church is of Smithfield, London, & Francis his wife.

Anthony Bartlett of South, All Cannings, gent. & His brother William Bartlett is of Clyffe Pypard.

Thomas Smith, is of ~~Shoe~~ Shoe Lane, London, tailor & Elizabeth his wife.

Christopher Cleeter of Uffcott & husband of Katherine his wife deceased.

His sons Anthony Cleeter is of Alresford, Southampton, gent. & has brothers Richard - Christopher - & John all of Uffcott.

Witnesses: Thomas Hussey - Charles Kemble - Thomas Keylwaie - John Mundy - Robert Strange - Jethro Tull - Thomas Gray.

Then year 1754: a note outside this deed says ' Francis Goddard was great grandfather of Edward Goddard, now living & owning Clyffe Pypard parsonage'

There is probably nothing new here for you but am sending it on anyway.

Then a few more ~~xxx~~ newspaper cuttings - never quite know who I am supposed to send them to ~~to~~ - or if your firm still wants them or not ?

After a 3 month wait, managed to get a copy of the Trowbridge Journal with your article in. You always manage to convey an immediate feeling & atmosphere of being there when it is all happening. And also great thankfulness at not having to live through those times & in such circumstances.

Considering that Michael Marshman is involved in this magazine, you would expect all library branches to be swamped with copies of the journal - I could not believe how long it took to borrow a copy. I also liked Helen Rogers rather racy article on church records. As I have no family connections ~~to~~ with Trowbridge & never actually visit the town itself, a lot of the articles did not have too great an appeal.

By the way, did I return your Donhead refs when I last wrote. I've forgotten.

## STANDEN HUSSEY

From the Victoria County History of Berkshire

1533 **Lord (Edmund) Bray** sold Standen to **William Dauntsey**

1548-9 Standen Farm described as the inheritance of **Jenkyn Goddard**

Later the manor seems to have passed to **John Goddard**, son of **John Goddard of Upham**, Wilts. who is described as of Standen Hussey.

1567 **John** (junior?) succeeded by son **Thomas Goddard**, who placed in settlement, perhaps on the occasion of his marriage with **Margaret**, daughter of **George Burley** of Potterne, Wilts.

1610 **Thomas Goddard** died, manor passed to son **Francis**

1652 **Francis** succeeded by son **Edward Goddard**

1684 **Edward Goddard** buried at Hungerford. Eldest son is **Francis**.

1707 **Francis Stonehouse** bought Hungerford Park.

1719 **Francis Goddard** sold Standen to **Francis Stonehouse**. A Mill is mentioned.

From Magna Britannica (?)

About 1500 Standen bequeathed by **Sir Reginald Bray** to **William, Lord Sandys** who married the only child of his (?) brother **John**

1583 Standen purchased from (another?) **William, Lord Sandys** by **John Goddard**.
