We therefore do hereby give and grant unto you full power and authority during our pleasure to collect, gather, levy and receive the same and the same collected gathered and levied and received to preserve and keep to and for the use of him who shall have right and lawful title to the same. And also to take care and provide that during this our sequestration the parish church of Cliffe Pipard aforesaid and cure of souls within the said parish be well duly and canonically supplied by some able minister to be approved of or if we see fit to be named by us at a certain rates of payment by the week if occasion that shall be to be fixed and assigned by us. And that all tenths, subsidies, rates, taxes and impositions incumbent on and payable out of the said Vicarage be well and duly satisfied and answered. And to publish this our Sequestration or cause it to be published in the parish church aforesaid as such times as to you shall seem most proper for publishing the same. And thereby intimate by our authority that no one presume to obstruct the same under pain of the law and contempt. Commanding you that you make and render a just and faithful account of and upon your receipt and disbursements in your Office of Sequestrators by virtue hereof when there to formally required.
