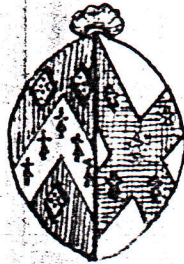

Inscription & arms engraved on a piece of family plate which has descended to its present possessor Robert S. Stone, the senior representative of the Stones of Wiltshire, from his father Robert N. Stone, who received it on the death of the last male of the elder branch, John Stone of Badbury Manor, Lower Upton & Bay House Farms, Wilts, and Sydney House Bath.

N.B. The above is a widows shield, with the Stone arms on the dexter (or husband's) side & Jane's father's arms on the sinister (or wife's) side.

The hall mark on the silver dish bears the same date as the inscription.

It will be observed that the lozenges are as yet unchanged with the ermine spot conferred on James, 3<sup>d</sup> son of John of New Town, after the purchase of the Badbury estates.

It is here presumed that the above arms are those of the receiver of the present.
